



Built in 1890, the Spencer Opera House opened on Main Street in Kendallville, showing live shows. After purchase by Robert Hudson in 1928, the theater began to show its first motion pictures. The theater's changed hands multiple

times since and gone through multiple renovations, but the historic venue still shows films today.
