felt good.”

Hertz, who noted he is involved in ultramarathon running, finished 10 seconds ahead of the top female, Amy Auran, 18, a 2014 Falls High School graduate who ran cross country and track and in high school.

“This was just speed work for me,” Hertz said.

The 5-kilometer race began next to Smokey Bear Park and proceeded west before looping back to the park and finishing in the main tent. Hertz said he was competing with Auran for the top spot in the first mile, before she pulled in front after the mile mark and then

he regained the lead around the two-mile mark.

Auran, who noted she just wrapped up ROTC basic training this summer prior to enrolling this fall at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, where she will be playing hockey, said she ran strong for the first mile and a half before getting tired.

"I was even with (Hertz) for the first mile, and then the second mile I was in front of him, and after the two-mile (mark) he passed me up," she said.

Auran finished six seconds ahead of her track coach in high school, Jen Erickson, 41, who placed third overall in 21:37. Another Falls female in her 40s, Linda Belanger, finished fourth

in 21:38. Abigail Fouts, 19, of Eagan, rounded out the overall top five by finishing in 21:41.

Bass Dash 5K organizer Betsy Brokaw, who was in charge of the run/walk for the second year in a row, said 110 entered this year's race, in which medals were presented to the top-three males and females in seven age categories.

The entrants ranged in age from 5-76 with Carson Crandall of the Falls and Lexy Winge of Solway being the youngest and Leonard Olson of the Falls being the oldest. This year's runners and walkers also included IFBC board president Gary Potter, who ended up placing third in the 40-49 age group in 29:18.

tion selection; senior offensive and defensive lineman Jack Bartkowski; and senior end Riley Rasmussen.

The strengths of this year's team, Anderson said, include the offensive and defensive line as well as team leadership.

He noted the team goals this year include winning the Section 7AAA championship.

Anderson said he is the most concerned this season about "an early snowfall" and is looking forward to "every facet of what makes a football team and its season."
