## Jim Frazee tops the championship flight

One stroke separated the top-three senior golfers Thursday at the Falls Country Club when Jim Frazee of Cook won the championship flight of the 42nd Pete Peterson Senior Tournament with an 18-hole score of 73.

Frazee, who placed fourth in last year's championship flight and won the tournament for the first time this year, edged out runner-up Larry Beck at 74 and Bob Mason in third with a 75.

The championship flight's top three received gift certificates from the Falls Country Club worth \$70, \$35 and \$25, respectively.

This year's Peter Peterson Senior Tournament had 103 golfers age 50 and older participate. Players were placed in flights based on handicap and age with the top gross score in each flight winning. Ties were broken with the older player winning the tiebreaker.

The Broncos' volleyball team will be starting its season first with a road match Aug. 21 at Mountain Iron-Buhl. The Falls' first home match is Aug. 25 against Two Harbors.

Bronco girls swimming and diving head coach Jill Herzig said this year's team has around 30 girls practicing in preparation for the season opener Aug. 28 at Hibbing. The Falls' first home meet is set for Sept. 4 against Eveleth-Gilbert.

Practices for the Bronco boys and girls cross country teams are off and running with their first meet set for Aug. 28 at Virginia. Their only home meet will be the Hial Pike Invitational on Oct. 9.
