FORMAL REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

Plan. Audrey Cohen-Davis made staff comment on the profit / not-for-profit classification of Vertical Harvest. Nona Yehia, representing Vertical Harvest of Jackson Hole, made public comment regarding project details, civil drawings versus architectural drawings, design and plan review, a four foot encroachment request, the loading zone area, parking concerns, loading and unloading times, collaboration with the Park to Fly program, ventilation of the parking structure, fire suppression in the project design, design of the building, and the partnership with the Town. Jim Gute, representing Vertical Harvest, made public comment regarding parking, the curb line, and parking space concerns. Ted Stark made public comment regarding support for Vertical Harvest. Greg Prugh made public comment regarding support for the project and the need for flexibility for this project. Liz Bremmer made public comment regarding the need for flexibility on

Tyler Sinclair made staff comment regarding the Master

public comment made regarding the potential needs of the future employees at the facility. Discussion followed regarding encroachment, parking concerns, location of the sidewalk, loss of parking spaces under proposal, the gradient difference sidewalk and street, optimization of a tight footprint, the purpose of the 2-foot gap between the Vertical Harvest building and the parking structure, design of the building, size of the building plans, establishing precedent, the plans for the property to the east, and pedestrian right of ways. A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to approve the staff's proposal of the placement and width of the public sidewalk and landscape buffer. The proposed cross section indicates a 12' pedestrian realm on the north side of Simpson Avenue and a 15'-19' pedestrian realm on the south side of Simpson Avenue inclusive of 5' furniture/landscape buffers. These proposed dimensions set up the cross section to have a road centerline alignment that is compatible with the existing centerline of Simpson Avenue between Millward Street and Jackson Street. The mayor called for the vote. The vote showed Barron, Frank, Stanford, Hailey Morton-Levinson in favor and Lenz opposed. The motion carried. It was determined that no additional motions were needed at this point and time, rather discussion would follow to reach a general consent on three additional items including: on-street parking location on Simpson Avenue (the proposed cross section indicates 8' wide onstreet parking on the south side of Simpson Avenue while eliminating on-street parking adjacent to the Vertical Harvest building), the loading zone (the loading zone is currently proposed to be on Simpson Avenue east of the parking garage entrance. The applicant has indicated that their loading needs will require half an hour twice a week and should have minimal interference with the public sidewalk traffic. The loading zone will be a shared turn-out for other shuttle and bus service) and the location of required parking for the Vertical Harvest building. Rodeo Grounds Arena, Restrooms, Crow's Nest & Drainage Improvements with 2010 SPET Funds. Roxanne Robinson made staff comment regarding consent and steps for final approval. Kelli Fennessy made staff comment regarding the current layout of the Rodeo Grounds, landscaping, and layout of the design plan. Steve Foster made staff comment regard-

ing collection of funds, landscaping, the budget request, and start date of the project. Steve Harrington, with the Teton County Fair Board, made public comment on the preliminary step, budget and timing of the project. Philip Wilson, representing W.W. Productions, made public comment regarding support of the preliminary designs, support for improve ments, and suggestions for other areas in and around the Rodeo Grounds Arena. Greg Prugh made public comment regarding a possible buffer between the Rodeo Grounds and residential area. Discussion followed regarding number of ticket purchase points, landscape designs, and sidewalk connectivity. Discussion followed regarding the proposed design, the collection of funds, the flow of pedestrian traffic, parking, landscaping, ticket purchase points, entrances and sidewalk connectivity. A motion was made by Jim Stanford and seconded by Hailey Morton-Levinson to approve the request from Teton County for the improvements to the rodeo grounds/ fair grounds to replace the public restrooms, install safety and structural improvements to the crow's nest, install storm water drainage improvements and improve arena fencing and bucking chutes subject to one condition of approval as follows: Teton County shall apply for a Commercial Building Permit including all necessary documents to be reviewed and approved by the Town Building Official and the Town Council prior to the commencement of any work. Mayor Barron call for a vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried. Fire Station #1 Renovation. Chief Watsabaugh made staff comment regarding Fire Station #1 renovation including facility and training space, the need for renovation and where the money for these renovations would come from, outlining phases of renovation, and the need for on-site staff housing. Bob McLaurin made staff comment regarding the budget. There was no public comment. Discussion followed as where the money for these renovations would come from and the renovations that are needed.
