# Youth Apprenticeship going strong at NHHS

New Holstein High School's Youth Apprenticeship program is strong and getting even stronger, High School Principal Doug Olig told Board of Education members at Monday evening's meeting.

Youth Apprenticeship is a rigorous one- or two-year elective program which combines classroom instruction with mentored on-the-job training in a specific career pathway. High school juniors and seniors are eligible to enter the Youth Apprenticeship program.

Olig said there are six "super clus-

ters" of careers which students can explore:

- Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources;
- Arts, Communications & Information Systems;
- Engineering, Manufacturing & Technology;
- Health Science Technology;
- Human Services;
- and Business, Management & Administration.

Olig took a few minutes to highlight the NHHS students who took part in YA in the past year, including Trevor Roeh-

rig at K&K Homestead; Lauren Weber at Villa Loretto Assisted Living; Corbin Kuba at Amerequip; Zander Casper at Worthington Industries; Colten Kessler at Innovative Auto Body; Cody Abler at Kees Manufacturing; and Paige Thelen at Nick Lisowe Construction.

Students receive three hours of school release per day to take part in YA. Olig said employers and students alike are giving very good reports about the benefits of the program. He added the program is on pace to grow signifi-
