THE COMBINATIONS COME THICK AND FAST

Peter De Vries, a novelist and an editor who died in 1993, said, "The universe is like a safe to which there is a combination. But the combination is locked up in the safe."

I wonder if we will ever find that safe combination? This week, we have been looking at various suit combinations. Here is another deceptive one. How should South play in six spades after West leads the diamond queen?

North's initial two-no-trump response was the Jacoby Forcing Raise. South's jump to game showed a minimum opening with no singleton or void. North then launched Roman Key Card Blackwood, which was good for this deal. After South bid five diamonds, indicating zero or three key cards (the four aces and the trump king count as key cards),

North relayed with five hearts to ask about the spade queen. When South denied holding that card, North knew not to bid a grand slam. (And, yes, North might have signed off in six no-trump.)

Since the side suits are solid, declarer's only problem is to avoid two trump losers. South should start with a low trump from the board (not the ace), planning to rise with his king or to finesse his jack. When East shows out, declarer can still do either. If he wins with his king, he then leads low toward the board, covering West's card as cheaply as possible. If South plays his jack, West wins with his queen and probably leads another diamond. But declarer wins on the board, plays a spade to his king, returns a spade to dummy's nine, cashes the ace, and claims.

These transfers do not contain any revisions.

The operation is located in Armstrong Township, Indiana County and is known as the Uring Nos. 1, 2, & 3 Mines. The 16,804 acres of Underground Permit Area are located as follows: bounded on the south by the village of West Lebanon and Old Route 56 Highway; the west by the Indiana/Armstrong County Line and a westerly offset of Five Points Road; the north by the village of Willet and Dark Hollow Road; and the east by Creekside Road, Cheese Run Road, Trim Tree Road and an easterly offset of Anthony Run Road. There are two Surface Activity Site Areas for this operation totaling 29.6 acres. The first 21.0 acres of Surface Activity Site Area and NPDES outfall are located at 525 Anthony Run Road, Indiana, PA 15701. Outfall 001 (40° 39' 06", 79° 16' 59") discharges treated mine drainage to Anthony Run. The second 8.6 acres of Surface Activity Site Area and NPDES outfall are located at 2012 Sportsman Club Road, Shelocta, PA 15774. Outfall 002 (40° 37' 36", 79° 18' 28") discharges treated mine drainage to Walker Run. All of the described areas can be found on the Elderton, Ernest and McIntyre USGS, 7.5 minute series topographic maps.
