Woman charged in stabbing posts bail

A 48-year-old rural Borderland woman accused of stabbing her husband early Monday morning was released later that day after posting bail.

Tracy Nuthak was charged in Koochiching County District Court with second-degree assault with a weapon.

Staff at the Koochiching County Attorney's Office said bail was set at \$10,000 with several conditions, including that she have no contact with the victim and surrender all weapons.

She is scheduled to ap-

pear in court on the charges at noon Friday.

A statement issued Monday by Koochiching County Sheriff Brian Jespersen said Nuthak was arrested after deputies were called to a residence on County Road 99, south of Ray, where her husband, Scott Nuthak, 53, was found stabbed several times with a knife. Tracy Nuthak was arrested at another location near the residence.

Scott Nuthak was transported to the Rainy Lake Medical Center hospital campus, where he was being treated for injuries, reported Jespersen.
