Employment in Jackson County: January 2023 Leisure and Hospitality Adds Most Jobs over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County fell by 1,310 jobs in January with a drop of 660 in retail trade accounting for one-half of the month's losses. Other industries with estimated job declines included professional and business services (-170); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-130); leisure and hospitality (-80); private education and health services (-80); and construction (-60). Declines were also posted in manufacturing (-50), and in wholesale trade (-40). Government employment slipped by 30 over the month with a loss of 40 jobs in local government education accounting for most of the loss.

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) gained 2,270 jobs, an increase of 2.6%. Jackson County is now 650 jobs below the January 2020 prepandemic total. Since January 2022, industries adding jobs included leisure and hospitality (+880); private education and health services (+580); construction (+270); retail trade (+180); professional and business services (+130); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+130); other services (+70); and wholesale trade (+40). In contrast, financial activities (-60) and information (-40) lost jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 130 jobs over the year. Federal (+70), state (+40), and local government (+20) posted gains since January 2022.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
