Located in Indiana County at the confluence of Yellow and Two Lick Creeks, it became known for manufacturing with the development of small, independent factories and larger installations, such as the Prairie State Incubator Company factory, which later became the home of Syntron/FMC. A valuable presence in this Commonwealth, Homer City Borough is a community which has always been blessed with steadfast citizens, concerned community and civic-minded leaders, lasting traditions and a resilient spirit that have helped it to thrive for one hundred fifty years and prepared it to meet the challenges of the future.
