POLICE REPORT

Ontario Provincial Police

Arrest: Jeromy D. Wensley, 35, Fort Frances, was charged last week in connection with the attempted break-ins of several businesses in Fort Frances. On Thursday, officers of the Rainy River District Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police were notified by three different business owners that someone had attempted to break into their establish-

ments by kicking in the rear doorways. In two of the instances, no entry was gained but the doors were damaged. On the third instance, entry was gained, damage to the door was incurred but no items were reported missing from the business. At about 2:22 a.m. Friday, officers were dispatched to a break and enter in progress at a convenience store on the 700 block of Second Street East. Police learned that a male

suspect had been observed exiting the store through a broken window, fleeing southbound into a nearby alleyway. The suspect had used tools to cut locks off from a door and window and smashed the front window. The items stolen included several lottery tickets. A warrant was executed at a Mosher Avenue residence later that day when police successfully recovered property stolen in the break and enter.
