- **Sports Reporting:** "Love is Blind" by sports reporters Mihir Bhagat and Brent Pearson.
- Entertainment Reporting: World Series Coverage, a staff effort led by Riek with producers Ashley Colley and Ky Bright.

Entries for the Kansas City Press Club's award ceremony were accepted from news organizations in Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa and Missouri.
