THE CITY

Nestled in the fertile farmland of west-central Missouri, Marshall boasts a vibrant musical heritage. Alongside the Marshall Municipal Band, residents enthusiastically support The Marshall Community Chorus—which is gearing up for its 37th season this autumn—and the Marshall Philharmonic Orchestra. The Marshall Philharmonic will begin their 64th season this fall. The city is also well known as the childhood home of renowned jazz pianist Bob James.

THE BAND

The Marshall Municipal Band is among Missouri's oldest bands funded by a mil tax. Historical records show that organized band music began in Marshall around 1871, just after the Civil War. The band itself was formally established in 1921 and has performed continuously ever since.

In addition to weekly, summer concerts on the picturesque Saline County Courthouse lawn, the band represents Marshall at concerts in Mid-Missouri including performing at the opening ceremonies of the Missouri State Fair.

THE DIRECTOR

Kevin Lines directs the Marshall Municipal Band and is now in his 27th year as conductor. Alongside his role with the band, Maestro Lines also leads the Marshall Philharmonic Orchestra.
