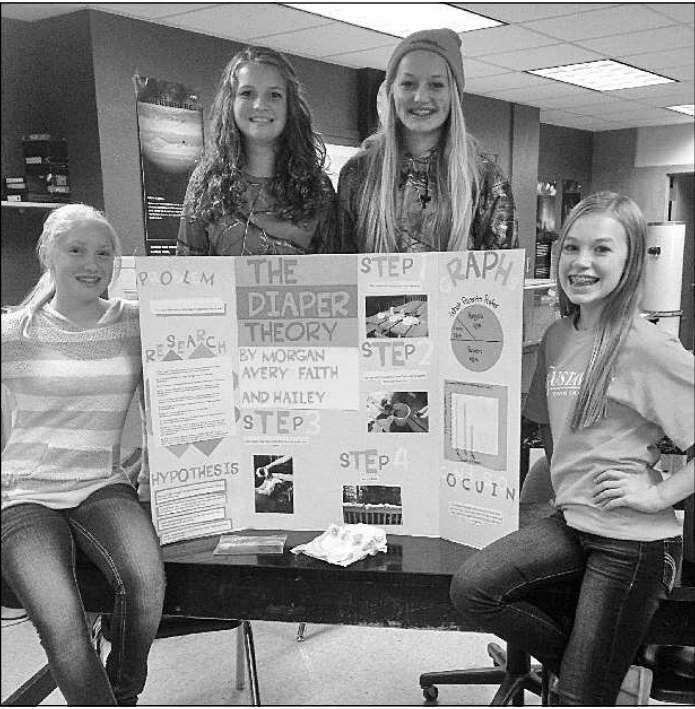

FHS eighth grade Consumer Science Fair

FHS STAFF REPORT

A weekly snap shot of exciting and challenging events, at Falls High School.

The eighth grade science classes of Tony Casareto practiced the use of scientific problem solving. The goal of the Science Fair was to test everyday items using specific steps to collect and analyze data. Hair

dyes, diapers, chewing gum, and duct tape were a few of the projects students tested.

Students developed display boards with their findings and presented information to fellow students. Charts, graphs, pictorials, and critical writing skills were developed and placed into some very attractive backgrounds.

THE INDUS GARDENS FLOURISH

INDUS SCHOOL REPORT

“Look what we’re growing!” proclaims a sign on a display board at the entrance to Indus School. Displayed in front of the board are the signs of the season — pumpkins, squash, and other garden produce which The Indus Gardens have produced this fall for use in the school lunch program and in Family and Consumer Sciences classes.

In a collaborative effort to provide a hands-on curriculum, high school teachers Lois Lewis and Tom Van Damme used School Health Initiative Program funds to create a gardening area outside the school where produce has been grown from spring through fall. This fall, Van Damme is experimenting with a “hoop garden” to attempt to grow vegetables past the normal growing season. Last spring, students planted four apple trees, as well.

The school lunch program has benefited from homegrown greens, tomatoes, and cucumbers, and now pumpkins and squash are available. Students have helped to plant,

transplant and harvest produce. In the Family and Consumer Sciences classes, they have learned about making pumpkin stew and pureed squash to add to baked goods to make them healthier.

Students are also preparing a campaign to use with elementary students to promote the eating of fruits and vegetables, entitled “A Most Nutritious Election.” Students will attempt to promote their favorite fruits and vegetables to become the “Fruit or Vegetable of the Year.”
