

Competitive Examination and Certified List of Eligibility for the Position of Firefighter/EMT-Basic In the Martinsburg Fire Department Individuals that successfully satisfy all the requirements will remain on a list of eligible candidates for a period of three years in the event an opening does occur.



The starting pay for Firefighter/EMT-Basic is \$50,000 + \$4,254 mandatory OT for a total of \$54,245. Employees of the City of Martinsburg are offered a range of fringe benefits including; vacation leave, sick leave, personal leave, health/life/vision and dental insurance benefits, longevity pay and fire pension plan, all of which the Firefighter is entitled to. The City of Martinsburg reserves the right to amend date and/or location to remain in compliance with any COVID-19 guidelines in effect at the time of testing. New hires that possess a current EMT Paramedic through the West Virginia Office of Emergency Services or are certified elsewhere as an EMT-Paramedic and are able to obtain legal recognition as an EMT-Paramedic by the WV Office of Emergency Medical Services within ninety (90) days of first date of employment will receive a \$10,000 sign-on bonus, with new hires being required to sign a minimum of two-year commitment with the City. Beginning salary for paramedics is \$55,125 + \$4,680 (OT) = \$59,805 plus \$500 per year of certification up to 10 years (\$5,000).

Contact Your Local CASA

Becoming a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) begins with contacted your local CASA organization. The criteria typically include certain qualifications and background clearances. Once you have confirmed eligibility, the next step involves completing mandatory training sessions provided by the CASA program. This training equips volunteers with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively advocate for children in the court

Applying Locally

Next, you'll need to apply to your local CASA program. This application serves as your formal intent in becoming a CASA volunteer. Following the submission of your application, you may be invited for an interview with CASA program staff. Upon acceptance into the CASA program, you will embark on a journey of ongoing learning and engagement. This includes attending additional training sessions and observing court proceedings to familiarize yourself with

As a CASA volunteer, your primary duty is to advocate for the best interests of the child assigned to you by the court, providing a voice for their needs and concerns throughout the legal proceedings.
