ORDER SETTING BOND

Addy, J.

THIS MATTER CAME BEFORE THE COURT on May 28, 2024 on the Defendant's motion to set bond. Mr. Getchius was represented by Mark Moyer, Esq. The State was represented by Deputy Solicitor Micah Black. The Court finds as follows.

The Court was given a general overview of the allegations. Mr. Getchius is charged in the above warrants with Trafficking in Fentanyl, PWID Fentanyl, adj PWID Cocaine from a traffic stop in Greenwood. Although he does have out of state ties, his mother now resides in Greenwood, and he has no criminal record.

At this stage of the proceedings, the Court may consider only two factors, risk of flight and danger to the community. Mr. Getchius has family in the area, and he has no criminal history. However, the amount of the drugs seized in this case is rather substantial.

Taking all the factors into consideration, the Court orders as follows:


1. Bond is set in the sum of \$25,000 surety or property;
2. House arrest at the residence of his mother at 112 Shamrock Drive, Greenwood is ordered and shall be verified by electronic monitoring. Exceptions to house arrest shall be gainful employment, the hours of which must be verified by the monitoring company, legal and



medical appointments, and religious services customary to Mr. Getchius' faith. Monitoring is to be supervised by Eagle Eye or Palmetto Surety;

3. Should house arrest be violated, the State may immediately seek a bench warrant for Mr. Getchius pending a bond violation hearing;

The magistrate may complete the necessary paperwork to effect this order.
