














AHUPUA'A

- Derived by Maʻilikukahi in the 1400s
- Established Mauka, Kula & Makai Zones
- Insured sustainability through the proper management and balance of environmental, social/ political, and economic issues and resources.

While there were many components that characterized and defined an ahupua'a, the major elements contributing to its sustainability were the following:

- Environmental: stewardship of natural resources.
- Social/Political: human framework necessary to support community
- **Economic:** management of the production, distribution, and consumption of resources
- **Cultural:** unique places, practices, traditions and legends deserving appropriate respect, preservation and celebration.






ECO-RIBBON PARK LOOKING TOWARDS THE STADIUM

Swap Meet – Now





Swap Meet – Phase 1 and 1 A




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Swap Meet – Full Build Out



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This area is to be utilized by the Aloha Stadium for parking, vehicular egress, or vendor staging. Vehicular access, or "SM roads" to be provided during construction, 7 days per week. Periodically, construction vehicles will require access to the H1 and H3 on ramps and will enter into this area with the support of flagmen to safely manage traffic for both

Swap Meet and Construction Traffic.

Area reserved for construction activities related to the new Stadium. Usage will include material staging, construction equipment staging, pre-fabrication, and construction worker parking Area reserved for construction activities related to Phase 1 Development and Utilities. Usage will include underground utility work, building pad construction, material staging, construction equipment staging, and construction worker parking Construction gates will be guarded (manned) when in open position. Construction vehicular traffic will periodically merge into the SM road as a means of egress. Guards will direct and monitor traffic when construction tr
