If convicted of this offense or any included felony offense, Paul Cameron, may be subject to sentencing in accordance with Section 706-661 and Section 706-662(4)(a) of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes where he is a multiple offender in that he is being sentenced for two or more felonies, and an extended term of imprisonment is necessary for the protection of the public.

On April 8, 2023, Affiant was assigned to further investigate an Attempted Murder case documented under key HPD report number 23-132085 that occurred in the area of 95-0221 Kipapa Drive in Mililani, Hawaii;

Based on the review of the HPD report, interviews, and follow-up investigation, which resulted in the identification of the suspect in this case, this investigation has revealed the following information:

1. On April 7, 2023. L.M. related that about an hour and a half into her workout, she became aware of a commotion at front entrance of the 24 hour fitness. L.M. observed a girl, later identified as L.M., leaning against a wall in distress and claiming that her skin was burning. L.M. observed D.L. to be saying "it burns" and saw that her clothes appeared to be melting off of her. As L.M. approached, others on scene were pouring water on D.L. in an attempt to rinse off the unknown liquid. L.M. observed pieces of D.L.'s clothes on the ground, appearing like they had melted off.
2. On April 7, 2023, at approximately 9:32 p.m., Honolulu Police Department uniformed patrol was sent to 24Hour Fitness located at 95-221 Kipapa Drive, Mililani, Hawaii 96789 on an aggravated assault type case. HPD Officer Ryan Otholt (hereinafter "Officer Otholt") arrived on scene and met with the reporting person, J.R. who stated that she was working when a female, later identified as

the victim, D.L. ran into the establishment screaming for help. J.R. observed that D.L.'s clothing appeared to be burning off.

3. On April 7, 2023, at approximately 10:15 p.m., HPD Corporal Guy Yoshimoto (hereinafter "Corporal Yoshimoto") responded to a local hospital in Honolulu, Hawaii and met with D.L.. At this time, D.L. appeared to be sober and coherent while speaking with Corporal Yoshimoto. D.L. stated to Corporal Yoshimoto that she was walking to her vehicle after exiting 24Hour fitness when she was approached by an unknown male, identified as the suspect (hereinafter "suspect") wearing a white face mask. The suspect was pointing a gun towards her and attempted to shoot her however she stated that the gun "didn't go off". The suspect then threw an unknown liquid on her before the suspect ran off. D.L. related that the suspect did not say anything to her during the incident.
4. On April 7, 2023, at approximately 11:55 p.m., HPD Detective Mark Tom (hereinafter "Detective Tom") arrived at the hospital and interviewed D.L. who reiterated her previous statement to Corporal Yoshimoto with additional details. D.L. described the gun that the suspect used as a handgun in his right hand. When the suspect fired the gun, she saw a flash but stated she did not hear a gunshot and she was not injured by any projectile. The suspect then threw a liquid on the right side of her face and body before running towards the back parking lot. D.L. stated that she began feeling a burning on her skin in the areas that the liquid was thrown on her. D.L. ran back into 24Hour Fitness where staff there assisted in rinsing her off.

5. D.L. described the suspect as possibly a male, local ethnicity, 20's in age, approximately 5'6" tall, 140 to 160 lbs, tan complexion, wearing a white mask and camouflage pants.
6. D.L.'s injuries included severe chemical burns to her face, shoulders, back, and lower extremities. There was also one 9mm shell casing recovered from the scene of the incident. A criminalist with HPD tested the casing and found it to have been fired from within a semi-automatic or automatic firearm.
7. A search of HPD's records revealed that Cameron does not have any registered firearms registered to him nor does he have a concealed carry permit or license to carry firearm.
8. On April 10, 2023, at approximately 3:30 p.m., Affiant participated in a recorded interview with D.L.'s ex-boyfriend, Paul Cameron (hereinafter "Cameron"). Cameron appeared to be a 21 year old male, approximately 5'6" in height, about 150 pounds and tan complexion. Cameron stated that they started a romantic relationship shortly after meeting but this ended on approximately February 13, 2023.
9. Cameron stated that the last time he saw D.L. was on March 31, 2023 but they have communicated electronically as recent as April 4, 2023. Cameron heard about what happened to D.L. from a friend after the fact. At the time of the incident, Cameron was hiking with another friend identified as C.C. near the Hanauma Bay area. Cameron stated they ended the hike at about 10:30 p.m.

Cameron provided a screenshot showing his Global Positioning Satellite (hereinafter "GPS") location in the aforementioned area at 10:11 p.m.

10. On April 11, 2023, at approximately 9:20 p.m., Affiant participated in a recorded interview with R.C. who stated that he is a friend of Cameron. R.C. stated that approximately two weeks ago, on March 28, 2023, he was with Cameron, Cameron's current love interest, and R.C.'s girlfriend on their way to Kapolei in Cameron's black Acura vehicle. The vehicle then suddenly broke down near the Waikele off ramp and they had to wait for a tow truck. While waiting for the tow truck, Cameron asked R.C. if he knew how to get a "ghost gun". Cameron said he was asking for another person and that it needed to "not be tracked". Cameron then asked R.C. if he knew how or where to get hydrochloric acid. R.C. asked Cameron what he needed that for and he only said to "clean stuff".
11. In the same interview, R.C. related that he had contacted Cameron via text message on April 7, 2023, the day of the incident, at approximately 12:20 p.m. to ask to go on a hike, however Cameron stated that he had an exam that had been pushed back three times already, and that the exam was at 8:45 p.m. so he would not be able to make it to the hike.
12. On April 17, 2023, Affiant participated in a recorded interview with M.H. who related that on April 7, 2023, M.H. stated that he was in his residence when at approximately 11:30 a.m., Cameron entered the kitchen holding a brown disposable plastic shopping bag. The bag appeared to contain three to four objects that appeared larger than a water bottle. M.H. overheard Cameron

speaking to M.C., stating that he had acid in the bag and that he needed it for work.

13. On April 14, 2023, at approximately 6:30 p.m. your affiant conducted a recorded interview with C.C. who related that she and Cameron have been talking with romantic interests for a couple of months. On April 6, 2023 and April 7, 2023, Cameron stated he was going to be really busy studying and taking an exam while at a friend's house in the Hawaii Kai area.

14. C.C. stated she was not with Cameron nor did she hike with him to Hanauma Bay on Friday, April 7, 2023.

15. C.C. related that Cameron would claim to be friends with his exes but would also state "they did me dirty". C.C. believed that Cameron was hurt about his and D.L.'s break up, and would claim that he did not like to text or talk to her because of it.

16. C.C. also described Cameron as being annoyed that D.L. would only ask for help, usually with her car, and that D.L. would sometimes get mad at him for not helping fast enough. Cameron would claim to feel bad for D.L. and that is why he would help her with her car.

17. On Sunday, April 9, 2023, Cameron had mentioned to C.C. that a coworker told him that they saw his ex-girlfriend covered in burn marks. On Monday April 10, 2023, Cameron claimed to have visited D.L. at the hospital and told C.C. that he broke down in tears and was scared for D.L..

18. On April 13, 2023 a search warrant was approved by Judge Karin Holma and a search warrant was executed on Cameron's phone. An analysis of the phone revealed approximately 171 data points. The majority of the data points extracted from Cameron's device indicated that on April 7, 2023 his device was in the area of 24 Hour Fitness, located at 95-221 Kipapa Drive Suite 5101, Mililani, HI 96789, from 8:45 p.m. until about 9:24 p.m. Out of the 171 data points, Detective linuma found approximately twenty-two (22) data points that appeared to show the phone in the East Oahu region at the same time.
19. Surveillance footage recovered from the Mililani area shows a figure following a similar path as the majority GPS data points recovered from the phone.
20. On April 14, 2023 a search warrant was approved by Judge Karin Holma and executed on T-Mobile, for Cameron's cell tower data on April 7, 2023 between 8:45 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. Cell tower data shows Cameron's phone in the area of Mililani and Pearl City during that time. There was no cell tower data that showed Cameron's phone anywhere near Hanauma Bay between 8:45 p.m. and 10:30 p.m.
21. On April 20, 2023, your affiant prepared a search warrant which was approved by Honorable Judge Timothy Ho. A further analysis on Cameron's phone found that on March 29, 2023, an image appearing as a screenshot from "google.com" that shows some type of chemical lab process. In the related topics, it lists Hydrogen chloride, Sulfuric acid, and Hydrochloric acid.
22. The analysis also found that on March 29, 2023, Cameron participated in a text

conversation with a contact S.B. regarding ammunition. On March 30, 2023, Cameron participated in a conversation via text message with another regarding purchasing a "ghost glock." On March 30, 2023, Cameron participated in a conversation via Instagram message with another regarding "anyone selling guns."

23. On April 5, 6, 8, and 9, 2023, Cameron visited a website

<https://www.imyfone.com>. This website advertises a computer program that can "Change GPS location".

24. On April 7, 2023, at about 7:41 p.m., a screenshot of D.L.'s location within the "Find My" application on Cameron's phone was created. Analysis of the phone indicated that the screenshot had been deleted on April 8, 2023 at approximately 5:35 p.m.

25. On April 10, 2023, Cameron received a Facebook Messenger message which referenced a reduction in price for "Muratic Acid."

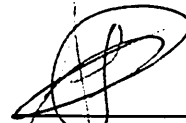
26. The above-referenced events occurred in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii.

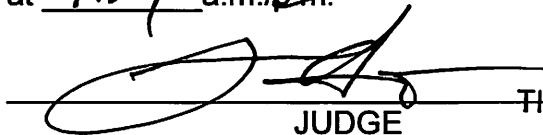

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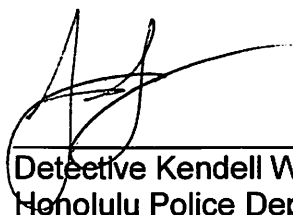

On April 7, 2023, at approximately 9:32 p.m., Honolulu Police Department uniformed patrol was sent to 24Hour Fitness located at 95-221 Kipapa Drive, Mililani, Hawaii 96789 on an aggravated assault type case. HPD Officer Ryan Otholt (hereinafter "Officer Otholt") arrived on scene and met with the reporting person, J.R. who stated that she was working when a female, later identified as

the victim, D.L. ran into the establishment screaming for help. J.R. observed that D.L.'s clothing appeared to be burning off.

3. On April 7, 2023, at approximately 10:15 p.m., HPD Corporal Guy Yoshimoto (hereinafter "Corporal Yoshimoto") responded to a local hospital in Honolulu, Hawaii and met with D.L.. At this time, D.L. appeared to be sober and coherent while speaking with Corporal Yoshimoto. D.L. stated to Corporal Yoshimoto that she was walking to her vehicle after exiting 24Hour fitness when she was approached by an unknown male, identified as the suspect (hereinafter "suspect") wearing a white face mask. The suspect was pointing a gun towards her and attempted to shoot her however she stated that the gun "didn't go off". The suspect then threw an unknown liquid on her before the suspect ran off. D.L. related that the suspect did not say anything to her during the incident.
4. On April 7, 2023, at approximately 11:55 p.m., HPD Detective Mark Tom (hereinafter "Detective Tom") arrived at the hospital and interviewed D.L. who reiterated her previous statement to Corporal Yoshimoto with additional details. D.L. described the gun that the suspect used as a handgun in his right hand. When the suspect fired the gun, she saw a flash but stated she did not hear a gunshot and she was not injured by any projectile. The suspect then threw a liquid on the right side of her face and body before running towards the back parking lot. D.L. stated that she began feeling a burning on her skin in the areas that the liquid was thrown on her. D.L. ran back into 24Hour Fitness where staff there assisted in rinsing her off.

5. D.L. described the suspect as possibly a male, local ethnicity, 20's in age, approximately 5'6" tall, 140 to 160 lbs, tan complexion, wearing a white mask and camouflage pants.
6. D.L.'s injuries included severe chemical burns to her face, shoulders, back, and lower extremities. There was also one 9mm shell casing recovered from the scene of the incident. A criminalist with HPD tested the casing and found it to have been fired from within a semi-automatic or automatic firearm.
7. A search of HPD's records revealed that Cameron does not have any registered firearms registered to him nor does he have a concealed carry permit or license to carry firearm.
8. On April 10, 2023, at approximately 3:30 p.m., Affiant participated in a recorded interview with D.L.'s ex-boyfriend, Paul Cameron (hereinafter "Cameron"). Cameron appeared to be a 21 year old male, approximately 5'6" in height, about 150 pounds and tan complexion. Cameron stated that they started a romantic relationship shortly after meeting but this ended on approximately February 13, 2023.
9. Cameron stated that the last time he saw D.L. was on March 31, 2023 but they have communicated electronically as recent as April 4, 2023. Cameron heard about what happened to D.L. from a friend after the fact. At the time of the incident, Cameron was hiking with another friend identified as C.C. near the Hanauma Bay area. Cameron stated they ended the hike at about 10:30 p.m.

Cameron provided a screenshot showing his Global Positioning Satellite (hereinafter "GPS") location in the aforementioned area at 10:11 p.m.

10. On April 11, 2023, at approximately 9:20 p.m., Affiant participated in a recorded interview with R.C. who stated that he is a friend of Cameron. R.C. stated that approximately two weeks ago, on March 28, 2023, he was with Cameron, Cameron's current love interest, and R.C.'s girlfriend on their way to Kapolei in Cameron's black Acura vehicle. The vehicle then suddenly broke down near the Waikele off ramp and they had to wait for a tow truck. While waiting for the tow truck, Cameron asked R.C. if he knew how to get a "ghost gun". Cameron said he was asking for another person and that it needed to "not be tracked". Cameron then asked R.C. if he knew how or where to get hydrochloric acid. R.C. asked Cameron what he needed that for and he only said to "clean stuff".

11. In the same interview, R.C. related that he had contacted Cameron via text message on April 7, 2023, the day of the incident, at approximately 12:20 p.m. to ask to go on a hike, however Cameron stated that he had an exam that had been pushed back three times already, and that the exam was at 8:45 p.m. so he would not be able to make it to the hike.

12. On April 17, 2023, Affiant participated in a recorded interview with M.H. who related that on April 7, 2023, M.H. stated that he was in his residence when at approximately 11:30 a.m., Cameron entered the kitchen holding a brown disposable plastic shopping bag. The bag appeared to contain three to four objects that appeared larger than a water bottle. M.H. overheard Cameron

speaking to M.C., stating that he had acid in the bag and that he needed it for work.

13. On April 14, 2023, at approximately 6:30 p.m. your affiant conducted a recorded interview with C.C. who related that she and Cameron have been talking with romantic interests for a couple of months. On April 6, 2023 and April 7, 2023, Cameron stated he was going to be really busy studying and taking an exam while at a friend's house in the Hawaii Kai area.

14. C.C. stated she was not with Cameron nor did she hike with him to Hanauma Bay on Friday, April 7, 2023.

15. C.C. related that Cameron would claim to be friends with his exes but would also state "they did me dirty". C.C. believed that Cameron was hurt about his and D.L.'s break up, and would claim that he did not like to text or talk to her because of it.

16. C.C. also described Cameron as being annoyed that D.L. would only ask for help, usually with her car, and that D.L. would sometimes get mad at him for not helping fast enough. Cameron would claim to feel bad for D.L. and that is why he would help her with her car.

17. On Sunday, April 9, 2023, Cameron had mentioned to C.C. that a coworker told him that they saw his ex-girlfriend covered in burn marks. On Monday April 10, 2023, Cameron claimed to have visited D.L. at the hospital and told C.C. that he broke down in tears and was scared for D.L..

18. On April 13, 2023 a search warrant was approved by Judge Karin Holma and a search warrant was executed on Cameron's phone. An analysis of the phone revealed approximately 171 data points. The majority of the data points extracted from Cameron's device indicated that on April 7, 2023 his device was in the area of 24 Hour Fitness, located at 95-221 Kipapa Drive Suite 5101, Mililani, HI 96789, from 8:45 p.m. until about 9:24 p.m. Out of the 171 data points, Detective Linuma found approximately twenty-two (22) data points that appeared to show the phone in the East Oahu region at the same time.
19. Surveillance footage recovered from the Mililani area shows a figure following a similar path as the majority GPS data points recovered from the phone.
20. On April 14, 2023 a search warrant was approved by Judge Karin Holma and executed on T-Mobile, for Cameron's cell tower data on April 7, 2023 between 8:45 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. Cell tower data shows Cameron's phone in the area of Mililani and Pearl City during that time. There was no cell tower data that showed Cameron's phone anywhere near Hanauma Bay between 8:45 p.m. and 10:30 p.m.
21. On April 20, 2023, your affiant prepared a search warrant which was approved by Honorable Judge Timothy Ho. A further analysis on Cameron's phone found that on March 29, 2023, an image appearing as a screenshot from "google.com" that shows some type of chemical lab process. In the related topics, it lists Hydrogen chloride, Sulfuric acid, and Hydrochloric acid.
22. The analysis also found that on March 29, 2023, Cameron participated in a text

conversation with a contact S.B. regarding ammunition. On March 30, 2023, Cameron participated in a conversation via text message with another regarding purchasing a "ghost glock." On March 30, 2023, Cameron participated in a conversation via Instagram message with another regarding "anyone selling guns."

23. On April 5, 6, 8, and 9, 2023, Cameron visited a website

<https://www.imyfone.com>. This website advertises a computer program that can "Change GPS location".

24. On April 7, 2023, at about 7:41 p.m., a screenshot of D.L.'s location within the "Find My" application on Cameron's phone was created. Analysis of the phone indicated that the screenshot had been deleted on April 8, 2023 at approximately 5:35 p.m.

25. On April 10, 2023, Cameron received a Facebook Messenger message which referenced a reduction in price for "Muratic Acid."

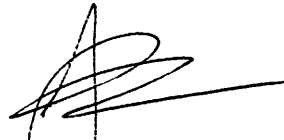
26. The above-referenced events occurred in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii.

Based on the facts and circumstances and positive identification of Paul CAMERON, probable cause exists for the arrest of Paul CAMERON for Attempted Murder in the Second Degree.

WHEREFORE, your affiant respectfully requests that based upon the facts and circumstances contained in this affidavit, a warrant of arrest be issued for said Paul CAMERON, for the charge of Attempted Murder in the Second Degree.; that said Paul

CAMERON be brought forthwith before this Judge or detained subject to the order of this court or any other court in which the offense to which Paul CAMERON is triable for violations of 707-701.5 and 706.656 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes;

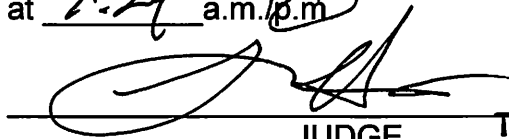
