PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

1. I am Michael West, a Deputy Sheriff with the Henry County, Missouri Sheriff's Office. I, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

2. I have probable cause to believe that:

*23 HE CROOSA*

(A) The person who committed the crime(s) was Jade Gibbs

(B) The date(s) the crime(s) occurred was on/about October 4, 2023.

(C) The crime(s) was/were committed in the 300 block of W Benton St, in Windsor, in Henry County, Missouri.

3. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

(A) At approximately 0744 hours, Central Communications advised Deputy Sheriffs assigned to Windsor of a report of a fire truck striking a tree on W Florence St. Central Communications advised the fire truck was then driving through residential yards in that area. Upon arrival, I observed a large red fire truck in the backyard of residence on Cherry St.

(B) I observed a white female in the driver seat of a 2018 Freight-liner pumper, fire truck. While walking up to the fire truck, I heard the engine rev and the fire truck rock back and forth. I announced myself and the female looked at me and appeared to put the truck into a different gear and rev the engine again. I ordered the female out of the truck at Taser point.

(C) I recognized the female as Jade Gibbs from prior encounters. I again ordered Jade out of the truck. A male bystander jumped into the truck and pushed Jade out of the truck. Jade then proceeded to get up and take off running, starting a foot pursuit that ended at my patrol vehicle.

(D) Deputy Kyle Clenin placed handcuffs on Jade, double-locking them and checking for proper fit. We placed Jade into Deputy Clenin's Prisoner transport cage in his patrol vehicle. I was conducting my investigation when I observed the transport cage door open on its own. I observed Jade had gotten her handcuffs off from behind her back. I advised Jade to get back into the vehicle until Deputy Clenin was back, and we could place the handcuffs on her again. Deputy Clenin and I then ordered Jade out of the vehicle where I observed Jade profusely sweating.

(E) Deputy Clenin and I placed the handcuffs on Jade again and placed her back into the prisoner transport cage of the patrol vehicle again. Deputy Clenin and I were talking, when we observed Jade take the handcuffs off again. Deputy Clenin and I ordered Jade out of the patrol vehicle. Jade then physically charged through Deputy Clenin and I and climbed into the front passenger seat of Deputy Clenin's Patrol vehicle. Deputy Clenin and I then removed Jade from the vehicle, placing her on the ground and ordered her hands behind her back. Jade was trying to roll around on the ground with us holding her down, in attempt to restraint her. I advised Jade to stop fighting or I would deploy my Taser. Jade started yelling

"no". I drive stunned Jade on the left side of her abdomen with my Taser. Jade did not respond to the Taser deployment and Jade continued to fight with us. We got handcuffs back on Jade and placed her into a vehicle.

(F) Deputy Mike Sowers brought belly chains and leg shackles to the scene. We again removed Jade from the vehicle. Jade was compliant and calm when I placed the belly chain around her. Jade then turned around and we pushed her up against the car. We got Jade facing the patrol vehicle again, Jade then grabbed onto the front of my Ballistic vest with her hands. I was unable to determine if she grabbed my OC spray or Taser. Jade proceeded to fight with all three of us. We decided to place Jade back onto the ground, where we applied the leg shackles around her ankles. Deputy Sowers and I had to restrain Jade while walking her to Deputy Sowers' patrol vehicle. I observed Jade whispering at a rapid rate, but I could not make out what she was saying.

(G) The assistant fire chief arrived on scene and advised the fire station was broken into and the garage door is completely on the ground. Upon my arrival at the fire station, I observed a broken window through which entry was gained to the fire station and the garage door in multiple pieces on the ground, as it appears the fire truck was driven through the door when it was taken. I also observed a cabinet on the driveway. I was advised the cabinet used to be behind the fire truck. Dennis Bowers stated to replace the fire truck it will cost \$450,000 dollars and to repair the window and garage door it will be \$5,350 dollars.
