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#### Methodology:

This NBC News Decision Desk Poll was <u>powered by SurveyMonkey</u>, the fast, intuitive feedback management platform where 20 million questions are answered daily. It was conducted online November 20, 2025 through December 8, 2025 among a national sample of 20,252 adults aged 18 and over. Reported percentages exclude item non-response and round to the nearest percentage point. Respondents were selected from the more than two million people who take surveys on SurveyMonkey each day.

Weighting was done in a two step process. Each generation (18-29,30-44,45-64, 65+) was weighted to population totals for race, sex, census region, education, and an estimate of 2024 presidential vote. The full sample was then combined and weighted to reflect each generation's true proportion in the adult population, where 18-29 year olds make up 20%, 30-44 year olds make up 26%, 45-64 year olds make up 31% and 65 year olds and above make up 24%.

Two data quality checks were used to verify quality respondents: the time it takes to complete the survey and the successful completion of an attention check question. Respondents who took less than 3 minutes or longer than 20 minutes to complete the survey were removed. Respondents who answered the attention check question incorrectly were also removed.

The valid sample after removing respondents who failed data quality checks and those without a weight is 20,252 adults.

The estimated margin of error for this survey among all adults is plus or minus 1.9 percent. To calculate a margin of error we used a method that attempts to capture the uncertainty due to sampling as well as through the need to weight the sample to match population targets. Specifically, the reported margin of error is equal to the square root of the design effect of the survey weights multiplied by the traditional margin of error based on the sample size. When looking at the difference between two percentages, like when calculating the margin between two survey waves, this margin of error is doubled. While this margin of error tries to capture the error due to sampling and weighting, other sources of error are possible.
