Health and Safety Protocols



### **Health and Safety Protocols**

Phased-in re-entry plan builds on experience

#### Masking and social distancing

Hand hygiene and hand washing

Reducing the # of people in the building and classrooms

Detailed school schedules and grouping to limit exposure Additional PPE for staff supporting students with special needs Training and monitoring of mitigation strategies

Contract tracing in collaboration with public health

Communications protocols for cases, clusters Protocols for return to work or school Data transparency – Dashboards and communication protocols Cleaning and sanitizing, multiple other mitigation strategies

### **Re-Entry Health and Safety**

- Gradual entry to date with PreK, elementary and public separate schools, K-12 self-contained classes, certified nursing assistant practicums = more than 20,000 students
- Only one situation with 5 or more cases epidemiologically linked together since school re-entry in November (e.g. a "cluster")
- Students and staff at elementary schools, public separate and in self-contained classes are consistently following masking, social distancing, hand hygiene and cohorting protocols
- GCS data supports that schools are not contributing to community spread and that there is limited secondary transmission in schools
- What is happening outside of school and athletics is contributing to increased positivity rates

#### 73.5% of K-5 students are currently learning in-person.

### **Device Distribution**

- Currently distributing 8,000 Chromebooks to students in grades 4-12 without devices
- 14,000 additional Chromebooks are scheduled to arrive this week and will be distributed to high school students
- 25,000 additional Chromebooks are scheduled to arrive by February
- K-3 students have received iPad devices

### **Timeline and Preparations**

- January 21: Proposed gradual re-entry for middle and high school students following either a Monday/Tuesday or a Thursday/Friday schedule
- Middle and High Schools have modified schedules to reduce transitions to meet social distancing and health protocols
- Middle and High school students receive 2 days of face-to-face instruction, 3 days of remote instruction each week
- Wednesday is a remote learning day between student cohorts at the secondary level
- Vulnerable students attend 4 days each week





Mitigating Learning Loss



# **Tutoring**

- Partnering with local universities to provide tutoring in core subject areas
- Prioritizing at-risk students for tutoring services
- Recruiting GCS students who meet academic criteria to serve as tutors for \$10 an hour and elective course credit
- Providing graduate assistantship experiences for graduate students to serve as tutors
- Creating opportunities for certified teachers to serve as tutors for at-risk high school students in learning hubs



# **Learning Hubs**

- 4 days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday)
- Targeting 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students at risk of not graduating
- 15 traditional high schools
- Transportation and Meals provided
- Integration with mental health services and opportunities through arts programs
- Flexible hours based on student need
