Vikings trail twice, then cut down North Woods

Broncos split with Hawks

After being down by three runs in the early innings Wednesday afternoon, the Littlefork-Big Falls baseball team picked up its third victory of the season by rallying for four runs in the bottom of the sixth to win at home over North Woods, 8-5.

"It was a good win for us," said L-BF head coach Dan Beste. "I told the guys before it was a big Section game and we needed it."

"We started out slow, kind of like we did (Tuesday), kicked the ball around a little bit, but I was happy that we came back and were able to put up runs when we needed to."

After the Vikings gave up three runs in the top of the first and then picked up a run in the bottom of the in-

ning, the Grizzlies went back in front by three in the top of the second.

L-BF pitcher Taylor DeLack was on the verge of getting out of the second inning when he threw the third strike to Cole Martin, who was able to reach first base with the baseball getting past Vikings catcher Tommy Manninen.

North Woods then picked up singles from Steven Stone and Darnell Goggleye along with a run when Martin scored. Goggleye stole second base before the Grizzlies stranded runners at second and third when DeLack got George Bibeau to strike out to retire the side.

L-BF tied the game with three runs on four hits in the bottom of the third when Rylan Henrickson, DeLack, Darian Erickson and Eric Thydean each singled.

North Woods regained the lead at 5-4 in the top of the fifth after Bibeau singled and then Tate Olson singled to drive in a run.

The Vikings sent all nine batters to the plate when they scored four runs in the bottom of the sixth. After a double by DeLack drove in a run, the Grizzlies took Olson off the mound and replaced him with Goggleye, who then gave up a single to Erickson, who drove in two more runs.

DeLack faced only three North Woods batters in the top of the seventh when L-BF retired the side to seal the victory.

"(DeLack is) the normal shortstop, and when he pitches, all of those guys in the infield have really got to step up their game one extra notch," Beste said. "Early, we made mistakes (on defense), but when we needed to, we got the outs."

The win snapped a two-game losing streak that in-
