H.E. Martz said, "He who builds a better mousetrap these days runs into material shortages, patent-infringement suits, work stoppages, collusive bidding, discount discrimination and taxes."

At the bridge table, when your contract appears hopeless, be a man, not a mouse, and see if you can trap an opponent into helping you. South blazes into six

hearts despite West's one-spade overcall. West leads the spade king. After winning with his ace, how should declarer continue? After North made a limit raise, South bid what he hoped he could make. (Yes, a tournament player would have treated North's three hearts as pre-emp-

tive; he would have cue-bid two

spades to show heart support

and at least game-invitational

values.)

At first glance, South has two unavoidable spade losers. He also has only 11 top tricks: one spade, six hearts, one diamond and three clubs. Yes, the bidding tells declarer that East started with a singleton spade, but how

does that help? Declarer cashes his diamond ace and heart queen. When the trumps are 2-1, South plays a trump to the dummy, ruffs the last diamond, unblocks his two club honors, returns to dummy with a trump, and discards a spade on the club queen. Then comes the taxing play: Declarer leads dummy's last club, and when East follows suit, South does not ruff; instead, he discards another spade.

East is trapped. He has only diamonds left, and on this trick, declarer sluffs his last spade and ruffs on the board.

NOTICE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE

Title V Operating Permit Significant Modification

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.521 and 127.541, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) intends to issue a Significant Modification to the Title V Operating Permit for Homer City Generation L.P. Generating Station (Homer City Generation) located in Center Township, Indiana County. Homer City Generation's representative to contact concerning this application is Mr. Gary Cline, Environmental Manager, 1750 Power Plant Road, Homer City, PA 15748-9558. His phone number is (724) 479-6255.

The Title V Permit was originally issued in 2004. The permit was amended, modified, and renewed several times since the original Title V issuance. The current Significant Modification is required to memorialize the facility's decision to cease electrical generation with the coal fired boilers as of June 30, 2023, remove the sources no longer in operation, and include the Emission Reduction Credits (ERCs) authorized by the Department. The shutdown of boilers 1, 2, and 3 generated the following ERCs: VOC 11.3 tpy; NOx 2,436.3 tpy; PM2.5 220.1 tpy. The ERCs may be used, traded, or sold after the approved entry of the ERCs by the Department into the Pennsylvania ERC Registry System. If the company wishes to restart any of the sources, a plan approval application shall be submitted. The facility and any subsequent user of these credits shall comply with the requirements of 25 PA Code 127.206, 127.207, and 127.208, regarding ERC use and transfer requirements.

Copies of the application, the Department's analysis and other documents used in the evaluation of the application are available for public inspection during normal business hours at the Department of Environmental Protection, 230 Chestnut Street, Meadville,

Any person wishing to provide the Department of Environmental Protection with additional information that they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of this permit may submit the information to the Department at the address shown above. A 30-day comment period, from the date of this publication, will exist for the submission of comments. Each written comment must contain the following information: Name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments; Identification of the proposed permit (specify Permit # TV 32-00055); and Concise statements regarding the relevancy of the information in the proposed permit or objections to issuance of the permit.

A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that such a hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in the newspaper or by the Pennsylvania Bulletin, or by telephone, where the Department determines such notification by telephone is sufficient. Written comments or requests for a public hearing should be directed to Lori McNabb, Regional Air Quality Program Manager, Department of Environmental Protection, Northwest Region, 230 Chestnut Street, Meadville, PA 16335.
