WHEREAS: Minnesota's critical infrastructure, education systems, and workforce rely on secure, resilient

information systems and technology; and

WHEREAS: Cybersecurity education and awareness are essential for everyone — from large corporations and

small businesses to schools, financial institutions, government agencies, and individuals; and

WHEREAS: To protect against phishing, ransomware, malware, financial loss, data breaches, and other cyber

threats, everyone can take proactive steps, such as using strong and unique passwords for each account, using multi-factor authentication, keeping software updated, and safely managing

internet-connected devices; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota IT Services and our public and private-sector partners work every day to secure the

systems and data that deliver essential services and support Minnesota's economic, health, and

social well-being; and

WHEREAS: October marks Cybersecurity Awareness Month, a time for Minnesotans to learn about
