FROM A WEAK MAJOR
TO A WEAK MINOR

Ernie Harwell, who called the play-by-play for the Detroit Tigers for 42 years, said, "Everybody in the minor leagues — if you're a player, an announcer, whatever — wants to be in the big leagues."

At the bridge table, when we see a long minor suit, we probably wish it were a major suit. The game revolves around majors and no-trump, not minors. However, when we have a long minor, we must make the best pitch we can.

In yesterday's deal, opener started with one no-trump and responder had a weak hand with a long major. He bailed out of no-trump into his long suit via a transfer bid.

Today, the responder has a long minor. What should he do? I believe everyone should use transfers into the majors, but only take up transfers into the

minors with regular partners. (If you would like to learn about these transfers, go to my web site: phillipalderbridge.com.)

If you do not use minor-suit transfers, the best way to sign off in a minor is by immediately jumping to three of your long suit, which must contain at least six cards — as in today's deal.

If you use minor-suit transfers, follow your partnership methods.

And note that one no-trump ought to fail.

How should South plan the play in three diamonds after West leads the heart jack?

Declarer starts with two losers in the majors and at least one trump loser. His basic plan should be to lead trumps toward his hand, up to his honors, and to take club finesses when in his hand. Here, he will lose one spade, one heart and two diamonds to make his contract.

And INDIANA COUNTY "ON BEHALF OF" INDIANA BOROUGH AND CENTER TOWNSHIP

This notice will serve to advise all residents of Indiana County and Indiana County "On Behalf Of" Indiana Borough and Center Township the following actions:

- 1) Restrict a person in any way in access to housing, services, or benefits;
- 2) Afford persons an opportunity to participate in housing, services, or benefits different than that afforded to others;
- 3) Treat a person differently from others in determining whether they satisfy eligibility criteria;
- 4) Provide any housing, services, or benefits to a person differently than to others;
- 5) Use criteria or methods of administration which have the effect of subjecting persons to discrimination or defeating or impairing the objectives of a funded program or activity.

If based on race, color, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), national origin, religion, familial status (families with children), or handicap (disability) is prohibited by Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Act) and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act (PHRA) adds the additional protected classes of age, ancestry and use of guide or support animals because of the blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or guide animals are considered discriminatory.

It is also prohibited to threaten, coerce, intimidate, or interfere with anyone exercising a fair housing right or assisting others who exercise the right. Also, retaliation against a person who has filed a fair housing complaint or assisted in a fair housing investigation is prohibited.
