NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT AN AMENDMENT TO THE TETON COUNTY LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS (LDRs) RELATED TO EXEMPTIONS FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING MITIGATION (AMD2026-0003)

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Wyoming Statute §16-3-103 that Teton County has submitted a request for an amendment to the Teton County Land Development Regulations (LDRs). The proposal is related to Division 6.3 & 7.1, Sections 6.3.2.C.6, 6.3.2.C.13, & 7.1.5.C.6 of the Affordable Workforce Housing Standards and Floor Area Option Standards specific to the 2500 square foot housing mitigation exemption. The request includes increasing the 2,500 square foot home size for an exemption of the mitigation requirements to a larger home size, thus allowing more homes to meet the housing mitigation exemption.

This is an amendment to the Land Development Regulations which is authorized pursuant to Wyoming Statute §18-5-201. The Teton County Planning Department has complied with the requirements of Wyoming Statute §9-5-304 and a copy of the assessment may be obtained from the Teton County Planning Department.

ORDINANCE 1456

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12.10, PARKLETS, OF TITLE 12, STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING:

SECTION I. Section 12.10.060, Form and conditions of the Encroachment Permit, of Chapter 12.10, Parklets, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming is hereby amended as follows: 12.10.060 Form and conditions of the Encroachment Permit.

A. The Permit issued shall be in a form provided by the Town Manager, or their designee.

B. Permits shall be issued annually.

C. Each Encroachment Permit—Parklet authorizes operation only from April 30 to October 30 annually and shall terminate on October 30 of the applicable year.

D. The Permit authorizes operation of a Parklet only in sitemap depicted on the application approved by the Town Manager, or their designee, and attached to or made part of the Permit.
