2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 03/21/2026 at approximately 1834 hours I, Deputy Liening, responded to an address in Newton County, Missouri, in reference to a peace disturbance call for service.

Upon arrival I made contact with the reporting party, who stated her neighbors to the North were playing obnoxiously loud music, which I confirmed to be true with my own ears. The reporting party stated she has a court date in April, 2026 where the State of Missouri has filed two counts of Peace Disturbance against Jose Luis Valdez.

Jose's spouse was contacted over the phone, in which she admitted Jose was playing loud music and stated we could come speak with them at their residence.

Upon making contact with Jose in person, I explained to him the circumstances as to why law enforcement was called and is present at their residence. Jose was argumentative and failed to comprehend that state statue of Peace Disturbance that was explained to him. It was apparent Jose was under the influence of alcohol due to the odor coming from his person.

Jose turned the music even louder than when I arrived on scene, so the decision was made to arrest him for Peace Disturbance. Jose failed to comply with verbal

commands and continued to actively resist V1 and I by pulling his arms away from us and pushing us against the front of his parked truck.

V1 is a member of law enforcement.

V1 deployed his taser twice and Jose continued to fail to comply. V1 dry stunned Jose and Jose grabbed the taser, turned it back into V1's hand causing him to drop the Taser. Jose grabbed the taser, causing V1 to draw his firearm to gain compliance.

Further Newton County Deputies and Missouri State Highway Patrol arrived on scene to assist in taking Jose into custody, in which he continued to actively resist arrest.

Jose was taken into custody, declined medical treatment by EMS, and transported to the Newton County Jail. At the jail Jose was read his Miranda Warning by an interpreter, and he signed a paper copy. Jose was placed on a 24-hour hold at the Newton County Jail.

Note; Newton County Sheriff's Office has an extensive call history with this residence, where the subjects have a history of being uncooperative with law enforcement. Reference past reports #25-000976 and #25-001185.
