3. Consideration of Approval of EMP Request for Building Automation System Controls at 1300 Valley

Springs Road - CLC Rafter J

Paul Cote, Facilities Manager, presented to the Board for the consideration of approval a request to utilize Energy Mitigation Program funds to integrate an existing energy use system into a Building Automation System (BAS) at a Teton County owned facility located at 1300 Valley Springs Road commonly known as the Rafter J Childcare Facility or CLC Rafter J. As part of a larger project to upgrade the performance of HVAC systems at the Rafter J Childcare Facility, Facilities learned of these 3 conditions:

1. The make-up air unit (MAU) for the kitchen was inoperative. This created a condition in which heated/cooled air from the facility (depending upon season) was used to displace air exhausted by the kitchen hood, creating the need to reheat/ re-cool air in the facility, adding unnecessarily to heating and cooling demands and reducing energy efficiency.

There are 3 ceiling cassette heaters located at 3 exit doors that are inoperative. The design intent of these units is to provide a quick input of heat to those areas as the entrances are used, particularly at times of heavy usage in the morning, recess, and afternoon. Because these units have not been operating this has stressed the overall heating systems of the facility beyond their capacity causing longer run times and

failure to meet heating set points. Also, because they are not integrated into the overall system and operate independently of it, when they are operating, it is possible for them to be in heating mode when the rest of the building is in cooling mode.

3. There is a Thermal Mixing Valve (TMV) that controls the temperature of the domestic water being supplied to the facility that is not monitored for performance. Ensuring that the unit provides hot water at its specified temperature setting saves energy.

These three items are being repaired as part of the larger HVAC project. These items have been inoperative and/or unmonitored to date because they are not included in the Allerton/Compass BAS, thus Facilities had no knowledge of them or their operational status until the recent HVAC project. Facilities proposes to add these units to the BAS to integrate them into the overall HVAC systems of the Facility and thereby improve the overall energy efficiency of the facility. This project fits the Energy Mitigation Plan goals by the following objectives:

-Conversions of existing energy use systems to more efficient energy saving equipment

-Retrofits to newer and more efficient energy saving equipment There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Barron to approve the EMP funding request in the amount of \$21,852.00 for the controls integration project at the Teton County owned facility located at 1300 Valley Springs Road commonly known as the Rafter J Childcare Facility or CLC Rafter J. Chair Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

5. Consideration of Approval of an Agreement to Render Services with WYDOT for Wildlife Crossings at

22/390 Intersection

Amy Ramage, County Engineer, presented to the Board for consideration of approval an Agreement to Render Services (ARS) that will allow WYDOT to conduct the planning, engineering, design, permitting and construction of two wildlife crossings near the intersection of WY-22 and WY-390, which are to be funded by Teton County. This item was brought before the County Commission on April 21, 2020 and staff was directed by Commissioners to work with WYDOT to revise the ARS to provide more information on how the Teton County-funded wildlife crossings designs and locations will be determined and approved. The following language was added to section 5.A. of the ARS, which addresses the process by which the wildlife crossings will be designed and located, as follows:

"Design of the wildlife crossings will be consistent with the project plan development process utilizing input from the project stakeholder group. The location, type and size of the wildlife crossings (see Exhibit A) has been determined and concurred on by the stakeholder group, which includes both the County and Wyoming Game and Fish."

Teton County Public Works has been closely involved in the planning process for the reconstruction of the WY-22 Snake River Bridge, the intersection at highways 22 and 390 and the construction of four wildlife underpasses in the vicinity of the Snake River Bridge and intersection. Following are specifics on the wildlife underpasses as currently planned:

the Snake River Bridge will be elongated on the east side of the river to allow for wildlife passage, funded by WYDOT;
the highest priority crossing will be constructed immedi-

a crossing will be constructed to the west of the intersection

and east of Green Lane, funded by Teton County; and, - a fourth crossing will be constructed on highway 390 north

of the intersection, funded by Teton County. Additionally, wildlife fencing will be installed in conjunction with the crossings on WY-22 both to the east and west of the intersection and bridge, as well as north on 390. The fencing allows the underpasses to function most effectively. All of these improvements are planned by WYDOT for a 2023 construction start.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Propst to continue this to a date uncertain. Chair Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

An Authority to Render Services agreement between Teton County and WYDOT may be necessary at a future date.

Steve Ashworth, Director of Parks and Recreation, addressed the Board regarding ADA access on the pathway.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Barron to approve the letter to WYDOT, which makes the following recommendations for inclusion in the WYDOT WY-22/390 intersection and Snake River Bridge project: - construction of a traffic signal at the existing intersection of WY-390 and Beckley Parkway;

Works and Snow King

Alyssa Watkins, Board of County Commissioners Administrator, presented to the Board for consideration of approval of Energy Mitigation Program funds towards installation of energy efficient LED lighting and energy efficient lighting controls at the Snow King Center and the Town of Jackson's Public Works Facility. This project will retrofit lighting systems at the Snow King Event Center and the Town of Jackson Public Works Facility to LED lighting. The work at the Snow King Event Center would include upgrading all lighting to 100% LED fixtures. The Ice Rink and Ski Shelter Lodge room will also receive advanced WaveLinx wireless controllers, achieving an additional 20% efficiency improvement over LED lighting alone. The project would also include a retrofit of existing lighting in the maintenance bays and office areas of the Town of Jackson's Public Works facility to 100% LED lighting. The lighting retrofit would build upon previous efficiency improvements at the Snow King Event Center, including the replacement of the synthetic icemaking system with an ammoniabased system, which saved ~%35 on facility-wide energy use. At the Public Works facility, the work would complement other efficiency projects, on-site renewable generation, and electric vehicle charging investments.

The work at the Snow King Event Center is projected to net a \sim 70% reduction in energy consumption over existing lighting and controls and the work at the Public Works facility is projected to net a \sim 50% reduction in energy consumption over existing lighting.

This project is consistent with Teton County's Energy Mitigation Plan. It meets the following criteria: Conversions of existing energy use systems to more efficient energy saving equipment and retrofits to newer and more efficient energy saving equipment.

Public comment was given by Phil Cameron, Energy Conservation Works.

A new, comprehensive HR Policy Manual was presented to the Board of County Commissioners and adopted on March 1, 2020. The Housing Policies had previously been adopted through a Resolution but were incorporated into the HR Policy Manual to provide one source of policy information for employees. The BCC Administrator and Affordable Housing Department are recommending a change to the 'terms' of employee housing leases, located in Chapter 4, Section 17 Subsection (d.) Terms. Current Language:

• Lease term will be six months to one year. Lease will automatically renew for up to three (3) years total unless employee notifies Affordable Housing Department of intent to terminate sooner.

Change Requested:

• The minimum lease term shall be three (3) months and the maximum lease term shall be one (1) year. After three (3) years of residency in a unit, the County may decide not to renew the lease if competing demand for the county employee unit exists. Given the increasing supply of employee housing units available to County employees, this change would allow employees to remain in a County employee housing unit for longer than 3 years if, through informal inquiry or a formal lottery process, the Affordable Housing Department determines that there is not competing demand for the unit from other full-time County employees.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Propst to approve amending the terms of all future county employee housing leases entered into or after July 1, 2020 or current leases that are renewed after July 1, 2020, to include language that leases for County employee housing may be renewed beyond three (3) years if there is no competing demand for a unit. OFFICIAL SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS

OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TETON COUNTY, WYOMING

The Teton County Board of Commissioners met in special session on June 30, 2020 in the Commissioners Chambers located at 200 S. Willow in Jackson. The meeting was called to order at 9:05am ROLL CALL

County Commission: Natalia Macker-Chair Greg Epstein-Vice Chair, Mark Barron, Mark Newcomb, and Luther Propst. Hearing for The Fiscal Year 2021 County Budget Maureen Murphy, County Clerk, presented the FY2021 proposed budget for hearing.

Clerk Murphy addressed some highlights of the proposed budget: the overall mill levy was remains at 8.404; changes in county property values have increased per a continued order from the Wyoming Department of Revenue, State Board of Equalization requiring an effective age study and depreciation adjustment for all commercial properties and removal of all attributes associated with residential properties, whether improved or vacant. Teton County is one of the only counties in the state of Wyoming that does not assess the full 12 mills allowable; the budget is also based on a projected decrease of \$9,757,281 in sales tax revenue.

The proposed General Fund Budget is \$36,284,377 which is about a 19.0% decrease over the adopted FY2020 budget and includes a decrease across departments of approximately \$8.8 million. The general fund includes all general county operations such as public health and safety agencies, general county administrative services, elected offices, and contracts with local human service and community development organizations. When special revenue funds (such as Fire/EMS, Fair, Parks & Recreation, and Capital) are factored in, the overall county budget is \$79,596,859.00.

Clerk Murphy stated it had been a collaborative effort between the Clerk, Treasurer, Assessor, other Elected Officials, Commissioner's Administrator, and Department Directors. It represents a balanced and sustainable plan for the distribution of available financial resources to cover current and proposed services.

Public comment was given by Ivan Jimenez, Brooke Sausser, and Anna Olson.

The hearing closed at 9:15am.

1. Adoption of The Fiscal Year 2021 County Budget The Board held discussion on the following department bud-

gets: Fire/EMS and Human Services. The meeting was recessed at 10:10am and reconvened at

10:19am. Budget discussions continued on the following department budgets: Sheriff's Communications, Commissioners', Public

Health, Housing, START, and Planning. A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Barron to approve the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget Resolution pursuant to the hearing held on June 30, 2020 and the discussed changes to the draft. Chair Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

ORDINANCE 1255

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE WEAR-ING OF FACE COVERINGS IN LIMITED PLACES IN THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WITH EXCEPTIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND A TIME FOR TERMINATION. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE

TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING, IN REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

WHEREAS, Wyo. Stat. Ann. \$15-1-103(a)(xviii) empowers"[t]he governing bodies of all cities and towns [to]: . . . [r]egulate . . . conduct which disturbs or jeopardizes the public health, safety, peace or morality, in any public or private place" and the Town finds that the conduct regulated by this Ordinance severely jeopardizes the health, safety, welfare and lives of the residents of the Town of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, Wyo. Stat. Ann. §15-1-103(a)(xli) empowers "[t] he governing bodies of all cities and towns [to]: . . . [a]dopt ordinances, resolutions and regulations, including regulations not in conflict with this act and necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the city or town, necessary to give effect to the powers conferred by this act" and the Town finds that this Ordinance is not in conflict with state statute and that this Ordinance is necessary for and to preserve the health, safety, of the Town of Jacks and lives of the residents WHEREAS, Wyo. Stat. Ann. §15-1-103(xix) empowers "[t]he governing bodies of all cities and towns [to]: . . . declare and abate nuisances and impose fines upon parties who create, continue or permit nuisances to exist" and the Town finds that COVID-19 is an life-threatening public nuisance and that this Ordinance is necessary to abate the nuisance of COVID-19 to protect and preserve the health, safety, welfare and lives of the residents of the Town of Jackson; and WHEREAS, COVID-19 was first detected in Wuhan, China in 2019, and since then has spread to over 216 countries including the United States. There are 1,267 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Wyoming as of July 3, 2020, and 103 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Teton County as of July 3, 2020, and 106 individuals quarantined for COVID-19 in Teton County as of July 3, 2020, as well as the presence of community spread in Wyoming and Teton County. It is expected that more cases will be diagnosed; and WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared CO-VID-19 a worldwide pandemic as of March 11, 2020; and WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency concerning the coronavirus, specifically stating that, "the spread of COVID-19 within our Nation's communities threatens to strain our Nation's healthcare systems [...] Additional measures [...] are needed to successfully contain and combat the virus in the

WHEREAS, although most individuals who contract CO-VID-19 do not become seriously ill, people with mild symptoms, and even asymptomatic persons with COVID-19, place other vulnerable members of the public at significant risk; and

WHEREAS, a large number of persons with serious infections can compromise the ability of the healthcare system in Teton County to deliver the necessary healthcare to the public; and

WHEREAS, Teton County, Wyoming is a tourist destination and other mountain resort communities in the Rocky Mountain region have been nuclei of infection in their respective states, including Vail, CO; Park City, UT and Sun Valley/ Ketchum, ID; and

WHEREAS, Teton County is experiencing increasing numbers of visitors from outside Teton County who can potentially transmit COVID-19 and at the same time will be more likely to interact with each other and with local residents as businesses, tourist destinations such as National Parks, and other services reopen; and

WHEREAS, Teton County Hospital District routinely serves patients not only from within Teton County but also many tourists and residents from Lincoln County, WY, Sublette County, WY, Fremont County, WY, and parts of Eastern Idaho who will further stress its capacity, making it critical that Teton County take steps to slow the spread of COVID-19 infection so as not to overwhelm the local healthcare system; and WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a respiratory illness, transmitted through person-to-person contact or by contact with surfaces contaminated with the virus. Persons infected with COVID-19 may become symptomatic two to fourteen days after exposure; and

WHEREAS, asymptomatic (including pre-symptomatic) infected individuals are infectious and without mitigation, the current estimate is that 40%-80% of infections occur from individuals without symptoms. In a study carried out in an isolated village of approximately 3000 people in northern Italy, it was shown that 50–75% of people with positive pharyngeal molecular tests were totally asymptomatic. This finding was confirmed by a more recent evaluation carried out in China, where to avoid a new outbreak of new coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), all the people arriving from overseas were rigorously tested. It was found that among patients with newly identified infections, 78% were asymptomatic. Universal screening of asymptomatic SARS-COV2 in women admitted for delivery in New York City shows that 13.7% were infected, and that asymptomatic women accounted for 88% of infected individuals in the study. Of individuals who do become symptomatic, viral loads are the highest in the pre-symptomatic and early symptomatic phase, decreasing thereafter; and WHEREAS, respiratory droplets from infected individuals are a major mode of SARS-CoV-2 transmission. This understand-

a major mode of SARS-COV-2 transmission. This understanding is the basis of the recommendations for physical distancing, and of the PPE guidance for healthcare workers. Droplets do not only come from coughing or sneezing: in a-/pre-symptomatic individuals, droplets are generated via talking and breathing; and

WHEREAS, SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, may be broadcast in respiratory droplets "from normal breathing," according to a letter by a committee of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine. The letter, sent to the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy on April 1, cites numerous studies indicating the presence of coronavirus in aerosols. In one, air samples collected more than 6 feet from two patients in COVID-19 isolation rooms tested positive for SARS-CoV-2 RNA. Until some weeks ago, it was thought that the virus could be transmitted mainly by droplets that are coughed or sneezed out or by previously contaminated objects, with differences according to the initial load and surface characteristics. However, the results of some submitted but not yet peer-reviewed studies seem to indicate the opposite, i.e., the virus can be present in exhaled air produced by talking and breathing; and

WHEREAS, face coverings reduce droplet dispersal. Clothbased coverings reduce emission of particles by variable amounts, for example one study showed that they are almost completely eliminated. Patients with seasonal coronaviruses (other than SARS-CoV-2) were randomized to exhale breath with or without surgical face masks on. Viral RNA was detected in 40% of aerosols and 30% of respiratory droplets collected from participants without a face mask — but in none collected from those wearing a mask (30). A second study showed that cloth coverings filtered viral particles during coughing at about 50 to 100% of the filtration efficiency of surgical masks, depending on fabric, with absolute filtration efficiencies of 50-70%. A third study showed 50% filtering efficiency for airborne particles; and

WHEREAS, evidence indicates that face covering wearing reduces the transmissibility per contact by reducing transmission of infected droplets in both laboratory and clinical contexts. Public face covering wearing is most effective at stopping spread of the virus when compliance is high. This evider supports the conclusion that more widespread face covering adoption can help to control the Covid-19 epidemic by reducing the shedding of droplets into the environment from asymptomatic individuals. This is also consistent with the experiences of other countries that have adopted this strategy. One ecological analysis found that, "in countries with cultural norms or government policies supporting public mask-wearing, per-capita coronavirus mortality increased on average by just 5.4% each week, as compared with 48% each week countries that did not wear masks."; and WHEREAS, in the most comprehensive, systematic review and meta-analysis of face coverings published to date found that face masks could reduce risk of transmission of COVID-19 by an expected 85 percent; and WHEREAS, guidelines published by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) on April 3, 2020, recommend that all people wear cloth face coverings in public settings where other physical distancing measures may be difficult to maintain. CDC also advises the use of simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others: and WHEREAS, decreased transmissibility due to face covering use could substantially reduce the death toll and economic impact while the cost of the intervention is low.

SECTION I. 1. Definitions.

a. "Face Covering," as used in this Ordinance, means a covering made of cloth, fabric, or other soft or permeable material, without holes, that covers the nose and mouth and surrounding areas of the lower face. A Face Covering may be factorymade or may be handmade and improvised from ordinary household materials. Face Coverings need to cover the nose and mouth in compliance with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's guidance on wearing Face Coverings.

b. "Place(s) of Business," as used in this Ordinance, means any facility, building, or structure operated by or for a business engaged in the sale or other transaction of any kind for anything of value in exchange for goods, commodities, services, or temporary lodging and that is open to the general public or by appointment, and includes, but is not limited to, grocery stores, retail stores, office buildings, restaurants and bars (including outdoor seating for such facilities), hotels and motels (excluding the rented room or suite), gyms and similar facilities; but not including religious or government facilities.

c. "School or School Districts" means any public, private, or charter school or institution that provides education ranging from daycare through college.

2. All persons within the Town of Jackson must wear a Face Covering in the following situations:

a. When they are inside or in line to enter any Place of Business; or

b. When they are obtaining services at healthcare operations, including, but not limited to, hospitals, clinics, and walk-in health facilities, dentists, pharmacies, other healthcare facilities, behavioral health providers, dental offices, and facilities providing veterinary and similar healthcare services for animals, unless directed otherwise by an owner or agent of the healthcare operation; or

c. When riding on public transportation or paratransit, or while they are the driver of or a passenger in a taxi, private car service, shuttle, tour or ride-sharing vehicle.

3. A Face Covering is not required under the following circumstances:

a. Any individual who cannot wear a face covering because of a medical condition, mental health condition or developmental disability, and any individual who should not wear face coverings under the CDC guidance. A person is not required to provide documentation demonstrating that the person cannot medically tolerate wearing a Face Covering. Persons with disabilities who are unable to wear a mask must be provided reasonable accommodations per the Americans with Disabilities Act.

b. Individuals under 6 years of age.

c. When a person is seated at a table or the bar of a restaurant or other food service venue.

d. When actively exercising in a gym in accordance with State Health Orders, as amended.

e. School individuals (including students, administrators, and teachers) on or in School or School District facilities.

f. When an individual is in his or her work office.
g. Individuals while acting in their official capacity as a public safety employee or emergency responder. These include peace officers, firefighters, and other public safety or emergency medical personnel that support public safety operations.
h. Individuals complying with the directions of public safety employees or emergency responders as described in Section 3(g).

SECTION II.

The provisions of this Ordinance are effective through 11:59 p.m. on July 20, 2020 unless sooner repealed, after which time they shall become null and void.

SECTION III.

If any section, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance.

SECTION IV.

Adoption of this Ordinance shall be by emergency ordinance provisions under suspension of rules and approved by not less than three quarters (3/4) of the qualified members of the governing body as required and set forth in Section § 15-1-115 of the Wyoming Statutes. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon proclamation by the Mayor.
