

## Two Games at Coliseum

# Light Schedule for Cagers

Local gourmets of high school basketball face the skimpiest menu of the season tonight, with only three games set for Forsyth County.

Atkins meets North Forsyth in the first game of a Coliseum doubleheader, and East Forsyth plays West Forsyth in the nightcap. Reynolds is host to Parkland in another Central 4-A Group II game.

Mount Tabor visits Madison-Mayodan in an important Western 3-A game, and Children's Home closes out the season at Greensboro Curry. Anderson, Carver and Bishop McGuinness have the night off.

Atkins can clinch a tie for the conference title with a victory, and the loser of the Reynolds-Parkland game will be eliminated from the race.

Since Atkins is 17-0 for the season and holds a 91-49 victory over North to its credit, the Camels will be heavily favored to win. West Forsyth rallied to defeat East, 74-63, in their first meeting, and is a slight favorite tonight.

The Reynolds-Parkland game shapes up as a toss-up. Parkland had a 12-point lead in

the third quarter of their first meeting, but Reynolds rallied and won a 57-51 victory.

Mount Tabor can tie Madison-Mayodan for second place in the Western 3-A District 5 with a victory tonight. The Spartans won the first meeting in an upset, 61-59. League-leading Reidsville faces Mount Airy tonight, and can clinch the title with a win.

The North Central Conference title will be on the line when Stoneville visits

Wentworth tonight. Stoneville leads with a 7-0 record, and Wentworth is 6-1. Starmount can clinch the Northwest 3-A title by beating East Surry tonight at Pilot Mountain.

Davie County moved into sole possession of first place in the North Piedmont Conference Tuesday by beating North Rowan, 73-71. James Ijames

scored 28 points for Davie County.

Salisbury Boyden can knock Albemarle out of the South Piedmont Conference race with a win tonight at Salisbury. Undefeated Randleman, which has already clinched the Central Carolina Conference crown, is host to second-place Western Guilford tonight.
