ORDINANCE 1457

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, BUSINESS LICENSES AND REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 5.04, BUSINESS LICENSES – GENERALLY; CHAPTER 5.06, COMMERCIAL AND NONCOMMERCIAL SOLICITATION; CHAPTER 5.20, INSTALLATION PERMIT – EXPOSITIONS AND OUTDOOR SALES, AND CHAPTER 5.22, PERFORMERS OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING:

SECTION I. Section 5.04.015, Definitions, of Chapter 5.04, Business Licenses – Generally of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming is hereby amended as follows:

5.04.015 - Definitions.

...

B. Business includes all and every kind of lawful Business, trade, calling, profession, or occupation.

...

SECTION II. Section 5.04.027, Applications – Initial and renewal, of Chapter 5.04, Business Licenses – Generally, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.04.027 - Applications – Initial and renewal.

...

E. There shall be no pro-rated reduction of an annual fee based on the time of year when a license or permit is renewed.

...

SECTION III. Section 5.04.110, Merchandise sales from public property, of Chapter 5.04, Business Licenses – Generally, of Title 5, Business Licenses and Regulations, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.04.110 - Merchandise sales from public property.

No person shall place upon or cause to be placed upon any right-of-way in the limits of the Town any goods, wares, or merchandise, for sale, to solicit business, or for show, nor suspend the same within or above any right-of-way, except where the same may be temporarily permitted and licensed from time to time by Town Council. This section shall not apply to a Performer displaying or offering for sale the Performer's own artistic works when such works are a part of, or directly related to a Performance as defined in 5.22, as amended.

SECTION IV. Section 5.04.130, Denial, revocation and suspension, of Chapter 5.04, Business Licenses – Generally, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.04.130 - Denial, revocation and suspension.

...

B. When the Town Manager, or their designee, deems that a license or permit issued hereunder shall be denied, suspended, or revoked, the procedure shall be as follows:

1. The licensee or permittee shall be notified by the Town Manager, or their designee, in writing, via certified mail; for a denial, such notice shall be sent contemporaneously with the denial, and for a suspension or revocation, such notice shall be sent at minimum 21 days prior to the effective date of the suspension or revocation and shall state the effective date of the suspension or revocation; and such notices shall include the reasons for the denial, suspension or revocation.

2. Upon receipt of the notice, the licensee or permit holder may request a hearing before the Town Council. Such request shall be in writing and must be received by the Town Manager, or their designee, within 21 days of the postal date of the denial, suspension, or revocation notice; failure on the part of the licensee or permittee to request a hearing in writing and within the specified time period shall be deemed a waiver of their right to a hearing.

3. If a hearing is requested by the licensee or permittee, the Town Manager, or their designee, shall set the time, date, and location of the hearing, within 45 days of receipt of the notice requesting such. The Town Manager, or their designee, shall notify the licensee or permittee in writing, via certified mail, of the hearing, which notice shall also provide that any suspension or revocation of a license shall be stayed until after the hearing.

4. ...

5. The Town Manager, or their designee, shall notify the licensee or permittee in writing, by certified mail, of the Town Council decision as the result of the hearing.

SECTION V. Section 5.06, Commercial and Non-Commercial Solicitation, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 5.06 CANVASSING AND SOLICITATION

5.06.110 Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this chapter:

As used in this Chapter, the following words have the meanings indicated:

A. Canvasser means a person who attempts to make personal contact with a person in the Town without prior specific invitation or appointment, for the noncommercial primary purpose of:

1. Attempting to enlist support for or against a particular religion, philosophy, ideology, political party, issue or candidate, even if incidental to such purpose the canvasser accepts the donation of money for or against such cause.

2. Attempting to obtain a donation to a particular patriotic, philanthropic, social service, welfare, benevolent, educational, civic, fraternal, charitable, political or religious purpose, even if incidental to such purpose there is the sale of some good or service.

B. Knowingly means with respect to the conduct or circumstance described in this Section that a person is aware that such person's conduct is of that nature or that the circumstances exist. With respect to the result of such conduct, this means that a person is aware that such person's conduct is practically certain to cause the result.

C. Obscene means patently offensive description of ultimate sexual acts or solicitation to commit ultimate sexual acts, whether or not said ultimate sexual acts are normal or perverted, actual or simulated.

D. Obstruct means any act or conduct which opposes, obstructs, prevents or attempts to prevent, interferes with, hinders or impedes the actions of another.

E. Panhandle means to knowingly approach, accost, stop, or make a request of another person in a public place and solicit that person, whether by spoken words, bodily gesture, written signs or other means, for a gift of money or thing of value. It does not mean to passively stand or sit with a sign or other indication that one is seeking donations without addressing any solicitation to any specific person, other than in response to an inquiry by that person.

F. Residence means a private Residence in the Town, including, but not limited to, condominium units and apartments, and shall include the yards, grounds or hallways, thereof.

G. Solicitor means a person who attempts to make personal contact with a person at their residence without prior specific invitation or appointment from the resident, for the primary purpose of attempting to sell a good or service, whether or not the goods or services are actually delivered at the time of sale. (Ord. 1457 § V, 2026; Ord. 1281 § 1, 2021).

5.06.120 Prohibited solicitation.

A. The occupant(s) of Residences in the Town shall make the determination of whether Canvassers or Solicitors shall be, or shall not be, invited to their Residence.

B. No person may engage in solicitation or canvassing at any Residence if the Residence prominently displays a notice stating, “No Solicitors” or “No Solicitation” on or near the main entrance or door to the Residence. This applies equally to all Solicitors and Canvassers, regardless of the message or product.

C. No person may remove any sign, notice, or sticker that gives notice to visitors that the occupant of the Residence does not invite solicitors or canvassers.

D. No person may obstruct traffic on a sidewalk, pathway, street, or bike lane by walking, standing, sitting, lying, or placing an object in such a manner as to block passage by another person or to require that other person to take evasive action to avoid physical contact (whether the other person is walking, biking, driving, or operating another type of lawful device).

E. No person, business, or other entity may attract or attempt to attract people to a place of business by calling, shouting, hawking, ringing any bells, horn, sounding any siren or other noisemaking device, or by waving, hailing, or otherwise signaling to passersby, or by touching or physically detaining them. 5.06.130 Solicitation license required.

No person shall act as a Solicitor within the Town without first getting a license from the Town in accordance with this Chapter.

5.06.140 No license required for Canvassers.

Canvassers are not required to get licensed but may do so for the purpose of reassuring Town residents of the Canvasser's good faith.

5.06.145 Panhandling

It shall be unlawful for any person to Panhandle if such panhandling occurs:

A. In a manner that involves knowingly engaging in conduct toward the person solicited that is intimidating, threatening, coercive, or obscene and that causes the person solicited to reasonably fear for their safety;

B. In a manner that involves the person panhandling knowingly directing fighting word, profane, or abusive language to the person solicited and that causes the person solicited to reasonably fear for their safety;

C. In a manner that involves the person panhandling knowingly touching, grabbing or causing physical contact without the person's consent in the course of soliciting; or

D. On a sidewalk or other public passageway in a manner that blocks, obstructs, or interferes with the safe or free passage of the person solicited or that requires the person solicited to take evasive action to avoid physical contact with the person panhandling.

5.06.150 Solicitation, Canvassing, and Panhandling on a highway or street.

Regardless of the purpose or content of the solicitation, canvassing, or panhandling and solely to ensure public safety, no person shall stand on a highway or street for the purpose of solicitation, canvassing, or panhandling except:

A. The person is 16 years of age or older wearing a high visibility vest; and

B. The person is standing in a location that is safe for the individual and for motorists, taking into account the orderly flow of traffic and lack of interference with the operation of official traffic control devices; and

C. It is between 30 minutes after sunrise to 30 minutes before sunset.

5.06.170 Constitutional rights.

Nothing in this chapter shall be interpreted or enforced to deprive any person of any rights guaranteed under the constitutions of the State of Wyoming and the United States.

SECTION VI. Section 5.20.020, Expositions and outdoor sales, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.20.020 - Expositions and outdoor sales.

A. Except those holding a general business license pursuant to this Code, any person engaged in the business of conducting an exposition, exhibit, or sale of any merchandise or product at an outdoor or indoor event, where one or more persons or Businesses gather together for such purpose, shall obtain an Exposition License prior to the event.

1. The applicant shall:

a. Submit an application pursuant to Chapter 5.04.27 at least twenty days prior to the event.

b. Limit their event(s) to no more than 15 days per calendar year, which may or may not be consecutive. No Person or Business may exceed the 15-day annual maximum regardless of how many exposition licenses are obtained.

c. Notify each participant in writing, prior to accepting any application or approving participation in the event, that the participant is responsible for submitting the following on or before the 21st day of the month following the event:

i. A report of total sales to be delivered to the organization; and

ii. A check, payable to the Wyoming Department of Revenue, for the sales tax percentage required under the guidelines as specified by the Wyoming Department of Revenue.

d. Be responsible for ensuring that all sales tax receipts are remitted to the Wyoming Department of Revenue and in no event later than the 30th day of the month following the event.

e. Acquire and keep on file names, addresses and phone numbers of all participants.

A. Fees. Fees for Exposition Licenses are hereby established and shall be in an amount set by resolution.

1. If no less than 90% of the participating vendors are non-profit entities the fee shall be the nonprofit fee set forth in resolution if the applicant provides proof of the nonprofit status of the participating vendors in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

2. If more than 10% of the vendors participating in an event are for-profit entities, the fee shall be the for-profit fee set forth in resolution.

SECTION VII. Section 5.22.030, Cooperative Performances; limit on number of street Performers, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.22.030 – Cooperative Performances; limit on number of street Performers.

...

C. The provisions of this subsection shall not relieve any Performer in a cooperating street Performance from complying with the regulations contained in Section 5.22.040.

SECTION VIII. Section 5.22.040, Regulations, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

5.22.040 - Regulations.

...

K. Performers may accept voluntary contributions of money or property at their Performance in exchange for their artistic Performance Performers may sell their own artistic works connected to the Performance. Performers shall not sell any other goods, wares, or works of art, or conduct any other service on public property in connection with a Performance. It is unlawful for a Performer to charge a fee for a Performance. For purposes of this Section, the charging of a fee for a Performance includes the act of requiring a person to pay for the Performance, whether in advance or after the fact, but does not include the act of soliciting or requesting voluntary tips or donations, the act of making available a receptacle for tips or donations, or the act of receiving voluntary tips or donations.

ORDINANCE 1458

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9.52, INJURY TO OR DESTRUCTION OF PUBLIC PROPERTY, OF TITLE 9, PUBLIC PEACE, MORALS AND WELFARE, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING:

SECTION I. Section 9.52.050, Definitions, of Chapter 9.52, Injury to or Destruction of Property, of Title 9, Public Peace, Morals and Welfare, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

A. Public Property means any personal or real property or other asset(s) owned, maintained, or controlled by governmental entities on behalf of the public within the Town, and includes, but is not limited to, any building, railing, bench, sign, notice, placard, monument, stake, post, boundary marker, wall or rock border, structure, equipment, facilities, or appurtenances thereof, or any park, playground, sidewalk, road, street, alley, way, curb, vacant lot, undeveloped tract, or any part of any public right-of-way, including those devoted to any planting or park-like use.

SECTION II. Section 9.52.060, Unlawful acts on and against public property, of Chapter 9.52, Injury to or Destruction of Property, of Title 9, Public Peace, Morals and Welfare, of the Code of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, is hereby amended as follows:

A. It is unlawful for any person to knowingly or without authority do any of the following acts:

1. Deface, injure, interfere, tamper with, remove, displace, disfigure, cut, write-on, mark, paint, sticker, or destroy any Public Property. .

2. Fail to cooperate in maintaining in a neat and sanitary condition any public restrooms or washrooms.

3. Dig or remove any sand, soil, rock, stones, trees, shrubs, or plants, down timber or other wood or materials, or make any

excavation by tool, equipment, blasting, or other means on Public Property.

4. Construct or erect any building, tent, fly, windbreak, or structure of whatever kind, whether permanent or temporary in character, or run or string any rope, cord, or wire into, upon, or across, any Public Property, except with a permit issued by the Town.

5. Urinate or defecate on Public Property, except in a public restroom.

6. Damage, cut, carve, burn, transplant, or remove any tree or plant, injure the bark of any tree, or pick the flowers or seeds of any tree or plant on Public Property. No person shall dig or otherwise disturb, or in any other way injure or impair the natural beauty or usefulness of any public park area. Nor shall any person attach any rope, wire, or other contrivance to any tree or plant, with the exception that slacklining is allowed in Town parks, other than Miller Park and George Washington Park (Town Square), subject to the following rules and guidelines:

a. In the event metal poles have been placed in a Town park, slacklines shall be attached to the metal poles and not attached to trees;

b. In the event metal poles are unavailable in a Town park, slacklines shall only be attached to trees greater than 12 inches in diameter;

c. Slacklines shall be secured utilizing proper tree protection with no wire cables directly in contact with the tree;

d. Slacklines shall be completely removed when not in use;

e. Slacklines shall not be left unattended; and,

f. Slacklines shall be placed to not interfere with pedestrian traffic or other park use

7. Climb any tree, or climb, walk, stand, or sit upon monuments, fountains, railings, fences, planted areas, or upon any other Public Property not designed or customarily used for such purposes.

8. Stand, sit, or lie in or upon any street, sidewalk, stairway, or crosswalk so as to prevent free passage of persons or Vehicles passing over, along or across any street, alley, public way, sidewalk, stairway or crosswalk.

9. Drop, throw, place, discard, dump, leave, or otherwise deposit any bottles, broken glass, garbage, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, refuse, or other trash on Public Property, except in waste containers provided therefor. No such refuse or trash shall be placed in any waters in or contiguous to any park, or planted area, or left anywhere on the grounds thereof.

10. Offer for sale or for show any goods or merchandise, or place any stand, cart, or vehicle for the transportation, sale, solicitation of business, or display of any such goods or merchandise on Public Property, without first obtaining an appropriate license or permit.

11. Paste, glue, tack, or otherwise post any sign, placard, advertisement, or inscription, or erect or cause to be erected any sign whatever on any Public Property. .

The Skyline Ranch Improvement and Service District (SRISD), Teton County, Wyoming, will conduct a Public Meeting at 4:00 p.m. local time on May 21, 2026, at the Mountain Property Management conference room, located at 250 Veronica Lane, Jackson, Wyoming. Virtual attendance will also be available via Zoom at: <https://us04web.zoom.us/join>, Meeting ID: 301 092 4055.

The purpose of the meeting is to provide an opportunity for citizens to review and comment on the Skyline Ranch ISD Phase I – Water Supply Project. The project includes expanding water supply capacity through improvements and/or completion of three (3) existing wells; construction of a well house for electrical and control equipment; installation of new primary and standby power supplies for well and existing storage facilities; implementation of new water system controls and metering devices; improvements to the existing pressure tank and associated piping; installation of a disinfection system; and related appurtenances.

At the meeting, the SRISD will present the design of the proposed project and discuss recent bidding results, as well as the need for additional funding to complete the improvements. Based on the current bids received, the project is facing a funding shortfall of \$1,320,000. SRISD intends to borrow additional funds and/or increase its existing loan to finance the project, resulting in a total anticipated loan amount of \$2,275,000 through the Wyoming Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund, administered by the Wyoming Office of State Lands and Investments. A prior loan in the amount of \$955,000 was approved by the Wyoming State Loan and Investment Board on November 20, 2024.

SRISD anticipates an increase in user fees, assessments, or a combination of both as a result of this project. The proposed loan terms include an estimated 1% interest rate with a 20-year repayment period. The projected annual increase for each lot owner within the District is approximately \$870 attributable to this loan increase, for a total estimated annual obligation of \$1,401 per lot considering the full loan amount.

Bureau of Reclamation – Annual Operations Meeting

The Bureau of Reclamation will hold its annual operations meeting to share updated information on the upper Snake River basin. Topics include runoff forecasts, water supply outlook, projected operations for Jackson Lake Dam and other reservoirs, river flow management, and current snowpack conditions.

Date: Thursday, May 14, 2026

Time: 1:30–3:30 p.m. Mountain Time

Location: Teton County Library, Ordway Auditorium,
125 Virginian Lane, Jackson, Wyoming
(A virtual attendance option is available. Details are provided below.)

Representatives from the National Weather Service, the Natural Resources Conservation Service, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will join Reclamation to present hydrologic and operational updates.

The runoff forecast for the Snake River near Heise, Idaho, is 70 percent of average. Jackson Lake is at 79 percent of capacity and is expected to reach near full pool in late May (elevation 6,769 feet). High irrigation demand is anticipated this summer. By fall, lake levels may decline to about 15 percent full (elevation 6,737 feet).

Year-to-date water precipitation in the Snake River headwaters above Heise is 101 percent of average. Snowpack in the same area is 57 percent of average.

Given current snowpack conditions, the potential for flooding along the Snake River in Teton County is low. This assessment considers possible Jackson Lake Dam releases and downstream tributary inflows. Tributaries may still experience high flows during snowmelt, and caution is advised. Flood operations are coordinated jointly by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Reclamation, and flood potential will be discussed during the meeting.

Jackson Lake Dam, part of the Minidoka Project, is located on the Snake River within Grand Teton National Park near Moran, Wyoming. The dam was built in 1911, and components were replaced in 1989 under the Safety of Dams Act. Current river and reservoir data are available at: <https://www.usbr.gov/pn/hydromet/upp snakes/>.
