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Elopements and Micro-Weddings

Couples are increasingly trading large, traditional weddings for smaller, deeply personal celebrations.

Wildly Connected Photography's blog reports that elopements are on the rise and in 2025, the top trends are adventure elopements, eco-friendly elopements, nature elopements, destination elopements, eloping alone with a big party afterwards and handfasting. Meanwhile, Lena Christine says that vintage elopement weddings are on the rise.

Helzberg Diamonds conducted a survey a few years ago of 1,000 U.S.-based engaged couples. They found that 62% were open to the idea of eloping, with 69% of women interested.

"Modern couples are motivated by elopements because of cost efficiency and intimacy of the environment," said Lauren Gravelyn, Helzberg Diamonds ordained associate.

Cost was also a factor. The average wedding cost, Helzberg Diamonds reported, was \$33,204 in 2022 and 26% of couples thought they were spending too much. They also learned that older couples are more likely to consider eloping as they are responsible for all of their wedding expenses, whereas younger millennials and Gen Z respondents are more likely to have a larger wedding as they have financial support from parents and grandparents.

The Allure of Fall Elopements

Eloping isn't just a spur-of-the-moment decision anymore. Many couples thoughtfully plan fall elopements that still feel adventurous, while reflecting their personalities and values. Popular fall elopement destinations include national parks bursting with autumn color, historic towns with charming backdrops or even cozy family cabins tucked

deep into the woods.

Because fall tends to be less crowded than summer, couples often find more flexibility with locations and vendors. Some choose to hike to a mountaintop to exchange vows surrounded by golden leaves, while others opt for urban elopements filled with crisp air and historic architecture. No matter the setting, the season's natural beauty ensures that even the simplest ceremony feels extraordinary.

Microweddings: Small Guest Lists, Big Experiences

For couples who want a celebration without the size and stress of a traditional wedding, micro-weddings strike the perfect balance. - ☐ Prepare final payments to vendors & cash tips for service personnel.
- ☐ Review details on last minute arrangements and timetables with all service companies.
- ☐ Make sure you have your marriage license.
- ☐ Pick up wedding attire & make sure everything fits properly.
- ☐ Pack your suitcase for your honeymoon.
- ☐ Rehearse wedding ceremony with all participants in attendance.
- ☐ Attend rehearsal dinner.
- ☐ Finalize details of transportation for out-of-town guests.
- ☐ Get a good night's sleep the night before your wedding day.
- ☐ Lay out wedding clothes.

ON THE DAY of the wedding

- ☐ Remain calm and try to relax.
- ☐ Double check that you have the wedding rings & your marriage license.
- ☐ Give wedding rings & officiant fee to best man.
- ☐ Check with the florist to ensure that flowers will be delivered on time.
- ☐ Apply makeup and style your hair at least 3 hours before the ceremony, sooner if you're doing pictures before the ceremony.
- ☐ Start dressing at least 2 hours before the ceremony, sooner if you're doing pictures before the ceremony.
- ☐ If pictures will be taken

- ❑ Mail the wedding announcement.
- ❑ Have music start 20 to 30 minutes before the ceremony begins.
- ❑ Have guests seated as they arrive.
- ❑ Groom's parents should be seated 5 minutes before the ceremony.
- ❑ The bride's mother should be seated immediately before the processional, before the aisle runner is rolled out.

AFTER the wedding

- ❑ Write and mail all thank you notes as soon as possible.
- ❑ Take care of business, banking, insurance & legal affairs (change name if necessary on records and legal documents) as soon as possible.
- ❑ Ensure tuxes & rentals have been returned.
- ❑ Have bridal gown professionally cleaned and preserved.
