Opelousas, **LA** – The Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) has released the latest school and district performance scores.

While the St. Landry Parish School District scores indicate a slight dip in its overall score, moving from 72.9 to 72.1 (a decrease of 0.8 points), we are happy to report on the success of individual schools and the dedicated work happening in the district, schools, and classrooms every day.

 Top Gains Schools: Eleven of our schools earned the designation of "Top Gains School," recognizing them for demonstrating growth by meeting or exceeding learning goals set by the Louisiana Department of Education. These schools are: Arnaudville Middle, Cankton Elementary, Creswell Middle, East Elementary, Eunice Jr. High, Grand Coteau Elementary, Grand Prairie Elementary, Grolee Elementary, Krotz Springs Elementary, Magnet Academy for Cultural Arts, and Palmetto Elementary. Opportunity Honoree: One school was recognized as an "Opportunity Honoree," signifying its
exceptional work in closing achievement gaps and serving all students. That school is Magnet
Academy for Cultural Arts.
