Budget OK; schedule shift

Greenwood County considers 4-day work week for some staff

Greenwood County is exploring a four-day work week for employees who work typical office hours.

Officials announced they were looking into this work schedule change at Tuesday's County Council meeting.

Treasurer Steffanie Dorn and Human Resources Director Rhonda McAllister told council they were looking into a modified work schedule for some employees as a possible retention

County council passes salary adjustments

Greenwood County's final 2025 budget Staying home comes in at \$58.5 million, and contains more than \$950,000 in salary increases without a millage increase.

Self adds helicopter transport service

For Self Regional Medical Center, the sky is the limit. Literally.

Self Regional on Thursday unveiled its new helipad and medical transport helicopter service, something CEO Dr. Matt Logan called a significant milestone in the hospital's his-

"Today, we're not just opening a new helipad and launching a new helicopter service that will care for Greenwood and the surrounding counties, but we're also significantly enhancing our ability to provide rapid critical care to patients in need," Logan said. "Self Regional Healthcare Advanced Air Transport will enable us to more swiftly and efficiently care for medical emergencies, ensuring that our community receives the best possible care when it matters most."

The hospital partnered with Med-Trans Corp. on the air ambulance, a medically configured Bell 407 helicopter that will be stationed on a helipad near the rear of the patient tower and adjacent to the emergency care center.

Self Regional will have a full helicopter transport team available 24/7, with team members
