THE GRAND JURY CHARGES:

At all times material to this Indictment, E.H. was engaged in illegal distribution of controlled substances, in interstate and foreign commerce, and an activity that affects interstate and foreign commerce.

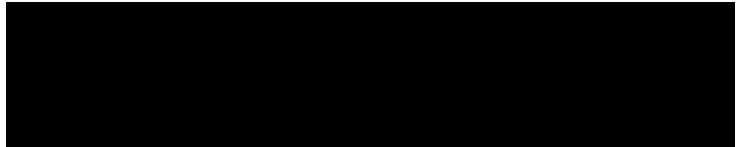
On or about May 5, 2026, in the Western District of Texas, the Defendants,

**COLTON CARTER,
DONIVAN BYNUM,
DAVIER GREEN,
and
MANYIAH MOORE,**

did conspire, confederate and agree together and with each other, to unlawfully obstruct, delay, and affect commerce, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(b)(3), and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, by robbery, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(b)(1), and by committing physical violence and threatening to commit physical violence in furtherance of this plan and purpose, in that the Defendants did unlawfully take and obtain and attempt to take and obtain property consisting of

controlled substances, to-wit: vape cartridges containing Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), a Schedule I Controlled Substance, from the person of and in the presence of E.H., against E.H.'s will by means of actual and threatened force, violence and fear of immediate and future injury to E.H.'s person, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).
