I, Sr. Deputy Rhonda Wise, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

1) I have probable cause to believe that on or about 11/02/2024, Trejo, Gloria;

committed one or more criminal offenses:

Count 1: Leaving the scene of a Motor Vehicle Accident - Physical Injury (Death)

RSMo 577.060-001Y20205499.0 Class D Felony

Count 2: Involuntary Manslaughter 1st Degree

Class C Felony RSMo 565.024-001Y20200999.0

2) The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 11/02/2024 at approximately 1852 hours the Noel Marshal's Office was dispatched to a possible hit and run pedestrian near the intersection of S. Kings Highway and Hall Ridge Road. Upon arrival I located a male subject lying in the roadway with several people around. I checked the male who I identified as from previous encounters and could not locate a pulse. He was confirmed deceased by Freeman Ambulance. Marshal Randy Wilson requested the assistance of McDonald County Criminal Investigations Division. CID arrived and took photos of

the deceased and the accident area as well as collected evidence.

On 11/19/2024 after further investigation and statements regarding the incident and locating a serial number on a piece of lens that was collected as evidence. I learned that the suspect vehicle was a maroon 1992 Ford F-150 which belonged to Trejo. When speaking with Trejo on 11/19/2024 she stated that while she was driving "all of the sudden there was something in the middle of the road, so I swerved and I barely hit at first I thought it was a deer but I didn't seem right. So I turned back to make sure and that's when I saw it was a person. I got scared so I left." Trejo made a written statement as to what occurred.

I then placed Trejo under arrest and transported her to the McDonald County Detention Center and placed her on a 24 hour hold.

All of the above-mentioned events occurred south of which is within the city limits of Noel, MO.
