District, at a meeting held on October 13, 2025, adopted a Resolution titled and sum-
marized as follows:
AUTHORIZING THE INCURRING OF NONELECTORAL DEBT BY THE ISSUANCE
OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT
TO EXCEED FIVE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,700,000);
COVENANTING TO PAY, AND PLEDGING ALL AVAILABLE TAXING POWER FOR
THE PAYMENT OF, THE BONDS; FIXING THE FORM, MAXIMUM INTEREST
RATES, MATURITY, REDEMPTION AND OTHER PROVISIONS FOR THE PAYMENT
THEREOF; AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF ONE OR MORE PROPOSALS
FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING A FILING OF REQUIRED
DOCUMENTS WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DE-
VELOPMENT; RATIFYING AND DIRECTING CERTAIN ACTIONS OF OFFICERS;
AND MAKING CERTAIN OTHER COVENANTS AND PROVISIONS IN RESPECT OF
THE BONDS.
The Resolution was amended from its proposed form upon final passage to adjust the
maximum principal amount, to correct Sinking Fund Deposit Dates, to identify condi-
tions for the final award of the bonds and to attach debt service schedules. The interest
rates (yields) on the Bonds range from not to exceed 6.00% in 2026 to not to exceed
6.00% in 2039.
The Bonds were awarded at a price of not less than 97.00% of the par amount of the
Bonds (the discount from par being inclusive of any underwriter's discount and/or net

Title V Operating Permit Significant Modification**
In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.521 and 127.541, the Department of Envi-
ronmental Protection (Department) intends to issue a Significant Modification to the
Title V Operating Permit for Homer City Generation L.P. Generating Station (Homer
City Generation) located in Center Township, Indiana County. Homer City Generation's
representative to contact concerning this application is Mr. Gary Cline, Environmental
Manager, 1750 Power Plant Road, Homer City, PA 15748-9558. His phone number is
(724) 479-6255.
The Title V Permit was originally issued in 2004. The permit was amended, modified,
and renewed several times since the original Title V issuance. The current Significant
Modification is required to memorialize the facility's decision to cease electrical gen-
eration with the coal fired boilers as of June 30, 2023, remove the sources no longer in
operation, and include the Emission Reduction Credits (ERCs) authorized by the De-
partment. The shutdown of boilers 1, 2, and 3 generated the following ERCs: VOC 11.3
tpy; NOx 2,436.3 tpy; PM2.5 220.1 tpy. The ERCs may be used, traded, or sold after
the approved entry of the ERCs by the Department into the Pennsylvania ERC Registry
System. If the company wishes to restart any of the sources, a plan approval application
shall be submitted. The facility and any subsequent user of these credits shall comply
with the requirements of 25 PA Code 127.206, 127.207, and 127.208, regarding ERC
use and transfer requirements.
Copies of the application, the Department's analysis and other documents used in the
evaluation of the application are available for public inspection during normal business
hours at the Department of Environmental Protection, 230 Chestnut Street, Meadville,
PA 16335.
Any person wishing to provide the Department of Environmental Protection with ad-
ditional information that they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of this
permit may submit the information to the Department at the address shown above. A
30-day comment period, from the date of this publication, will exist for the submission
of comments. Each written comment must contain the following information: Name, ad-
dress and telephone number of the person submitting the comments; Identification of
the proposed permit (specify Permit # TV 32-00055); and Concise statements regard-
ing the relevancy of the information in the proposed permit or objections to issuance of
the permit.
A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that such a
hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting com-
ments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by pub-
lication in the newspaper or by the Pennsylvania Bulletin, or by telephone, where the
Department determines such notification by telephone is sufficient. Written comments

TO RASH ASSUMPTIONS

At the bridge table, never base your plays on unrealistic as- sumptions, as this could lead to a decrease in your trick total.
In today's deal, it is not so much a case of an unrealistic as- sumption as being careful not to jump to a conclusion that could be inaccurate. South is in four spades. West leads the heart nine. How should East plan the defense?
The auction was straightfor- ward. South smelled a game, so bid that game.
The defense looks so easy. East wins with the heart ace (the un- necessarily high card beginning a suit-preference signal for di- amonds), cashes the heart king, and continues with the heart 10

(a second suit-preference sig- nal). West ruffs higher than the dummy and shifts to a diamond. East wins with his ace and leads another heart, perhaps promot- ing a second trump trick for West.
Well, that is the plan, but West cannot ruff higher than the dummy. South wins the third trick, draws trumps, and runs the clubs for an overtrick.
East should take a safety-play. At trick three, he should cash the diamond ace. Here, West encourages with his 10, and East leads a second diamond to de- feat the contract. But if West has a spade higher than dummy's seven, he would discourage, and East would go back to hearts.
Try to maximize your chances of success.
