and involving the discovery of gold will speak and have copies of her book available for sale and signing. Come celebrate a local author.

Storytime is set to begin on Thursday, Sept. 12, at 10:30 a.m., with the traditional start to the storytime year with stories about families. Any and all children are welcome to join us for 20 to 30 minutes of stories, rhymes and songs. Come to storytime and stay to play.

"This year we are adding a play time of 30 to 45 minutes following storytime. We have

purchased a variety of toys that introduce early STEAM (Science, technology, art and mathematics) concepts to preschool children. These toys will only be available following storytime for families attending storytime. Storytime and play time will continue each Thursday morning at 10:30 with stories about friends and then fall.

Monday, Sept. 16, at 7 p.m., join us for a presentation by Mary Shideler, better known as *The Kayak Lady*. She authored the book after kayaking more than 1,000 lakes in Itasca County over 15 years.

Documentary movie night will continue this fall on the last Monday of the month. Monday, Sept. 30, we will work with the Falls Hunger Coalition and show the movie "A Place at the Table" beginning at 6:30 p.m. in Backus Auditorium.

About 50 million Americans were food

insecure in 2012. This was approximately 1 in 6 of the overall population, with the proportion of children facing food insecurity even higher at about 1 in 4. One in every two children receive federal food assistance.

The film sees directors Kristi Jacobson and Lori Silverbush examine the issue of hunger in America, largely through the stories of three people suffering from food insecurity with a conclusion that the problem of hunger in America could be solved once and for all, if the American public decides – as it has in the past – that making healthy food available and affordable is in everyone's best interest. A discussion with refreshments will follow the showing of the movie.

The library will be closed on Monday, Sept. 2, in observance of Labor Day. Regular winter hours will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 3.
