Be a 'ready traveler'

CBP STAFF REPORT

U.S. Customs and Border Protection Office of Field Operations reminds travelers planning trips across the border into Minnesota or North Dakota to anticipate heavy traffic during the observance of Remembrance Day in Canada and Veterans Day in the United States.

Originally dedicated as Armistice Day to commemorate the ending of the First World War, it is now observed in honor of the sacrifices of all members of the armed forces in times of war.

Border traffic volumes are expected to significantly increase during the weekend of Nov. 7-11. All travelers are reminded of a few simple steps they can

employ to cross the border more efficiently.

1. Check out the new CBP informational website
2. Beat the border rush
3. Keep travel documents handy
4. Know the contents of your vehicles and be prepared to declare all items
5. Know what food products can be imported
6. Declare all firearms

Travelers are reminded that specific requirements must be met to import or export firearms and ammunition to/from the United States. For more information on the importation or exportation of firearms and ammunition visit ATF, State Dept., and Commerce Dept. websites or contact CBP at 701-825-5800.
