Looking for a new challenge (if dealing with the weather isn't enough), then borrow *The World's Toughest Endurance Challenges* by Richard Hoad and Paul Moore. Fifty long distance challenges are presented with key facts and highlights about their difficulties. The Arrowhead 135 is included.

But of course she is also an undercover operative trying to get the information to put said employer away. Enjoy the Greek isles and lots of art.

Luanne Rice has a new book entitled *The Lemon Orchard*. Warmth, sunshine, days filled with beautiful yellow, but all is not perfect in Julia's world as she housesits for her aunt and uncle in Malibu.

*Wise Men* by Stuart Nadler starts in the summer of 1952 on the far edge of Cape Cod. This is a multigenerational story about love and regret and trying to overcome
