The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant in the City and/or County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

On 06/26/2022 SPD radio received a call reference a drive-by shooting that had just occurred at 1625 E. Garland. The initial call was received at 13:40:51 hrs. A description of the vehicle involved in the drive-by shooting was provided by the complainant, possibly a dark blue/black Chrysler 300. The complainant also provided a description of the suspect that was involved in the drive-by shooting.

After the call was received, several SPD patrol officers responded to the area. At 13:53:22 hrs, SPD Officer M. Kernkamp advised she believed the suspect vehicle from the drive-by shooting appeared to be behind her. The suspect vehicle was traveling N/B on Perry and Officer Kernkamp advised it appeared that the suspect vehicle was actually chasing after her and was trying to catch up with her.

As this was occurring another SPD Officer (Officer K Honaker) was coming into the area. This SPD Officer was driving S/B on Perry approaching Empire. As Officer Honaker drove into the intersection at Perry and Empire, the suspect vehicle also drove into the intersection. The suspect vehicle was traveling N/B on Perry. As the suspect vehicle and Officer Honaker's vehicle passed each other the occupant(s) from the

### CONTINUATION OF AFFIDAVIT OF FACTS:

suspect vehicle fired multiple rounds at Officer Honaker. Officer Honaker advised at 13:53 hrs that he had been shot. After the occupant(s) of the vehicle fired rounds at Officer Honaker, the suspect vehicle fled.

Ofc Honaker was transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center via patrol vehicle with injuries to his head and left leg. According to reports, Ofc Honaker's head wound was bleeding profusely.

At 13:54 hrs SPD Sgt. Wells advised that he is traveling W/B on Garland and was pursuing the suspect vehicle. Sgt. Wells and other officers pursued the suspect vehicle to the area of Liberty and Nevada where the driver of the suspect vehicle crashed into a tree. SPD Officers attempted to block the suspect vehicle in with their vehicles. At one point, a firearm was thrown out of the suspect vehicle by someone inside the vehicle. The driver of the suspect vehicle was able to drive away and take off. SPD Officers began pursuing the suspect vehicle again. The suspect vehicle crashed a second time in the area of 611 E. Dalton.

SPD Officers Maguire and Mitchell were riding together on this day. They were present when officers attempted to box the suspect vehicle in at Liberty and Nevada. SPD Officer Maguire saw that there were only two subjects inside the suspect vehicle as they tried to box it in. SPD Officer Maguire and SPD Officer Mitchell became the lead patrol vehicle in the pursuit after the suspect vehicle escaped from Liberty and Nevada.

SPD Officers Maguire and Mitchell watched as the suspect vehicle crashed in the area of 611 E. Dalton. They saw the two suspects get out of the suspect vehicle and flee N/B on foot. SPD Officers Maguire and Mitchell gave chase as the two suspects ran N/B through the residential properties. When the suspects reached the first alley, they ran W/B down the alley. Officers Maguire and Mitchell continued to chase after the two suspects. This alley dead ends at Standard. As the two suspects reached Standard they split up. SPD Officer Maguire went after one of the suspects, Isaac A. Ott, 02/18/2001, and took him into custody. SPD Officer Mitchell went after the other suspect, Ray A. Wynecoop, 05/24/2000, and took him into custody.

### CONTINUATION OF AFFIDAVIT OF FACTS:

SPD Officer Specht was one of the officers pursuing the suspect vehicle when it crashed in the area of 611 E. Dalton. He indicated that he observed two subjects fleeing from the area of the suspect vehicle. SPD Off. Specht stated that one of the suspects ran N/B from the suspect vehicle and that he immediately responded up to the area of E. 500 Liberty in an attempt to contain and capture the suspect that had fled N/B from the suspect vehicle. SPD Officer Specht said that after seeing the suspect car crash and seeing the one suspect flee N/B on foot that within a minute he heard that Wynecoop had been taken into custody in the backyard of a residence in the E. 500 blk of Liberty.

Wynecoop and Ott were subsequently transported down to the Gardner Detective's building and were placed into separate interview rooms.

### Witness statements:

and was walking outside her residence on 6/26/2022 at the time of the drive by shooting. She heard what she initially thought were firecrackers and looked east of her home to determine the cause. She observed a dark blue or black Chrysler 300 vehicle facing west and that the front seat passenger had his arm out of the window, firing what she believed was a pistol toward a home on the north side of the street. After the shooting, the vehicle left at a high rate of speed westbound past her home, at which time she was able to see the passenger was a male she believed to be in his mid-20's with a goatee and side beard, dark hair and either of mixed-race descent or olive complexion and wearing a black shirt. Jolie had security camera footage of the incident and shared the video with investigators.

and was headed northbound on Martin at the intersection of Martin and Fairview. He observed a black Chrysler 300 facing him, parked at an angle near the front of 3008 N Martin. He saw what he believed to be the barrel of an AR or AK style rifle protruding from the driver side window of the Chrysler. Fearing for his safety, he turned west onto Fairview and heard several pops which sounded like gunshots coming from where the Chrysler had been parked.

and was outside his home when he observed a black Chrysler 300 pull into the intersection of Perry and Empire. At the same time, a marked SPD patrol vehicle pulled into the intersection as

well. The Chrysler stopped and as the SPD vehicle was parallel to the Chrysler, Bailey saw an "assault rifle" was pointed from the Chrysler toward the SPD vehicle. Bailey heard four rounds fired from the firearm and into the police vehicle.

SPD Ofc Phillips was present as Wynecoop was being detained in handcuffs after the pursuit ended. He took custody of Wynecoop and during a search incident to Wynecoop's arrest, Ofc Phillips located a .22 caliber "Super X" bullet in the right coin pocket of Wynecoop's pants.

Spokane County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) Det M. Melville received a phone call from SCSO Sgt P. Bloomer advising of this incident and the fact that SPD was requesting we respond to assist with the investigation. Det Melville responded to the scene and was assigned as the Lead Detective for the SCSO investigation which would include charging the suspects with the crimes in this incident.

SCSO Detectives Bohanek, Bonney, Kravtsov, and Wilson responded to the scene as well and were assigned to one of the crime scenes or to the hospital: Bohanek was assigned the scene of the shooting; Kravtsov was assigned to the first crash scene where the firearm was discarded; Bonney was assigned to the second crash scene from which the suspects fled as well as the arrest scenes; Wilson was assigned to the hospital where Ofc Honaker was being treated for his injuries.

SCSO Corporal Welton responded to the scene to fly the aerial drone over the pursuit route, shooting scene and crash/arrest scenes.

During Det Bohanek's investigation of the shooting scene, he noted the Spokane Police Department vehicle driven by SPD Ofc Honaker, WA license #71057D, had what appeared to be a bullet defect in the driver door below the level of the window, what appeared to be a bullet defect just behind the rear driver side door and the window of the rear driver side door had been broken. There was a large amount of broken window glass in the intersection of Empire and Perry. Additionally, he noted five .22 caliber cartridge casings were found on the ground on Perry, just north of Empire.

#### CONTINUATION OF AFFIDAVIT OF FACTS:

Detective Kravtsov took custody of a .22 caliber firearm at the first crash scene and later booked it into property as evidence. The firearm in question was a Sig Sauer, model SIG522, serial number 32A009793. An empty drum-style magazine was inserted into the magazine well. There was a round in the chamber, the headstamp of which read "SuperX," the same brand as the one recovered by Ofc Phillips during a search of Wynecoop incident to his arrest.

While at Sacred Heart Medical Center (SHMC), Det Wilson learned that SPD Ofc Honaker was treated by Dr. T. Coomes who advised the following:

- The victim officer arrived at 1405 hours and was admitted with a gunshot wound of the scalp and gunshot wound of the left thigh.
- A "1 cm bullet fragment within the subcutaneous soft tissues overlying the proximal femur, with a smaller 4cm metallic fragment laterally. Trace subcutaneous air. No visible underlying fracture or dislocation. Subjectively normal bone density."
- SHMC Surgeon Dr. D. Gilsdorf advised the bullet fragments were left in place and that the wound was left open and covered.
- The first head wound consisted of an injury to the crown of the head and was closed with a single staple.
- The second head wound consisted of an injury to the left parietal area and was closed with a single staple

Det Melville conducted an audibly and visually recorded interview with SPD Ofc. Kernkamp. She had been on duty and in uniform when she and other patrol officers were advised of a drive-by shooting incident at 1625 E. Garland, Spokane WA in Spokane County, and that the previously described suspect vehicle was involved. As she was driving her clearly marked black and white SPD Ford Explorer patrol vehicle to the

area of the shooting, she was northbound on Perry at North Foothills Drive when she noticed a black vehicle parked on the side of Perry north of the intersection.

As Ofc. Kernkamp passed the vehicle, she noticed a male passenger she described as a "light skinned black male" with a "man-bun" hairstyle holding what appeared to be a light colored cellular phone. The manner in which this male was holding the phone made her believe the male was recording her as she drove by. It was at this point Ofc. Kernkamp believed this vehicle was in fact the suspect vehicle. She continued north, keeping an eye on the suspect vehicle when she noticed it had started following her and was at a distance from her vehicle she described as "on my bumper."

Knowing the described suspect vehicle, which matched the vehicle now following Ofc Kernkamp, had been involved in a drive-by shooting, she believed the occupants were in fact the suspects and that they were armed with at least one firearm. She increased her speed, not knowing what their intentions were in following her patrol vehicle. As she steadily increased her speed to create distance between her vehicle and that of the suspect, the suspect vehicle increased its speed to match Ofc Kernkamp's.

Ofc Kernkamp continued north at speeds well over the speed limit and the suspect vehicle matched her actions. She ran the stop sign located at Bridgeport, shortly after which the suspect vehicle pulled into the southbound lanes of travel and tried to pull up next to her vehicle. Ofc. Kernkamp pulled into the southbound lanes in front of the suspect vehicle to prevent it from pulling next to her, believing the suspect occupants were attempting to pull alongside her and fire a weapon at her as she was driving. Ofc Kernkamp became extremely concerned by the vehicle and its occupants and believed she was going to be shot. She advised dispatch and other units of the presence of the suspect vehicle and its actions.

As Officer Kernkamp reached Empire, she noticed a clearly marked SPD Ford Explorer patrol vehicle approaching her location. She slowed for the stop sign and continued through the intersection past the oncoming patrol vehicle which was occupied by SPD Ofc Honaker.

A short time later, Ofc Kernkamp noticed the vehicle had turned off to the west, so she turned on an

unknown street and attempted to parallel the vehicle to ascertain where it had gone. It was at this point she heard radio traffic advising an officer had been hit by gunfire. She responded to the location of the shooting, Empire and Perry, and learned it had been the officer who she passed at that intersection during her attempt to get away from the suspect vehicle.

Detective Melville reviewed numerous reports of involved SPD officers who responded to this incident. Specifically, officers Skay and Setzler mentioned hearing a change in Ofc Kernkamp's voice, saying her voice was "different than normal; I could tell something wasn't right" and "I could tell by her voice over the radio she was in fear for her safety based on the actions of the vehicle following her" (respectively).

Det Melville checked the criminal histories of Wynecoop and Ott and discovered the following:

Based on the actions of Ray Wynecoop and Isaac Ott, it is apparent they knew the vehicle into which they shot at the intersection of Perry and Empire was a Spokane Police Department vehicle and that their intent was to cause the death of the officer inside. Det Melville believes probable cause exists to charge them each with RCW 9A.32.030 1st Degree Attempted Murder, RCW 9A.36.011 1st Degree Assault, RCW 9.41.040 Unlawful Possession of a Firearm and Wynecoop with an additional charge of RCW 46.61.024 Attempt to Elude a Pursuing Police Vehicle. It appears at this time that Ofc Kernkamp may have been a target as well, however the investigation is ongoing. Charges involving the two separate drive by shootings will be forthcoming.
