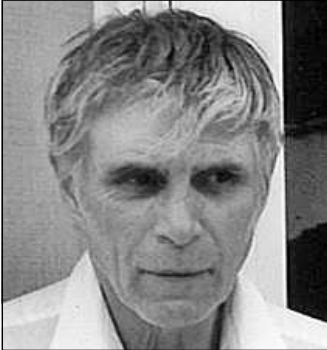
Katherine Marie Perala, 79
