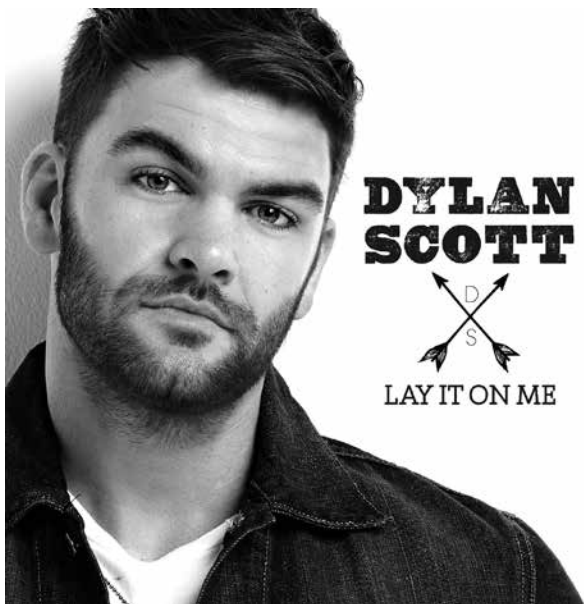
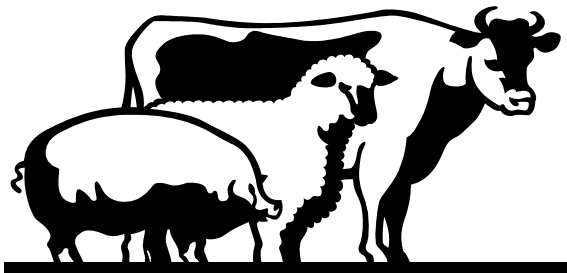

Indiana County Fair Mission Statement

The Indiana County Fair shall promote the growth and improvement of agriculture sciences; educate and provide for the exchange of information between the producer and consumer of food, fiber and energy; and educate and provide a venue for the exchange of agricultural sciences among governmental agencies, local businesses, and non-profit organizations.

The Indiana County Fair reserves the privilege of determining who may be vendors and exhibitors at the Fair. All printed rules apply unless changes are made by the board of directors, and then those rules will supersede any prior rules.

No SOLICITATION is permitted on Fair Grounds except by paid vendors
Roving solicitation of any kind is prohibited
No Banners, Signs or Leaflets are to be carried, displayed or distributed
without written permission of Fair Personnel

Skateboards, Hoverboards, Segways, Bicycles (except EMT's)
Motorcycles, Scooters (except ADA recognized medical wheelchairs)
and Drones are prohibited

Golf Carts, ATV's - Side by sides are prohibited
except use by authorized Fair Personnel

Any motorized vehicle operator must be 16 years of age or older

Deliveries on the Fair Grounds are prohibited after 11:00 am

No Pets are permitted without leashes unless they are being exhibited at
the fair and are registered for exhibition

The use or possession of non-prescription Drugs is prohibited
on the Fair Grounds

Alcoholic Beverages are prohibited

Smoking is prohibited in any buildings, barns or grandstand

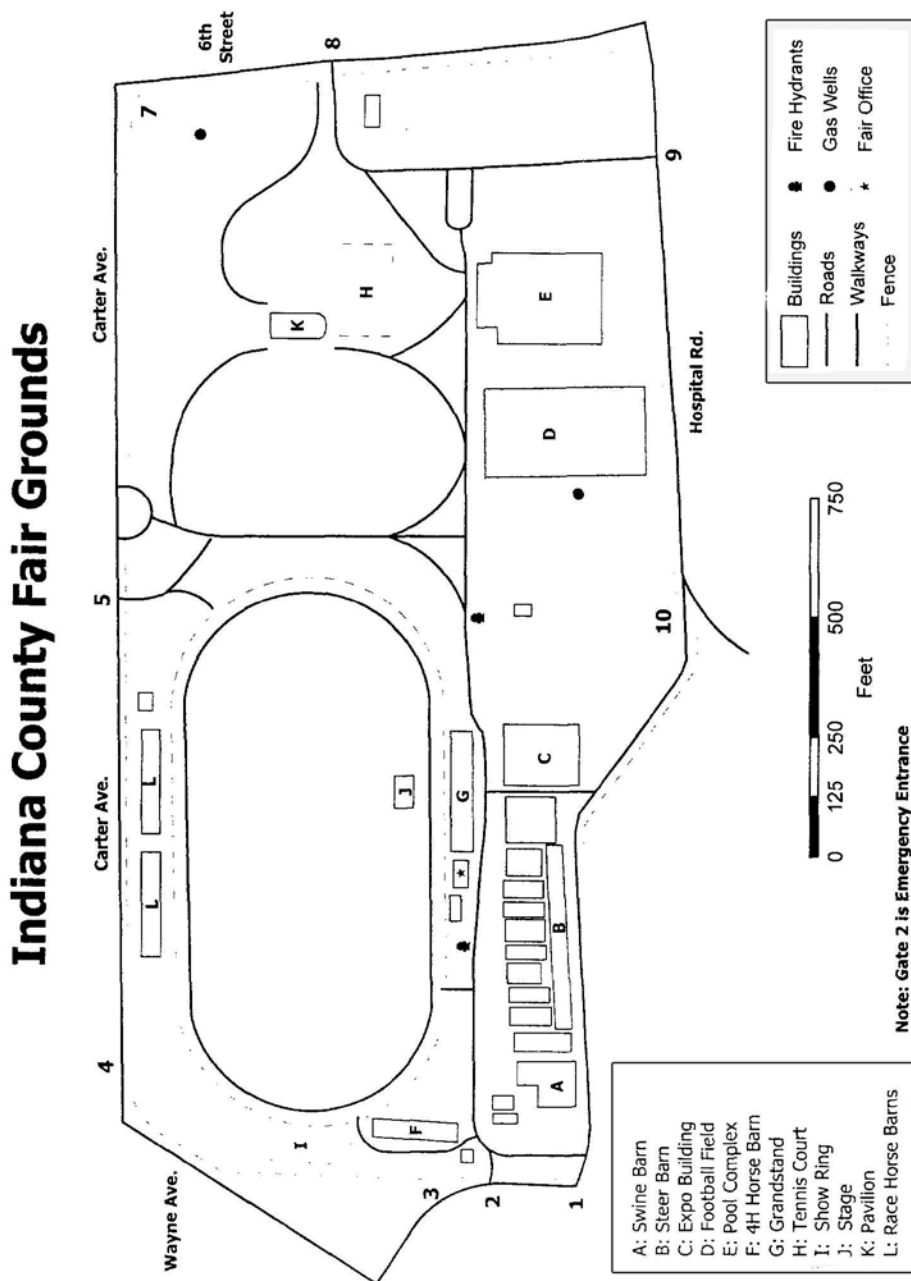
Any and all Exploding Devices are prohibited on the Fair Grounds

Kenneth “Kenny” Widdowson



Kenny Widdowson was a life-long resident of Indiana County. He was the oldest of 12 children, born in Penn Run. After graduating from Indiana Area Senior High School, Kenny received a business degree from Indiana State Teacher's College.

He married Lois Fyock in 1947, and they settled in Indiana. They were married for 54 years until Lois passed away in 2004. Kenny worked for Exxon at the Indiana bulk plant on old Route 119 for 36 years, starting as an office clerk and retiring as the plant's superintendent.

Kenny was a very active member of the Indiana Church of the Brethren, serving on several committees and as a deacon through his lifetime. He volunteered at St. Andrew's Village for over 30 ears, the Brethren Church's Camp Harmony in Hooversville, PA, and with Brethren Disaster Relief.

He was an avid bowler and traveled to several tournaments, both state and national, even as a senior citizen. He was a member of the Indiana Coin Club, and enjoyed collecting pocket knives, old glass bottles, playing golf, pitching horseshoes, and gardening.

He was a devoted IUP sports fan, especially of the baseball and basketball teams. He helped take the baseball equipment to spring trainings in Florida for several years, and his license plate was "IUP FAN". He established the Ken and Lois Widdowson Scholarship Fund for IUP mathematics majors, in honor of Lois who graduated from Indiana Normal School as a mathematics education major.

In 1981 he began serving as the Indiana County Fair's race secretary, and served in this capacity until 2003. Following his year's as race secretary, Ken served as associate timer for the races.

He thoroughly enjoyed his years with his fair friends.

CONTEST RULES

The purpose of the Fair Queen Competition is to encourage the promotion of agricultural fairs and to create better relations between youth and adults in both rural and urban settings. The winner of the Indiana County Fair Queen will be eligible to compete for a scholarship at the state level, and for the title of Pennsylvania State Fair Queen.

INDIANA COUNTY COMPETITION RULES:

EACH CONTESTANT MUST:

1. Meet one (1) of the following three (3) requirements:
 - A) Be a resident of Indiana County
 - B) Attend a school in Indiana County
 - C) Be a member of an FFA club or regularly organized 4-H Club within Indiana County.
2. Be a female at least 16 but not over 20 years of age by June 1st of the year entering the local contest.
3. Have her parent or guardian's consent.
4. Be single, never married, have had no children and must not marry, nor get pregnant during her reign.
5. Not be a former fair queen winner or state fair queen contestant.
6. Attend a mandatory meeting the last week of July.
7. Present, at competition, a 3 to 5 minute speech on "**Why You Should Come To My Fair.**"
8. Be available during the Indiana County Fair.
9. Agree to follow the rules set forth by the State Fair Queen Committee in order to complete at the state competition in January where a \$1,500 scholarship toward education will be awarded to the winner.
10. Meet and greet visitors and local officials and participate in area parades, dinners, and regional festivals.

State Fair Queen Obligations:

1. Attend all Pennsylvania State Fair Queen program-sanctioned events including, but not limited to, above-mentioned events.
2. Be available for other events/obligations that may arise on behalf of PSACF.
3. Attend the next year's state competition and crown the State Fair Queen.

Application Information:

Contestants are judged on the following criteria:

1. **RESUME AND WRITTEN ESSAY** (To be submitted with application form below): A (300 words or fewer) essay on "**What My Fair Means To My Community**". These will be judged on grammar, content and spelling. (15 points).
2. **PERSONAL INTERVIEW:** Each contestant will have an individual meeting with the three judges. Results of the interview will be based on the contestant's conversational ability, answers to questions, appearance, poise, activities, and knowledge of the industry. (30 points)
3. **SPEECH PRESENTATION:** See above. During this 3 to 5 minute speech, the contestant will be judged on poise/presence and speaking ability as well as the speech content and message (remember – agriculture).

Winner will be announced and presented at the opening ceremonies of the 2017 Indiana County Fair. The winner will be awarded either a **\$750 Scholarship toward education or \$500**. Travel and housing expenses for the trip to the state queen competition in January will be arranged and paid for by the Indiana County Fair Board. Alternate Fair Queen will receive a \$100.

Rules for show:

1. Judging will be done by a panel of judges.
2. To be eligible, you must have been a champion showman of the senior division in the 4-H and FFA junior shows in the following: beef, dairy, breeding goat, horse, sheep, and swine. If first place individual decides not to participate, the second place individual will then become eligible.
3. All champion showmen show as one class for each species
4. Champion showmen of each species may use his or her animal in the contest. Other animals in each class will be selected by drawing lots by contestants. Contestants may be asked to switch animals among other contestants.
5. Animals other than those selected by the showmen will be selected by officials of the contest.
6. Where one member wins more than one champion showman award, he or she may select which species they want to show. The 2nd place showman of the other species is then eligible to compete.
7. Each species contest will last approximately 10 minutes or longer if the judges of that species deem it necessary.
8. Members will be scored in the following areas in each species:
 - a. Personal appearance
 - b. Fitting of their animal
 - c. Knowledge of the species of which you were chosen champion
 - d. Showmanship ability
 - e. Courtesy and sportsmanship
 - f. Attitude
9. Show order will be: swine, horse, beef, goat, dairy, and sheep.
10. The Premier Showman award will be presented to the overall winner.
11. In case of any dispute or ties, the judge's decision will be final.
12. Showmen cannot win the Premier Showmanship more than two times.

- 20 or more exhibitors — four showmanship classes
 - Beginner Showmanship — ages 8 to 9
 - Junior Showmanship — ages 10 to 12
 - Intermediate Showmanship — ages 13 to 15
 - Senior Showmanship — ages 16 and older

Fitting of animal will count for 20% in showmanship classes.

If there are no entries in a particular age division, the species superintendent IS NOT
permitted to alter age divisions.

In the event that the receipts of the Fair are insufficient to meet all expenses and to pay all premiums in full, the Indiana County Fair Association reserves the right to prorate the funds available for premiums among the respective winners and payment on a prorated share, though less than the amount advertised, shall constitute a full and complete discharge of any premium obligation.

2. Personal and property damage.

All persons who enter upon the fairgrounds and use the facilities on said grounds for purpose of exhibiting, displaying, competing or in any other manner participating in the Fair do so at their own risk. The Indiana County Fair Association will not be liable for any personal injury or property damage suffered by any person visiting the Fair irrespective of how such injury or damage occurs. The Indiana County Fair Association will not intentionally show or permit to be shown, any dangerous attractions on the grounds. However, the showing of certain attractions require that spectators be reasonably careful in their conduct and be reasonably watchful of the conduct of children; and although the Indiana County Fair Association will take every precaution, it will not be responsible for any personal injury or property damaged suffered by reason of any attraction shown or exhibited during the Fair.

Any animal entered in the carcass show, performance contest, and/or live show or sale shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. If upon slaughter a recent treatment with drugs or biologics is the cause of condemnation of the carcass, the loss of the carcass will be borne by the exhibitor, and exhibitor will forfeit any premiums and will return any sale proceedings to the buyer, and also be barred from next year's fair.

TRANSPORTATION:

The exhibitor or agent must pay all expenses for transportation and transfer to the space allotted.

COMPLAINTS:

The Management will consider it a kindness if mistreatment or extortion practiced by any of the employees of the Fair or Concessions is reported at once. Please report immediately.

PROPERTY:

All articles on exhibition must be respected as private property, and any person detected in purloining them or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES

All who intend to exhibit purebred livestock must produce a certificate of registry for each animal when same is requested by the Superintendent in charge.

No entry for same article shall be made in more than one department.

When an entry is made of stock or articles, the Secretary will give the party a card, which will contain the Department, Division and Class, which must be attached to the stall or articles. Otherwise it will be passed over by the Judges without notice and no premium will be awarded.

All entries must be made in strict compliance with the premium list and all awards will be made accordingly.

Comfortable stalls for cattle, pens for sheep and hogs are provided.

All possible care will be taken to select competent, impartial, and disinterested persons for members of the awarding committee and no person will be permitted to influence the committee in any way or to interfere with them in the discharge of their duties upon penalty of forfeiting their premium.

The decisions of the judges are final.

To protect our livestock from highly contagious diseases, the Board of Directors will continue to enforce that **(No animal shall be unloaded from the transport vehicle until the health papers and the animal have been checked by the Superintendent or his representative.)**

Exhibitors are required to give personal attention to their property and

No exhibitors will be allowed to display the premium or badge from other fairs until the Judges of this Fair have acted and reported.

All exhibitors are required to show their passes at the gate.

All protests must be made in writing, signed, and accompanied by a deposit of \$5 (which will be returned if the protest is sustained); must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Secretary's Office within six (6) hours after cause of protest.

Animals not entered for competition will not be allowed on Fairground.

Exhibitors are required to keep their exhibits in a presentable condition.

Each Livestock exhibitor limited to two entries in each class except where stated otherwise. All other Departments limited to one entry per class.

All Livestock trucks remaining on the grounds for the week shall be parked according to Fair management.

Non-compliance means forfeiture of premium.

The weigh-in weights of steers, sheep and swine are official. Any complaints must be made at the time of weighing.

EXHIBITORS ARE ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED from sleeping with their animals; any exhibitor violating this rule does so at his own risk. The Fair Association is not responsible for any injuries caused by an animal to an exhibitor in this manner.

Any announcement made prior to any event during fair week takes precedence over any other rules printed in Fair Premium Book.

All animals admitted to Indiana Co. Fair shall be identified by a unique and permanent ear tag, tattoo, brand or records of unique physical attributes. Animals known to be infected with or exposed to any contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease, and animals restricted by quarantine may not be assembled for show purposes.

All animals admitted to Indiana Co. Fair must comply with applicable state (7 PA Code) or federal (9 CFR) rules. All cloven-hoof animals, not subject to 7 PA Code or 9 CFR, including members of the deer and camilid families, shall have been born in Pennsylvania or resided in Pennsylvania for at least six (6) months and shall be brucellosis and tuberculosis tested (negative) by an accredited veterinarian within 60 days of admission to the show.

Animals presented for exhibition will be subject to inspection by show officials and will be rejected if evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease is apparent or if health certification or identification documentation is not acceptable.

Animals must leave the grounds within 4 hours of rejection.

All show animals should be held in isolation for at least 30 days after return to the herd of origin.

Health Rules are subject to change as mandated by PA Dept. of Agriculture.

Animals known to be infected with or exposed to any contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease and animals restricted by quarantine may not be assembled for show purposes. All animals (cattle, sheep, goats, horses, and swine) and poultry admitted to a county fair must be accompanied by an official BAHDS health certificate indicating compliance with applicable state and federal regulations. A statement by an accredited veterinarian that these animals were examined within 30 days of issuance of the health certificate, and found to be free of clinical signs of contagious disease shall also accompany these animals.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

All animals are required to comply with the Indiana County Fair and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Animal Health requirements. Copies of the requirements are available at the fair office and/or www.indianacountyfair.com or by contacting the PA Department of Agriculture Veterinarian at 717-783-9550 and/or www.agriculture.state.pa.us.



2017 PENNSYLVANIA FAIR ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Section 1: Equine Animals:

Requirements

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2017 prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)* form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. All equine animals must have tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A copy of the official test results must accompany each animal to its final destination. Foals less than 6 months of age accompanied by a dam which meets the above requirements are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

Section 2: Pennsylvania Poultry, Waterfowl, Upland Game Birds, Ratites, and Pigeons:

Requirements:

1. All Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear a unique individual identification leg band (official state-issued leg bands are not required). Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader).
2. An owner-endorsed health certificate must accompany all Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, ratites, and pigeons, and must include the following:
 - Name and location of exhibition; and
 - Name, address, and telephone number of the owner; and
 - A statement that their entries and their flock of origin are free of evidence of contagious diseases; and
 - Owner signature and date of that signature; and
 - **Verification of testing for AI and Pullorum.**
3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
4. Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification (all samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian):
 - All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (**pigeons excluded**) for exhibition must originate from a flock in good standing in the Pennsylvania Avian Influenza Monitored Flock program, or from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Avian Influenza Clean program;

OR

- The birds must originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza within the 6 months prior to opening date of the exhibition and the birds are accompanied by the test report. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. **For waterfowl, cloacal swab samples must be collected for testing, and the swabs must be tested using virus isolation techniques.**

5. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification (***pigeons and waterfowl excluded***). (All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian):
 - All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (***pigeons and waterfowl excluded***) must originate from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Program or from a flock in good standing in the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program;
 - OR**
 - Individual birds (***pigeons and waterfowl excluded***) for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
 - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
 - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
 - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
 - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
 - All birds not meeting these age restrictions are exempt from pullorum testing requirements

Section 4: Pennsylvania Swine:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2017 prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual animal ID is required. ID options include the following:
 - A form of official ID (herd tattoo *in combination* with an ear notch; or a state issued metal ear tag; or an ISO-compliant Radio Frequency Identification tag); or
 - A plastic stamped ear tag. (PA Swine only)

Section 6: Pennsylvania Cattle:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2017 prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
 - A state-issued metal ear tag; or
 - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
 - A state-registered tattoo.
- NEW 5. It is recommended that all cattle have a rabies vaccination. (Market animals are exempt.)**
6. All cattle for exhibition in Pennsylvania should be accompanied by a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian that includes a statement that the animal(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, PI3 and BVD using at least two (2) doses of killed vaccine, two to four (2-4) weeks apart or one dose of MLV vaccine. The most recent vaccine must be administered not less than fifteen (15) days or more than one hundred eighty (180) days before the show.

IMPORTANT! The date of the last live virus vaccination, or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations, must be recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Hyper immune serum may not be used as a substitute for the above vaccination requirement. No animals will be admitted to the Fairgrounds Complex unless these requirements have been met.

Section 8: Sheep and Goats:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2017 prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
 - A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9 AM to 5 PM. Your order may take several weeks for processing, so order tags early; or
 - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
 - A scrapie tattoo. Goats with an official scrapie tattoo must also have a unique individual animal ID (tattoo) to meet the scrapie ID requirement; or
 - Goats having a breed registration tattoo and accompanied by a registration certificate are exempt from the scrapie ID requirement if the tattoo is legible and a registration certificate (copy acceptable) or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which lists the tattoo and registry accompanies the animal at all times during transport from the premises of birth.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep and goats are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

Section 10: Rabbits:

Requirements:

1. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany all PA rabbits, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

Section 16: Dogs for Exhibition:

Requirements:

1. A current rabies vaccination is required for all exhibition dogs three months of age and older. All vaccine label directions must be followed.
2. All rabies vaccinated dogs must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate. The certificate must contain legible name, contact information, and signature of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.
3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

INDIANA COUNTY FAIR CODE OF ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in the competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct of questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and may be prohibited from future exhibition. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any fact relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the show.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owners, fitter, trainers, and/or absolutely responsible persons for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event that culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal and state statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal and state statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance in the event. If the laboratory report of the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory, and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after the animal arrives on the show grounds, a licensed veterinarian shall administer all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal.
5. Any surgical procedure of injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animals' performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hooves or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animal to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In furtherance with their official duty, all judges, show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect, and no person shall direct abuse or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for the animal's condition by an owner exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is giving consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the show management for violation of this code of ethics. The act of entering an animal is giving consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the show management may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Exposition, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in the show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read this code of ethics and understands the consequences and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further and consents that any action, which contravenes these rules and is in violation of federal and state statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

12. Any animal entered in the carcass and/or live show or sale shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. If upon slaughter a recent treatment with drugs, biologics or alteration of the animal by any means is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss will be borne by the exhibitor.
13. **Any disrespectful, angry or combative behavior directed to (but not limited to) any judge or superintendent by any exhibitor, parent or agent thereof, before, during or after any fair event or show will not be tolerated. Failure to comply may result in the loss of all premiums and/or not being invited back to the Indiana County Fair. All decisions will be at the discretion of the superintendent and the fair board.**

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. 4-H exhibitors must be a member of a regularly organized Indiana County 4-H Club and be under the supervision of the club leader and Penn State Extension. FFA exhibitors must be members of a regularly organized FFA Chapter and be under the supervision of the Chapter Advisor.
2. If a member has both 4-H and FFA projects, the member must clearly designate which program each animal belongs to at the time of tagging and project identification. The animal may not be switched to another program during the project year.
3. Each project animal must be enrolled in the name of a single 4-H/FFA member. Family enrollment forms are not permitted. No switches are allowed after the initial identification. Members are responsible for keeping records on their own project animals.
4. If a 4-H/FFA member has an animal lose an animal identification tag, he or she must notify their 4-H club leader/FFA advisor. A new tag will be issued. If fresh tags not previously reported are observed at roundup weigh-in, or animals appear with no tags, a meeting of the sale committee with FFA Advisor/Extension Educator will occur to decide whether that animal and member may participate in the roundup.
5. 4-H Club or FFA members must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging. (The Fair Board in consultation with FFA Advisor/Extension Educator must approve exceptions. If approved, the substitute showman must be an Indiana County 4-H or FFA member, the same age or younger than the original exhibitor.) When an exhibitor has more than one market animal in the same class, their assistant must be a member of an Indiana County 4-H or FFA Club.
6. **All animals must be on the fairgrounds on Sunday. Receiving Market Livestock 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. Weigh-in begins at 3:30 p.m. Sunday. Animals which do not meet weight requirements must be removed on Sunday of the fair.**
7. The Junior Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to limit, at their discretion, the number of animals sold by an exhibitor through the Livestock Sale.
8. The Livestock Committee has the right to withdraw animals of unacceptable quality or animals that are uncontrollable from the show.
9. If a livestock exhibitor wishes to sell at the Indiana County Junior Livestock sale at the Indiana County Fair, they may not have participated in another Junior Livestock or youth sale, with a market swine, lamb, steer or market goat excluding the Farm Show and all National shows and sales. They will be eligible to show in the appropriate class only and will not be eligible to receive any Champion or Reserve Champion awards including market, performance, carcass and county bred.
10. 4-H and FFA members must tell the superintendent of the show by the end of the show whether or not his or her animal will be sold through the sale. Failure to do so will prohibit participation in next year's sale.
11. All exhibitors will follow the Indiana County Fair Livestock Code of Ethics. Any violation of the Indiana County Fair Livestock Code of Ethics may be cause to expel the exhibitor from the show.
12. An animal can win no more than one Champion or Reserve Champion award.
13. The Champion and Reserve Champion cannot be considered for the performance or county-bred awards.
14. Release time for all livestock will be the last Saturday of the fair at 8:00 p.m. except for the animals sold through the sale which will be released following the sale.
15. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding — no newspaper.
16. Important! If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.
17. Junior Livestock exhibitors are responsible for the care of animals until picked up by the buyer. The Load-out Committee has the authority to hire a truck to deliver animals to the slaughterhouse at the expense of the seller should such arrangements be necessary.
18. The sale order is 4-H/FFA Market hogs, lambs, steers and market goats. The following Champions and Reserve Champions must be sold: Market hogs, lambs, steers; Carcass hogs, lambs, steers; Performance hogs, lambs, steers; Champion County bred hog, lamb, steer and market goats.
19. At no time shall an exhibitor sell more than four animals total. No more than two animals per specie, which includes any Champion or Reserve Champion of show or performance show. Carcass champions are a bonus.
20. No personal scales are permitted on the fairgrounds.
21. Market Entry Forms found on the Indiana County Fair and Penn State Extension Office's websites will be used for livestock. When no form exists, use the standard entry form found at the end of this fair book.
22. Special note: Lambs and Market Goats MUST be slick sheared prior to weigh-in (carcass, performance, and market). Slick shorn is defined as the body being shorn to ¼" or less, not including breed characteristics. This will be enforced at weigh-in.

23. The exhibitor with their animal must be in the sale barn at least 15 minutes prior to the sale of your species. If a substitute person is needed to sell your animal, you need to designate the change to the sale committee member lining up the animal for the sale. Failure to comply will result in your animal being forfeited from the sale.

Federal and State animal health regulation apply for animals exhibited at the Indiana County Fair.

- NEW 24. Any extra ear tags must be removed from livestock before going through sale on Friday. NEW
NEW 25. "There will be no drenching, pumping or force feeding liquids of any kind to lambs or goats." NEW

Please consult the current fair book for the most up to date regulations.

4-H/FFA SHOWMANSHIP

For the following species: Junior Dairy Show, Junior Beef Show, Junior Sheep Show, Junior Market Goat Show, Junior Swine Show, Junior Poultry Show, Junior Breeding Goat Show

1. 4-H or FFA members may show an animal in the showing contest provided it has been carried as a project and is owned by the exhibitor and qualifies for the junior type show.
2. Ages as determined by January 1 of the current year.
3. Money and Rosette ribbons will be awarded only to the first five who qualify. Ribbons will be awarded to other participants who qualify, as determined by the judge. Fitting will count for 20% in all champion showmanship classes.

The following guidelines will determine showmanship classes in the following species: Junior Dairy Show, Junior Beef Show, Junior Sheep Show, Junior Breeding Goat Show, Junior Rabbit Show, Junior Swine Show, Junior Poultry Show and Jr. Market Goat Show.

The number of showmanship classes will be determined by the number of exhibitors in each species on show day:

- 1 to 10 exhibitors – two showmanship classes
 - Junior Showmanship – ages 8 to 13
 - Senior Showmanship – ages 14 and older
- 11 to 19 exhibitors – three showmanship classes
 - Junior Showmanship – ages 8 to 11
 - Intermediate Showmanship – ages 12 to 15
 - Senior Showmanship – ages 16 and older
- 20 or more exhibitors – four showmanship classes
 - Beginner Showmanship – ages 8 to 9
 - Junior Showmanship – ages 10 to 12
 - Intermediate Showmanship – ages 13 to 15
 - Senior Showmanship – ages 16 and older

Fitting of animal will count for 20% in showmanship classes.

If there are no entries in a particular age division, the species superintendent IS NOT permitted to alter age divisions.

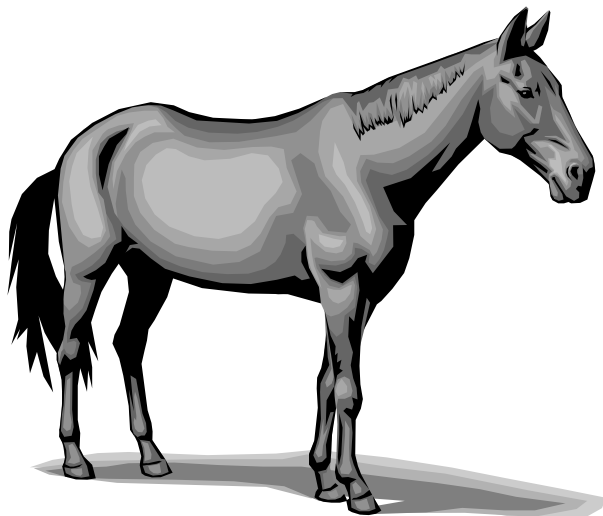

RELEASE TIME FOR ALL LIVESTOCK WILL BE SATURDAY, 8:00 P.M.

Fair Management shall be responsible for notifying exhibitors of the requirement and checking entries for compliance thereto.

1. No horse shall be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
2. Animals or combinations of animals owned by one exhibitor may be entered in the classes following.
3. All animals entered must compete and be shown.
4. The Fair reserves the right to refuse any or all entries.
5. No box stalls available.
6. When housing is exhausted, entries will be refused.
7. Must show animals individually before entering group classes.
8. Exhibitors are required to keep exhibits in barn area in presentable condition. Non-compliance means forfeiture of premium.
9. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding – no newspaper
10. Youth class exhibitors must be under 18 years of age.
11. No grade stallions shall be accepted for entry.
12. In no case is it permissible to show more than one breed in the same class or division to be judged against each other for premiums except for supreme champion classes.
13. NOTE: Fairs may show as many additional Champion classes as they wish for ribbon awards only.

7. No yearling stallions or older are permitted.

9. Competitors for the Champion Games, Western, and English Riders awards may compete for only one of these awards, and must designate which award they are vying for before the show.

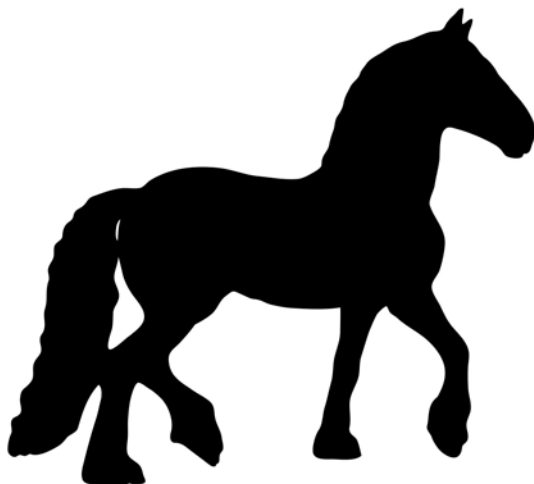

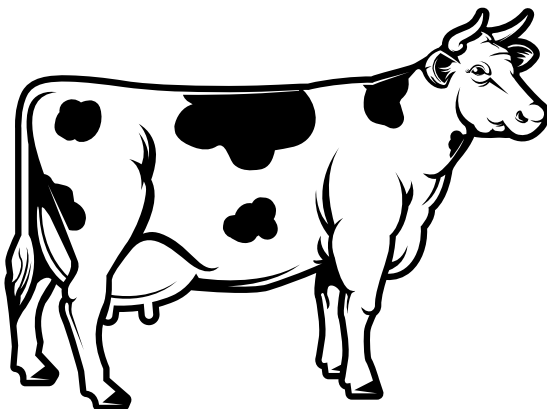

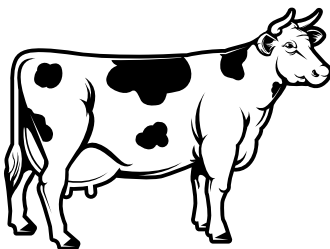

SECTIONS A - RW

4-H Roundup & FFA Dairy Show

1. 4-H exhibitors must be a member of a regularly organized Indiana County 4-H Club and be under the supervision of the club leader and the Indiana County Cooperative Extension. FFA exhibitors must be members of a regularly organized FFA Chapter and be under the supervision of the Chapter Advisor. Exhibitors, both 4-H and FFA must be carrying a project in the field they wish to make an entry by June 1, preceding the fair.
2. 4-H Club and FFA members must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging. If member cannot be present, substitute showman must be approved by FFA Advisor/Extension Educator. If approved, the substitute showman must be an Indiana County 4-H or FFA member, the same age or younger than the original exhibitor.
3. Ownership: Currently Pennsylvania/Indiana County 4-H guidelines on animal ownership are as follows:
 - A. Registered animals: Members wishing to exhibit at the county, district, and state show levels must own and have registration certificates issued by one of the following associations:
 - (1). Animals bred and owned by the exhibitor shall be registered in the exhibitor's name by the show date.
 - (2). Animals not bred by the exhibitor:
 - a. Animals with birth dates falling in the senior yearling or younger classes must be owned by the exhibitor on or before June 1 of current year.
 - b. Animals with birth dates falling in the junior 2 year old or older classes must be owned by the exhibitor on or before January 1 of current year. The date of sale that is shown on the registration certificate will be considered as the date of ownership in all cases.
 - (3). Partnership ownership will only be accepted if the exhibitor's name appears on the registration and is in partnership with an FFA chapter or a 4-H club. These partnership animals must be owned by the acceptable partnership in accordance with the dates in sections a. and b. above.
 - B. Leased animals: The intent of the 4-H animal leasing program is to provide opportunities for 4-H dairy project involvement to youth who: lack financial resources needed to purchase and care for an animal; lack facilities and equipment necessary to provide proper daily care for a large animal, or are prevented from participating in project experiences requiring ownership and daily care of a large animal due to circumstances beyond their control. 4-H members lease breeding animals owned and housed by a sponsor for the project year. Leased animals may only be exhibited at 4-H county roundup. Leased animals are also eligible to show in open class.
 - C. Qualified Entry/Non-registered animals: The intent of the 4-H qualified entry/non-registered dairy program is to provide opportunities for 4-H dairy project involvement to youth who lack financial resources needed to purchase a registered animal but have access to qualified entry/non-registered animals on their family farm. Members are encouraged to work with their respective national breed association genetic recovery program on upgrading these projects to a registered status. **Animals must be pure to the breed — no crossbreds may be shown. Crossbreds coming to the ring will be disqualified.**
 - (1). Qualified Entry/Non-registered animals must have a known birth date and sire. Both birth dates and the sire can be verified with a breeding certificate or an identified grade certificate issued from a national breed association. It is strongly suggested that the project animal be A1 sired.
 - (2). Qualified Entry/Non-registered animals must be owned by the 4-H member by the following.
 - a. Animals with birth dates falling in the senior yearling or younger classes must be owned by the exhibitor on or before June 1 of prior year.
 - b. Animals with birth dates falling in the junior 2 year old or older classes must be owned by the exhibitor on or before January 1 of prior year.
4. No animal can be shown in both 4-H and FFA competition in the same year.
5. The superintendent has the right to withdraw animals of unacceptable quality and remove animals that are uncontrollable from the show.
6. Must show animals individually before entering group classes.
7. **Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding — no newspaper.**
8. Milk will be tested for antibiotics. Exhibitors are responsible to insure that animals have not been treated with antibiotics. Exhibitors will be responsible for any and all penalties that result from any contamination of the milk supply from their animals. Individual samples may be taken at the direction of the Fair Board.
9. **Early dismissal for attendance at the District Show must have a certification from the 4H/FFA advisor and be presented to the Superintendent prior to leaving the fair.**

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. Entries will be received until such time as the cooping capacity is reached.
2. Only properly entered specimens and specimens listed under the conditions of the fair's premium book will be accepted.
3. No string exhibitors accepted.
4. The "American Standard of Perfection" of the American Poultry Association and the "Bantam Standard" of the American Bantam Association will govern poultry judging.
5. A bird can only compete for one prize, except as provided for in special awards.
6. A judge shall not officiate in a class where he has an entry. Collusion between a judge and exhibitor will exclude from competition and awards all entries of the offending exhibitor. Exhibitor's protest relative to such exclusion must be in writing.
7. A fair attendant will clean the cages and walkways.
8. Entered specimens must be bona fide property of exhibitor and have been hatched in Pennsylvania.
9. During the continuance of the show, all birds will be examined carefully each day. Birds showing signs of disease will be segregated and properly cared for or returned to the owner at his expense.
10. Substitutions will be permitted before closing date of the entries. No substitutions will be permitted after closing date of entries unless of the same breed variety and sex.
11. Birds will be handled only by the judge or authorized fair official.
12. Premiums will be awarded only on birds exhibited in their proper classes.
13. In the absence of a protest, which must be in writing, the decision of the judges will be final.
14. Premiums will be paid only on awards indicated by the judges' records.
15. Entries will be accepted and premiums paid only on breeds, varieties, and colors listed under the conditions noted in the fair's premium book.

16. The management reserves the right to reduce the number of entries from one party if the cooping facilities are exhausted.
17. Entries may be made in all classes if they are listed in the official standards for chickens and bantams. Breed must be named on entry list, and section numbers must be indicated on entries.
18. Cages will be provided by Fair Association.
19. **Each exhibitor limited to 2 entries per class; 40 birds per exhibitor; no entries accepted in farm names.**

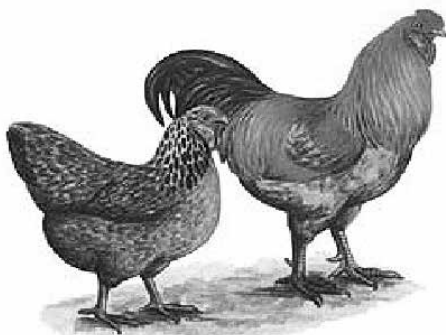

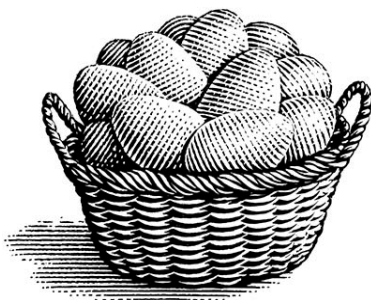

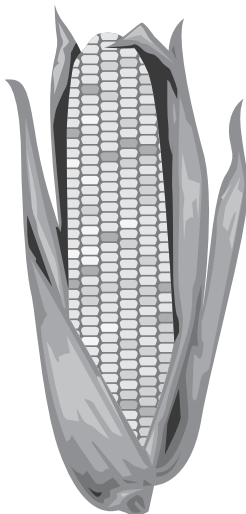

1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens. If at all possible, do not mix varieties.
2. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge.
 - a. Trueness to variety type. If at all possible, pick the specimens from one variety.
 - b. Uniformity in shape, size, and color.
 - c. Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, and then select the others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
 - d. Protect from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
 - e. Condition and maturity. Be sure that exhibits are of high quality.
 - f. Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
 - g. Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetables leaving about (2) two inches of stems.

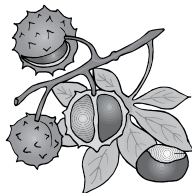

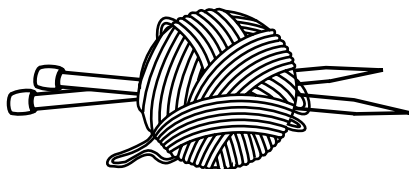

2. If the contestant does not own a sheep, one can be borrowed from an exhibitor.
3. Outfits worn by the contestants must be made of 100% wool or a wool blend with a minimum of 70% wool. The outfit can be either handmade or purchased.
4. Each contestant must provide a short personal commentary. It is to be written in third person (she, he, etc.). Information to be included:
Paragraph 1 - Introduction of person, age, residence
Paragraph 2 - Description of outfit
Paragraph 3 - Description of animal, age and ownership.
5. Contestants should be ready 20 minutes before the start of the contest.
6. A panel of two judges will rate the overall appearance of the contestant and animal.
7. There is no room for lead class sheep to be housed at the fairgrounds (This is sheep that are not being shown at the Fair).

1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens. If at all possible, do not mix varieties.
2. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge.
 - a. Trueness to variety type. If at all possible, pick the specimens from one variety.
 - b. Uniformity in shape, size, and color.
 - c. Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select the others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
 - d. Protect from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
 - e. Condition and maturity. Be sure that exhibits are of high quality.
 - f. Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
 - g. Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetables leaving about (2) two inches of stems.
3. All produce will become the property of the fair association. After judging, an appropriate portion will be displayed and the balance will be donated to charitable organizations.
4. The Marion Center Bank provides additional trophies for 4-H members who have the best of show entries in flowers and vegetables. Trophies given only if number and quality of entries justify the award.
5. The Indiana County Fair Association assumes no liability for damage to any entries and may discard any damaged or rotten items.
