



STATEMENT REGARDING PRIVATE PROPERTY MATTER

Greenwood Development and its affiliated companies respect the right of every citizen to participate fully in the political process. We also have a responsibility to protect the private property entrusted to our care and to respect the property rights of our shareholders.

The circumstances surrounding the campaign signs at the corner of Mathis Road and Lowell Avenue are straightforward. Permission was granted for one candidate's sign to be placed on the property. Permission was not granted for Mr. Long's signs. When those signs were removed, they were preserved, and Mr. Long was notified where they could be retrieved.

The matter became more serious when a camera was discovered on private property and images obtained from that camera were subsequently published online. After additional cameras were publicly referenced, we took appropriate measures to protect both company-owned and privately owned property, including notifying Mr. Long that he is not permitted on company property.

We have not pursued the camera issue further with law enforcement, and we moved the authorized campaign sign farther onto the property to eliminate any question concerning the public right-of-way.

The right to political expression does not override the rights of a private property owner. Supporting a candidate does not confer a right to use someone else's property without permission, nor should political activity come at the expense of an individual's privacy on their own property. Protecting those rights should never be characterized as an attempt to interfere with the democratic process.

How we treat our neighbors matters, particularly in a community we all care deeply about. Respect for one another, for private property and for personal privacy are fundamental to maintaining the trust and civility that a strong community requires.

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
