**Affidavit in Support of an Arrest Warrant
in the Northern District of Oklahoma**

I, Audra Rees, being duly sworn under oath, do hereby depose and state:

INTRODUCTION AND AGENT BACKGROUND

1. I have been employed as a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation since January of 2020. I am currently assigned to work Indian Country Investigations for the Oklahoma City Division, Tulsa RA. As part of my duties as an FBI Agent, I investigate criminal violations relating to Indian Country crimes, to include Child abuse, in Indian country in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1153; and 21 O.S. § 843.5(A).

2. The facts and statements in this affidavit are based in part on information provided by other law enforcement officers and on my personal observations and training and experience as an Agent for the FBI. This affidavit is intended to show merely that there is sufficient probable cause for the requested warrant and does not set forth all of my knowledge about this matter.

3. It is my belief that an Indian male known as KEITH EDWARD ENYART, [REDACTED]; [REDACTED], has violated 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1153; and 21 O.S. § 843.5(C) (Child Neglect in Indian Country). That from on or about December 1, 2023, to September 4, 2024, KEITH EDWARD ENYART, an enrolled member of the Wyandotte Nation, committed Child Neglect in Indian Country against [REDACTED] in the Northern District of Oklahoma. The Neglect took place at 7 Broadway Avenue, Wyandotte, Oklahoma, Ottawa

County, which is located in the Northern District of Oklahoma and within the Wyandotte Nation tribal boundaries, which is within “Indian Country,” as that term is defined under 18 U.S.C. § 1151.

4. It is my belief that a non-Indian female known as JENNIFER BARGER ENYART, [REDACTED], has violated 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1152, and 13; 21 O.S. § 843.5(C) (Child Neglect in Indian Country) and 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1152 and 113(a)(3) (Assault with a Dangerous Weapon in Indian Country). That from on or about December 1, 2023 to on or about September 4, 2024, JENNIFER BARGER ENYART, a non-Indian, committed the crimes of Child Neglect and Assault with a Dangerous Weapon upon J.E.1, an Indian male minor child in the Northern District of Oklahoma. The Neglect took place at [REDACTED] Wyandotte, Oklahoma, Ottawa County, which is located in the Northern District of Oklahoma and within the Wyandotte Nation tribal boundaries, which is within “Indian Country,” as that term is defined under 18 U.S.C. § 1151.

PROBABLE CAUSE

5. Jennifer and Keith Enyart are married. They have three children that are biologically related to at least one of them. Two of the biological children live with them. Jennifer and Keith Enyart adopted four other children. The child considered the main victim in this case, [REDACTED] is not biologically related to any of the other children or to Jennifer or Keith Enyart. [REDACTED] is a fifteen-year-old mentally disabled male. Although [REDACTED] is disabled, he can communicate. The three other

adopted children share the same biological mother and father. They are [REDACTED], a sixteen-year-old male, [REDACTED], a twelve-year-old female and [REDACTED], a six-year-old female.

6. The FBI obtained tribal enrollment verification for Keith Enyart. He is an enrolled member of the Wyandotte Nation. Jennifer Enyart is not believed to be a member or affiliated with any federally recognized tribe. [REDACTED] is an enrolled member of the Cherokee Nation. [REDACTED] are enrolled members in the Choctaw Nation.

7. On or about September 4, 2024, Indian Child Welfare (ICW) began investigating allegations of child abuse. Investigators discovered [REDACTED] had many visible injuries on his body and was taken to a doctor for an examination. The doctor determined the injuries were likely the result of child abuse. [REDACTED] injuries included bruises, cuts on his ears, scabs, and loop pattern injuries. At the time of the examination, [REDACTED] was removed from the home.

8. Considering [REDACTED] injuries, [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were all forensically interviewed. [REDACTED] told the interviewer that he and his siblings physically beat [REDACTED] at the bequest of Jennifer and Keith Enyart. [REDACTED] indicated he used to be the main victim of physical abuse, but now he physically abuses [REDACTED].

9. [REDACTED] later disclosed that Jennifer Enyart tazed him in the genitals. [REDACTED] was also later given a medical exam by a Child Abuse Pediatrician. That physician indicated in their report that several of [REDACTED] injuries were “consistent but not exclusive for some injuries” regarding the use of a taser or stun gun. That physician also concluded [REDACTED] injuries were likely the result of child abuse.

10. When law enforcement interviewed Keith and Jennifer Enyart, they indicated [REDACTED] received his injuries at their home, [REDACTED] Wyandotte, Oklahoma which is located in the Northern District of Oklahoma and within the Wyandotte Nation tribal boundaries and in the front yard of that location. The Enyart children, when interviewed, also indicated that physical abuse of [REDACTED] occurred inside or in the front yard of [REDACTED] Wyandotte, Oklahoma.

11. This most recent allegation in September of 2024 was not the first time an allegation of abuse was made. In December of 2023, ICW and DHS conducted an investigation after an allegation of abuse. In the course of their investigation, they learned from Keith Enyart that there are “cameras all over the house so that when something happens him or Jennifer knows”.

12. An ICW staff member who entered the residence for this current investigation confirmed there were still indeed cameras in the home in September of 2024.

13. Once the investigation began, witnesses began to come forward to police. One witness told an officer about how Jennifer Enyart showed this witness a video of [REDACTED] being physically beaten by [REDACTED]. Jennifer Enyart indicated how she thought this was funny and that [REDACTED] deserved it. Jennifer Enyart showed the witness this video from her own phone.

CONCLUSION


Based on the information set forth in this affidavit, I submit there is probable cause to believe that KEITH EDWARD ENYART has violated 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1153; and 21 O.S. § 843.5(C) (Child Neglect in Indian Country) and JENNIFER BARGER ENYART has violated 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1152, and 13; 21 O.S. § 843.5(C) (Child Neglect in Indian Country) and 18 U.S.C. §§ 1151, 1152 and 113(a)(3) (Assault with a Dangerous Weapon in Indian Country).
