Spill reported in Fort Frances

JOURNAL STAFF REPORT

A single Minnesota Dakota and Western Railway rail car containing hydrogen peroxide tipped over Friday causing the chemical to leak in Fort Frances.

The Rainy River District Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police reports that at 1:13 p.m., officers responded to the report of a train derailment at the Resolute Forest Product mill property. No injuries

were reported.

Officers confirmed that Fort Frances Fire and Rescue Service responded and attempted to suppress any vapors and monitor the spill area.

OPP set up a perimeter

around the affected area of Central Avenue between Scott Street and Second Street in Fort Frances.

The OPP worked with emergency responders and the town of Fort Frances to monitor and assess the

situation. The Ministry of the Environment was notified. MDW serves the paper mills in International Falls and Fort Frances, ON.
