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Page County Attorney, James L. Varley, reports the following activities in the Iowa District Court for Page County for the weeks of June 15, 2026 and June 27, 2026. The Honorable Eric J. Nelson, District Court Judge of the Fourth Judicial District presided. All persons are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Aundrea Clay, age 33, Red Oak, Iowa, appeared with counsel and admitted to violating the terms and conditions of probation. The defendant's probation was revoked, and the original sentence of 2 years prison was imposed.

Christine Whitney McGlade, age 34, Villisca, Iowa, appeared by counsel and admitted to violating the terms and conditions of probation. The defendant was found to be in willful contempt of court and sentenced to time served in jail and ordered to remain on probation.

Karl James Shade III, age 40, Shenandoah, Iowa, appeared by counsel and admitted to violating the terms and conditions of probation. The court ordered the defendant's term of probation be extended and modified to require defendant to reside at the Residential Correctional Facility until maximum benefits have been achieved. Defendant will remain in the Page County Jail pending bed space.

Steven William Wells, age 57, College Springs, Iowa, appeared by counsel and pled guilty to Driving While Barred. The defendant was sentenced to two years of incarceration and fined \$855. The term of incarceration and fine were suspended and the defendant was placed on probation for two years. As a condition of probation, the defendant is to receive a drug/alcohol evaluation and follow through with recommendations; and is to reside at the Residential Correctional Facility until maximum benefits have been achieved. The defendant was ordered to pay court costs, surcharges and court-appointed attorney fees. This case will run concurrently with all the cases mentioned.

Steven William Wells, age 57, College Springs, Iowa, appeared by counsel and pleaded guilty to Driving While Barred. The Defendant was sentenced to two years of incarceration and fined \$855; both the sentence and fine were suspended, and he was placed on probation for two years. As a condition of probation, defendant must complete a drug/alcohol evaluation, follow all recommendations, and reside at the Residential Correctional Facility until maximum benefits have been achieved. As a condition of probation, he must complete a drug/alcohol evaluation, follow all recommendations, and reside at the Residential Correctional Facility until maximum benefits have been achieved. Defendant was also ordered to pay court costs, surcharges, and court-appointed attorney fees. Counts I and II will run concurrently with each other. This case will run concurrently with all the cases mentioned.
