Museum passes are back. We have lots of passes available for admission to 13 different museums and sites throughout the Northland, including the Duluth Children's Museum, Duluth Depot, Forest History Center, Glensheen, the Judy Garland and Children's Museum and the Minnesota Discovery Center.

Stop by the library and see what is available and plan your next regional get-away with several long weekends coming. The current tickets are only good until the end of the year, so don't wait.

Two books that would make great read alouds at night in the shack include *How I Got This Way* by Patrick McManus and *Tales from Jackpine Bob* by Bob Cary. Both of these are non-fiction collections of stories and tales about being in the woods and outdoors. Bob Cary was a northern Minnesota writer out of Ely with great stories of the North Woods. Both books have lots of humor and are sure to get you all laughing and telling your own tales of hunting, fishing and being in the great outdoors.

The library also has a number of books on hunting for kids that might appeal to them as they seek to get their first deer or improve their chances.

Basics are covered in *Deer Hunting* by Sloan MacRae. An overview of

hunting including history and equipment and a focus on safety is found in *Hunting: Have fun, Be smart* by Jack Weaver.

If you prefer to hunt with bows and arrows then be sure and share with your children *Bow, Does and Bucks: a introduction to archery deer hunting* by Michael A. Dilozenzo.

Everyone might find something of interest in either *Strategic Whitetail Hunting* by Tim Hooey or *Deer and Deer Hunting* by Al Hofacker, both of which focus on finding the deer and learning their behavior and habitats.

We also have a number of movies relating to hunting including "A Grandpa's Story," "Bad to the Bone Bucks," and "The Legacy of a whitetail Deer Hunter."

The library will be closed on Monday, Nov. 11, in observance of Veterans' Day.

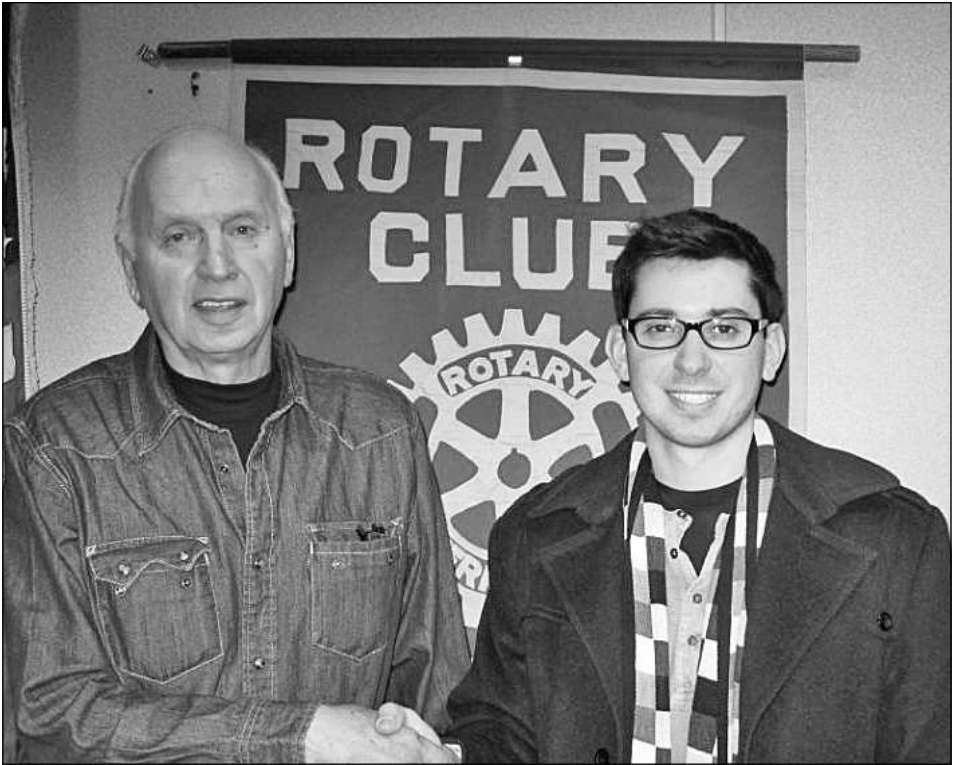
