The family of Jack Patrick Dickson is sad to announce his passing Monday, March 24, 2014, after a courageous battle with cancer.

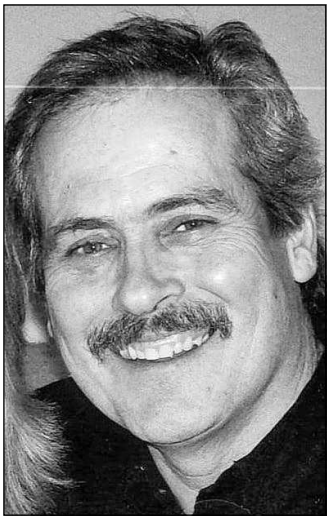
Jack was born June 21, 1955, to Marjorie and John Dickson in Thunder Bay, Ontario.

Overwhelmed with paperwork

KOOCHICHING AGING OPTIONS

A question and answer column for family caregivers

Q. My parents have bills and different paperwork piled up on their kitchen table. When I check in with them, almost daily, they continue to ask for my help to figure out what all these bills are for and if they should be responding to all the other letters they are getting from insurance companies and other organizations. I am at my "wits end" as to how I can help them. They are both in their 80s and they

should not have to be worrying about all of this. I am not certain how to deal with all the paperwork either. Are there resources that can help them out? They are very proud people, have never asked for help before. Now they are willing to get some help if there is any.

A. You and your parents are not alone. With so much information and continual changes occurring in health care, it is no wonder that older people and family caregivers are at their "wits end."

There are some resources that may be helpful. I would

encourage you or your parents to call the Senior Link-Age Line at 1-800-333-2433. This is a statewide service provided by the Minnesota Board on Aging and Area Agencies on Aging. They maintain lists of local resources that may be of help. There are 800 numbers on your parents' medical and insurance cards that can be called to get questions or concerns answered.

You are wise not to ignore your parents' request. The bills and important paperwork do need to be attended to. Do not wait too long. Just as the bills pile

up, so can the stress. Keep in mind, asking for help is a strength. Be proud of your parents and of yourself. Hopefully the kitchen table will soon be back to what it is intended for.
