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
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If you find an auto body shop that is trustworthy and dependable, it will ensure that your car, truck, SUV or minivan is repaired quickly, affordably and correctly.

If you're thinking about purchasing a new handgun, you'll need to first consider how you intend to use the firearm.

And you'll want to take your time in selecting your new firearm, whether you're a seasoned collector or new to firearm culture.

SIZE AND CALIBER

It's a good idea to visit gun shops in order to get a feel for the type of handgun you'd be most comfortable carrying.

Size is going to be a big factor. Large framed pistols are fine if you aren't planning on carrying the gun on your body. These weapons hold more ammunition in the magazine and will manage the recoil better.

Smaller pistols are excellent choices for carrying concealed. It might have stronger recoil because it is a lighter weight. Most concealed carry guns are specifically designed to use at close range and remain hidden when not in use.

Larger caliber weapons will create more damage on your target. Smaller calibers are excellent choices for novices.

OTHER THINGS **TO CONSIDER**

You should also consider whether you're more comfortable carrying a semi-automatic handgun or a revolver. Semi-automatics are more modern and usually come in smaller calibers, known as "auto calibers." Since they are typically magazine-fed, semi-automatics are more complicated than revolvers. They can be slightly more difficult to clean and operate, but they are fast to fire and easy to reload.

On the other hand, revolvers are simpler and more traditional. They have been around a lot longer. There are a wider range of calibers and they are easier to clean, but the firing speed and reload time is significantly reduced. Revolvers are great options for beginners, though some automatics are just as good.

Point-and-shoot accuracy is more important than sighted accuracy in an emergency situation. In self-defense situations, you're usually firing fast and instinctively.

WARNINGS

You should be able to operate your weapon easily. Learn how to switch the safety on and off before you attempt to use it. You should also know how to load and fire the gun.

Spend plenty of time with your weapon at a firing range. Become familiar with its limitations. Take classes that match your level of experience.

Responsible gun ownership starts

with gun safety. Never leave your pistol where children can get to it. Handle your weapon in a manner that is safe for you and those around you. Always treat it as though it is loaded, and never point it at anyone you don't intend to shoot.

How to Choose a CHIMNEY **PROFESSIONAL**

A dirty chimney isn't just unpleasant; it's unsafe. Did you know that a chimney clogged by soot and creosote can catch your house on fire? A stopped-up chimney also can obstruct ventilation and force poisonous carbon monoxide gas back into your home.

In short, a dirty chimney can cost you your life. But you can prevent a worst-case scenario simply by finding a professional trained to inspect and, if necessary, clean your chimney.

A chimney maintenance professional, or chimney sweep, can be the difference between the continued enjoyment of your fireplace and disaster.

If you're in need of a chimney maintenance professional, consider these tips.

CLEANING FREQUENCY

There are two separate guidelines used to determine how often you should have your chimney cleaned.

First, there's the National Fire Protection Agency, whose standards recommend that "chimneys, fireplaces and vents shall be inspected at least once a year for soundness, freedom from deposits and correct clearances. Cleaning, maintenance and repairs shall be done if necessary."

Inspecting your chimney each year may be ideal, but not every homeowner will do it. Unfortunately, few probably will. This can expose them to ongoing risk for fire and other safety hazards.

There is a second guideline that may help homeowners remember to bring in a chimney sweep on an as-needed basis. The Chimney Safety Institute of America advises that a chimney needs to be cleaned when there is 1/8 inch of sooty buildup. It should also be swept whenever "there is any glaze present in the system," according to the institute.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

Finding the right chimney maintenance professional is a lot like selecting any other type of professional to

work on your home. You want to pick someone who is experienced, knowledgeable, capable and great at serving their customers - but that type of professional isn't always easy to find.

Ask your friends, family and acquaintances for references. If any your friends family or co-workers have used chimney maintenance providers in the past, ask what they thought about the services they provided. Did they do a thorough job? Did they keep their work space neat and tidy, cleaning up any messes? Did they charge a reasonable price and show up on time to do the job?

You could also look for complaints and feedback from the Better Business Bureau or consumer-oriented websites. And you could ask the chimney cleaner if they have any certifications or current testimonials from happy customers.

INSURANCE

Something you always should do before you hire anyone to work at your house is to inquire about their insurance coverage.

Because most homeowner's insurance policies don't cover injuries or damage that occur from people working on your property, the individual or company you hire will need to carry their own coverage. Otherwise, without a proper insurance policy, you could find yourself personally liable for any injuries or damage that happen at your house.

You don't want to be on the hook for paying the bills if a chimney sweep hurts your property - or worse, hurts himself – while doing a job on your property. Always ask about insurance coverage and verify it, just to be safe.

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One of the best improvements you can make to your property is adding a fence to increase the level of privacy and security on your property.

If you're thinking about building a fence at your home, start by getting in touch with a quality fencing specialist.

Here's what you should look for:

EXPERIENCE

The first thing you should do when talking with a potential fence installer is ask about their background. While the length of time they have been in business is certainly a factor, so is the breadth of their experience in the industry.

In other words, you want to make sure their background matches the job you have in mind.

Another related factor is how well the fencing company knows your local market. Most cities have strict regulations that govern the materials, dimensions and locations of where fences are allowed to be installed. Finally, make sure you understand the process for undertaking any repairs that might be required on your fence. If you've already got an older fence in place, you should be able to get a quote for repairing it or replacing a portion of it, depending on your budget.

And if you're having a new fence installed, get a clear understanding of how any repairs or adjustments will be handled going forward. It's not uncommon for gates to need a little adjustment, for example, as they settle and are exposed to the elements in the coming months,

and good fencing companies will do those little repairs for free if they're needed for a certain period of time.

In the end, you should choose a fencing company that makes you feel comfortable as a homeowner. The best ones will have lots of positive recommendations and good-looking examples of their work all over town. VISIT THE GARDEN CENTERS

Once you have researched garden centers, visit two or three locations before making a final decision.

Talk to a sales person. Think of a problem you experienced in the past and ask them for a solution. The sales people should be knowledgeable about remedies. Note his or her demeanor and attitude.

Find out how long they have been in business and more about the owner. Good centers are usually in the same place, operated by the same people for a very long time.

Take a look at the plants. Do they look healthy? Are they well-maintained? Is there a decent variety?

Typically, plants grown in green houses are better quality. After all, they are produced to be grown in your area. Plants grown locally usually have fewer diseases. A plant may not appear diseased until you take it home.

Inquire about how the plants are produced. "Open pollinated" designates a seed or plant will reproduce itself purely if a seed is properly saved from the fruit of the plant. An organic seed or plant has

been produced without artificial or chemical pesticides.

Genetically modified plants are created by laboratory technology that manipulates the plant's genes. For example, instead of mixing two different kinds of corn to create one that is more resistant to diseases, they may combine genes from corn and a totally unrelated tomato plant. These modifications do not happen naturally in the breeding process.

Many people may be cautious about using genetically altered seeds and plants, but there are advantages to them. On commercial farms, this type of plant has plenty of assets over organic plants. In a backyard garden, however, genetically modified plants are usually not necessary.

When shopping at a garden center, understand the types of plants they offer. There should be a labeling system in place. If not, ask the staff for more information. Commercial crops are more likely to have genetic modification.

Once you've done your research and know what you want, head on over to your local garden center and get started improving your garden.

The breakdown of your heating or air conditioning system can be a huge nightmare - particularly during times of extreme temperature. Even in moderate weather, the HVAC system in your home is important to your comfort and safety. So, it's important to have a good HVAC company on standby.

The best HVAC contractors are helpful and reliable, but a poor contractor can cost you extra money and heartache. Good word of mouth will go a long way toward helping you find the best professionals in your area.

Create a list of candidates and search the Better Business Bureau (www.bbb.org), to check on their reputations. Avoid companies who have many complaints on their record. Upon narrowing the list, call the remaining ones and ask about pricing, guarantees and warranties. Also ask if they have a workmanship warranty and guarantee their work.

If you are purchasing new equipment, choosing the right HVAC contractor is vital to how efficient your unit will operate and how long the equipment will last. Company A may not have the same training

and quality procedures as Company B, meaning they could be installing the same exact equipment but Company A's system will last 10 years and constantly break down and Company B's will last 20 years with no hiccups. The best contractors register the equipment for you to ensure you get the full 10 years that you deserve. If your heat runs off Liquid Propane (L.P.) be sure that the contractor has been registered by the Railroad Commission of Texas. If they have not, then they do not legally have permission to install the system. Only a few local HVAC contractors have this authority and keep up with this.

Price should not be the most important factor when choosing the right HVAC Company and here's why, many times the "low bidder" is going to leave out extremely important objects in order to cut costs but these will almost certainly cost you much more in the future. Most systems being replaced are using R22 refrigerant which operates at about half of the pressure of the newer R410a refrigerant, this makes it highly important that the copper lines are changed during the process, you

wouldn't buy a brand new car and take the wheels off your 20 year old trade-in to put on the new car. Other essentials that need to be tended to when installing new equipment are being sure that the PVC condensate line is changed, a new sub-floor is installed, new thermostat and thermostat wire, and a new condenser pad.

High quality HVAC companies are fully licensed, bonded and insured. If a worker is injured or causes damage to your property, that insurance should cover it. Otherwise, you could be liable for the damages. Your insurance premiums would likely increase as a result. It is a good idea to ask for a copy of their Certificate of Insurance to verify.

Reputable HVAC companies will usually belong to recognized professional and trade organizations.

Some well-known organizations include Air Conditioning Contractors of America (ACCA) & North American Technician Excellence (NATE). Membership in one of these organizations is not automatic.

Applicants are required to have certain certifications, meet professional standards and meet or exceed other requirements before they are admitted.

Before any work begins, verify that all the required building permits are in place. Most companies will file permits on your behalf at the local building codes office. But don't assume that it has happened.

Work done without proper permits could result in a fine and time delay.

When sub-contractors are used, they should be under the umbrella of the head contracting company. If they are not, separate written contracts may be necessary. Review each sub-contractor just as you would the head contractor: check references, licensure and insurance coverage.

Ask if the technicians and installers are factory trained and if they regularly go to training to stay up to date with all of the new and changing technology. The Department of Energy warns that over 90% of HVAC systems are not properly charged with refrigerant, losing you anywhere from 30%-50% in efficiency, be sure that they have electronic gauges to properly charge your HVAC. A brand new unit that isn't charged correctly can take you from a 20 SEER unit to a 10 SEER unit.

The HVAC company shouldn't use the old unit to determine the

proper size of a new one. If your old unit was inadequate, you will want to install a unit that is a different size. Speak with your HVAC installer to determine the right size and model for you.





If your child is of speaking age, you can ask directly for his opinion of the daycare.



Nowadays, most women in modern America tend to birth in hospitals. But... have you ever considered a birth center or home birth? There are many misconceptions about these two locations, so let's get to the differences and facts.

One of the first things you may notice in each location is the environment. Each location is very distinct. The hospital system gives many women the "security" of being right near medical staff and equipment if their birth were to turn to an emergent situation. If you are looking for pain management intervention, continuous fetal monitoring, or are high risk, then this is probably the location you may consider. You will have all types of medical staff there ready for any situation. Your primary care provider in a hospital setting will usually be an obstetrician (OB/GYN) who is trained

in gynecology, birth, and surgery. In some hospital locations and depending on your medical history, your primary care provider may be a certified nurse midwife (CNM). A CNM in a hospital setting will serve women who are low risk and seeking lower intervention in their birth experience.

If you are low risk, seeking low to no intervention, and desire a natural, vaginal birth that is free from the setting of the hospital system, then a birth center or home birth setting may be for you. Your primary care provider in either of these settings will be either a certified nurse midwife (CNM) or certified professional midwife (CPM). Both of these care providers are highly trained in birth, women's health, and infant health. A CNM is able to serve women in a hospital, birth center, or home birth setting. A CPM is able to serve women in both a birth center or home birth setting. In all locations, you will be served by birth professionals highly trained to help you bring your sweet baby into the world.

If you are looking for an environment that is more like a home away from home setting, then a birth center is perfect for you. If you prefer to literally have the comfort of your own home, then the home birth setting is a perfect option also. In either a birth center setting or a homebirth, you will be free to be up and moving, to eat, and peacefully birth with the presence of a highly trained midwife. Her staff will usually consist of a birth assistant and sometimes a student midwife. If you are worried about what may happen if there is an emergency in an out of hospital setting, do not fear! They are trained to be ready to identify urgent situations that would require transfer care back to the hospital setting. They are also trained to handle emergency situations until you reach the hospital if you need more advanced intervention.

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How to Choose a **DERMATOLOGIST**

Don't pick a dermatologist at random. Spend plenty of time researching about skincare professionals in your area to get a good understanding of their specialties and track record with patients.

Here are a few things to consider:

SPECIALTY DERMATOLOGY

A dermatologist is a doctor who specializes in treating skin conditions, but their work can fall into many sub-specialties that may or may not match your health needs.

All certified dermatologists earn their medical degrees and undergo three more years of post-residency specialty training on helping patients with skin, hair and nails. Many dermatologists have general practices and are open to seeing patients with a wide variety of skin concerns, from acne and skin diseases to facial wrinkles.

Many other dermatologists, though, focus their attention and training on narrower aspects of dermatology such as cosmetics, surgery or conditions that affect children.

CONSULTATIONS

Most dermatologists will be willing to consult with you on your first visit for a flat fee, and they may be willing to apply this fee toward a procedure if you decide to move forward with it. It doesn't hurt to ask.

At your consultation, you'll want to learn more about the dermatologist, including personality, experience level and aggressiveness about procedures and treatments. Some doctors will have different plans of action, particularly for cosmetic issues, so it's a good idea to let them know your concerns and see what path they recommend for you going forward.

Listening is the most important thing you can do during a consultation. You may have interest in a particular procedure that you had read about in magazines or on the Internet, but let the doctor make a recommendation first. This will give you some insight into their style of practice.

CERTIFICATIONS

Find out what certifications the dermatologist holds. You can often find that information on the doctor's web site, and you can also double-check it with the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) online at aad.org.

The AAD keeps a database of dermatologists who are certified to practice in the United States. You can check that your doctor is board certified and see a listing of their specialties by searching online.

PROCEDURES

If you're going to the dermatologist for a specific procedure, you should look for a doctor who has plenty of experience in it. Some of the best dermatologists will do the same procedure several times per

> day, keeping their skills sharp and making them experts at performing it.

You should also ask who is going to perform the procedure. In some cases, a nurse or assistant will perform it under the doctor's supervision. In other cases, the doctor will personally perform it with their own hands.

You should know up front who will be doing the procedure so that you're comfortable with your decision.





When you need a surgical procedure, knowing you picked the best general surgeon can help to put your mind at ease.

Most people don't have much experience shopping for surgeons like they do ordinary goods and services, though. So how do you pick the best one? Here are some factors to consider.

REFERRALS

Your regular doctor can refer you to general surgeons they recommend in your area.

This is an important first step because not only does it give you a recommendation from a trained medical expert — something that should carry more weight than other factors — but it also gives you a chance to learn more about what to expect and ask questions about your potential surgeon and surgery.

Your doctor makes referrals for a good reason. They know which surgeons in the area have experience successfully handling your specific medical needs.

It's a good idea to ask your doctor not only which surgeons they recommend, but why. They can give you insight into medical issues that you may not have considered.

You also can learn more about what to expect down the road. For example, a surgeon may perform diagnostic tests and determine the course of action for your treatment — something that may or may not require surgery, depending on your health needs. Your family doctor or

specialist should be able to explain what to expect when you visit the surgeon for the first time.

BACKGROUND

There may be no career field where education, ongoing training and experience matter more than in surgery. That's why you should ask questions and learn about the surgeon's background before you make a choice.

Ask about the surgeon's experience as it relates to your potential procedure. Is it something they perform regularly? Do they have any specialized training, technology or experience level that sets them apart from other surgeons?

In most areas, information about medical qualifications is available online through the state medical board or a board of specialization. Try to learn as much about your surgeon's background as possible through these websites, including whether they have disciplinary action in their history.

COMMUNICATION

While all certified general surgeons will have met the same stringent education and experience requirements before going into medical practice, some surgeons have different styles of communicating that can make a big difference.

You should feel comfortable talking with the surgeon and getting answers to your questions. Likewise, the surgeon should make you feel comfortable enough to let them know your concerns and openly

share medical information that might be important.

The best surgeons will consider your preferences for treatment as part of their process. They'll listen closely to your needs and questions, then address them in a way that's easy for you to understand.

HOSPITAL AND INSURANCE

Finally, there are two factors that could play a role in your decision. What hospital is the surgeon affiliated with, and how well does your insurance cover them?

Ideally, you'll want to have your surgery performed in a hospital or surgical center close to your home, where time and travel considerations are reasonable.

It's important to know your insurance details, too.

If both the hospital and surgeon are considered "in network" by your insurance plan, you typically pay lower out-of-pocket costs. Your insurance company can help explain what costs you can expect to pay for your surgery, including any deductibles and co-pays.

Choosing one general surgeon over another can sometimes make a big difference to your pocketbook, so know the costs and insurance coverage up front.

If you can find a surgeon who is highly experienced and qualified in your procedure, has good communication skills, is covered by your insurance and recommended by your doctor, you'll be more likely to have a great experience in the end.


A good personal trainer will offer a health assessment before working

PERSONAL CARE & HOME MANAGEMENT – HOME HEALTH AID

home cleaning, meal preparation, shopping for grocery & household items, medication pickup & reminders, accompaniment to doctor's visits, and other tasks that promote independent living in the community.
