BOYS BASEBALL

Broncos split twin bill with Golden Bears

The International Falls baseball team won a game and lost another Tuesday when the Broncos hosted Eveleth-Gilbert in a double-header at Scheela Field.

In game one, the Falls scored six runs in the fourth inning and ended up defeating the Golden Bears, 11-2.

“We hit the ball very well and we got out to a pretty good lead in that first game,” said Broncos head coach Eric Walls. “It was sure nice to get some of those younger players into that game and see how they responded to some varsity action. (Trimble) Butler and Nathan McRoberts did a nice job pitching (Tuesday) as their first time out.”

The Broncos’ Cole Miggins pitched the first four innings and picked up the victory, allowing an unearned run on six hits with a walk while striking out six.

Butler came in pitch the fifth inning when he didn’t allow a run or a hit and struck out a batter, while McRoberts closed out the

final two innings for the Falls, giving up an earned run on two hits and a walk while striking out four.

Of the Broncos’ eight hits, Jack Bartkowski had two of them with a pair of singles and drove in three runs. Ben Humbert added a triple with 3 RBI.

In the second game, the Broncos could only muster three hits when they lost to Eveleth-Gilbert, 5-1.

“I guess it all starts with Humbert. He didn’t have a very strong (pitching) outing,” Walls said. “When he’s throwing 70-80 pitches in four innings, it’s a little too many, and he wasn’t close enough (to the strike zone). His misses have to be close enough to try and make them swing.”

Humbert pitched the first 4 2/3 innings and recorded the loss, giving up three unearned runs on four hits with four walks while striking out 11.

Butler pitched the final 2 1/3 innings, allowing two earned runs on five hits with a strikeout.

The Golden Bears’ Max Roberts pitched all seven innings to pick up the victory, allowing an unearned run on three hits with two walks while striking out four.

“Max Roberts pitched a nice game for Eveleth. We only got three hits off of him,” Walls said. “I’ve told the team this whole time that we simply have to do a better job of catching the baseball. We’re having at

least three errors a game. When we get to start the playoff season and start playing some real quality teams, that’s not going to bode very well for us.”

The Broncos committed three errors in the second game, compared to two for the Golden Bears.

Falls’ season record now stands at 10-3 going into Monday’s home game against Deer River.
