

# **Economic Developement**

- Form a contact committee like the Industrial Foundation.
- Secure more funding for and develop more childcare facilities.
- Establish a cozy, welcoming coffee shop in Red Oak that stays open into the evening and serves as a vibrant gathering space offering a unique community hub that attracts visitors, encourages local spending, and enhances the town's appeal to new residents.
- Launch a business incubator in an empty downtown storefront to support local entrepreneurs and pilot projects with a focus on innovation and mentorship.
- Implement a comprehensive housing strategy that expands access to affordable entry-level homes, downtown, upper-story apartments, infill tiny homes, townhouses, and everything in between.
- **Tourism strategy for Red Oak** that includes creating large-scale attractions and a vibrant downtown with regular events and activities positioning the town as a must-visit destination where people come to explore, dine, stay, and potentially settle.


# WHAT ARE WE GOING TO DO?



#### **Schools**

- Create a community service program for high school juniors and seniors that places students in meaningful volunteer roles such as helping in senior centers, animal shelters, and elementary schools. Partner schools with local businesses and organizations to strengthen the teens-to-workforce transition and provide mentorship opportunities for students who need extra guidance.
- Offer more STEM related programs and camps for younger children, not just the senior high.
- Have the fire department come and spray the kids (rainfall style, not blasting them with a hydro-cannon) after working hard at track and field day in the spring.
- Install flashing lights for crosswalks during pick up and drop off. It's such a safety issue.
- Conduct a traffic study to evaluate and fix the flow of traffic between the elementary school and Jr/Senior high school.


# **Community Roots**

- Form a LGBTQ support group.

- Preserve and revitalize Red Oak's historic business and residential neighborhoods through infill development and restoration that respects their unique character. Celebrate and promote the city's rich history by expanding the historic district and highlighting what makes Red Oak truly special.
- Develop a centralized Red Oak volunteer hub, an online and inperson resource that shares current opportunities, coordinates efforts across organizations, and connects residents with causes that need support most.

#### Government

- Create an animal shelter that provides a safe haven for homeless animals while striving to end pet homelessness through education, community, and adoption.
- Build a pedestrian crossing for Highway 34 between residential areas north of the highway and the schools south of the highway.
- Establish a metal recycling center.
- Launch a "Red Oak Pride: Community Clean-Up Initiative" a citywide, year-round program where residents, clubs, businesses, and city
  workers team up to adopt streets, blocks, parks, and creeks, organize
  regular clean-up events, haul away debris, and beautify public spaces,
  helping restore pride and make Red Oak a cleaner, more welcoming
  place for everyone.
- Create a "Welcome to Red Oak" Guide, a simple, easy-to-read handbook with city rules, services, contacts, and local activities, given to new residents through landlords, the water department, and city offices to help everyone feel informed, connected, and at home from day one.

- Create a coordinated system to promote and communicate a wider variety of recreational and entertainment activities in Red Oak such as weekly text updates, social media posts, and local news features while expanding community events that engage all ages and make the town more vibrant for both residents and visitors.
- Utilize the Fountain Square Park with community-based programming like live music, summer art fair, and entertainment throughout the summer. Revitalize the space with activities for all ages, creating a vibrant gathering place that echoes the park's lively past.

This program is a proactive approach and model to bring together and engage people from across all sectors of the community to have viable and real conversations to discuss key issues of childhood trauma, mental health, abuse and neglect long-term impacts that not only impair our children and families, but also our community and current/future workforce. The correlation between childhood trauma and workforce barriers and issues have been proven to be directly related.
